Do report that due notice of the time and place of meeting having been given We met at the place designated and having been sworn - reviewed said road and find it the shortest and most direct road with ground and grades about equal to any other from those points excepting on land of L. Shimpf where we made a change as shown on annexed draft putting the road on better ground & shorter distance and doing less damage to his property - We recommend leaving the road as laid out - with this exception on Lewis Shimpf's property We assess the damage to L. Shimpf at thirty five dollars
