

ORDINANCE!

AN ORDINANCE adopting the streets and alleys opened or laid out on the plan or plot of the borough of Hastings, County of Cambria and State of Pennsylvania.

Be it ordained and enacted by the Burgess and Town Council of the borough of Hastings, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same :

SECTION I.—That the several streets and alleys surveyed, laid out and opened in the said borough of Hastings, as shown by the annexed plan or plot of said streets and alleys, (which said plan or plot is hereby made a part of this ordinance) are hereby adopted and declared to be public streets and alleys of said borough ; the width of the same as follows, viz : the width of the streets and alleys being as shown on said plan or plot, and that said streets and alleys shall be designated and known by the names marked on said plan or plot.

SECTION II.—That all laws and ordinances of the borough regulating streets and alleys be, and they are hereby extended to and over the said streets and alleys as shown by said plan or plot.

Issued finally by Council this second day of October, A. D., one thousand eight hundred and ninety.

The petition of R. J. Yother, Burgess of the Borough of Hastings in the said County and of the Town Council of said Borough, respectfully represents: That the Town Council of said Borough on the 2^d day of Oct 1890 passed a certain ordinance adopting and opening certain streets and alleys within the limits of the said borough, as is shown by a copy of said ordinance hereto attached: that among the streets so adopted was one known and designated on the plan of said streets and alleys as Beaver Street, and part of which was at the time unopened; your petitioners therefore pray your Honor to appoint seven disinterested persons, free holders of said borough, who after being duly sworn or affirmed to perform their duties under the Act of the Assembly in such case made and provided without partiality and ^{with} fidelity, shall proceed to view said Beaver Street, having regard both to the advantages and disadvantages caused to the several properties along the line of and adjoining said street, and shall assess and allow to all persons injured, such damages as they shall have sustained respectively, over and above all disadvantages; and who shall also make assessment for contributions upon all such properties as shall be benefitted by the opening of said street, such sums respectively as they may have been benefitted over and above all disadvantages, and the said viewers to make a report of their proceedings in writing to the next session of said Court, describing the properties upon which assessments have been made, specifically stating whether for contributions or damages, with the amounts respectively.
