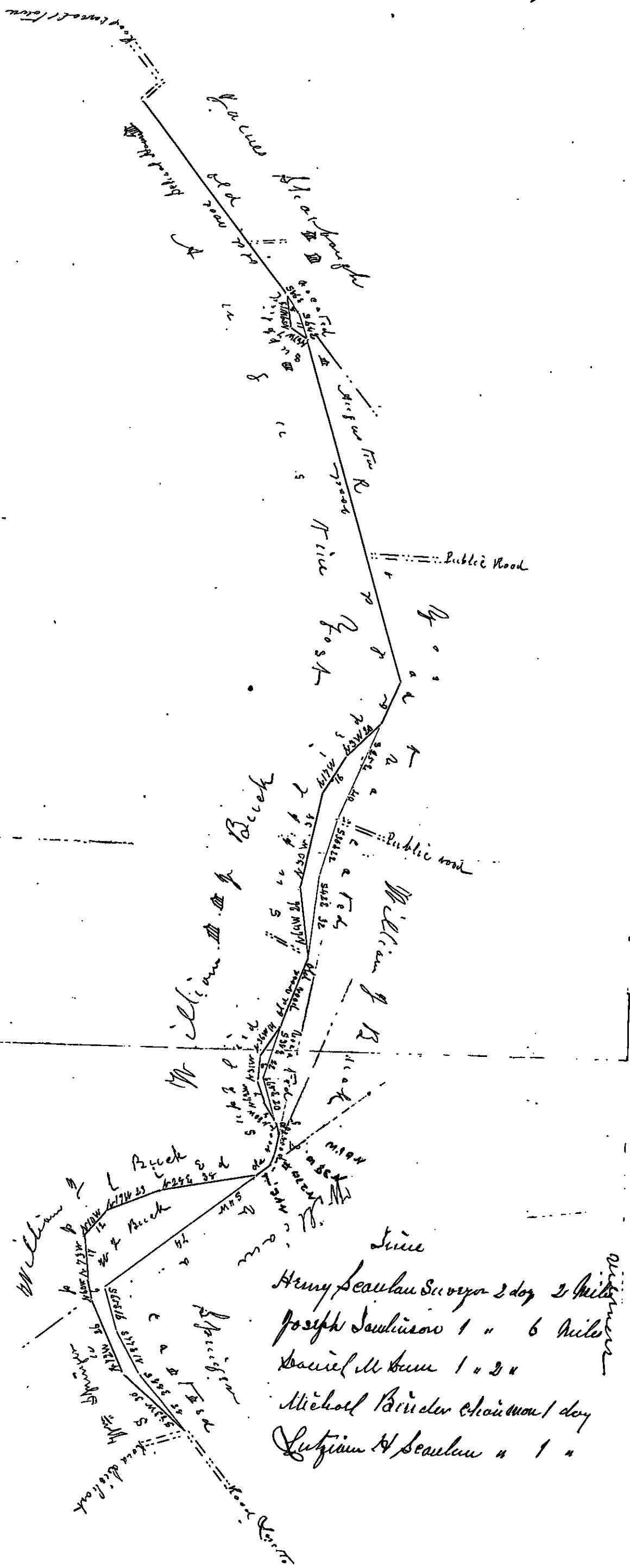


To the Honorable R. G. Johnston Esquire President Judge

And we do further report that having met at time and place
designated by said notices and after all being first sworn
according to law to perform the duties required of Jurors
do report that did view and locate the following parts
of said road in consequence of the several steep hills on
said road beginning at a Post in line of land of Aug
York and Jas. Sharbaugh thence by said line South
Eighty six degrees East thence South Sixty four degrees East
Eleven perches to Post West of Augustus York dwelling house
thence beginning at a Post on land of Augustus York thence South
the twenty five degrees East forty perches thence South thirty
and one half degrees East twenty two perches to James Kane
road thence South forty two degrees East thirty two perches
thence thence South twenty eight degrees East twenty two per-
ches thence South thirty eight degrees East twenty perches thence to
Post on line of land of William J. Buck & William Springer by said line
South four degrees West Seventy four perches thence South Sixty
five degrees East sixteen perches thence South Seventy seven
degrees East Eighteen perches thence South Eighty eight deg-
rees East twenty eight perches to point at Mouth of the
Casper Wolf Mill road which said hills have a grade from
six to ten degrees of Elevation and in our opinion should be

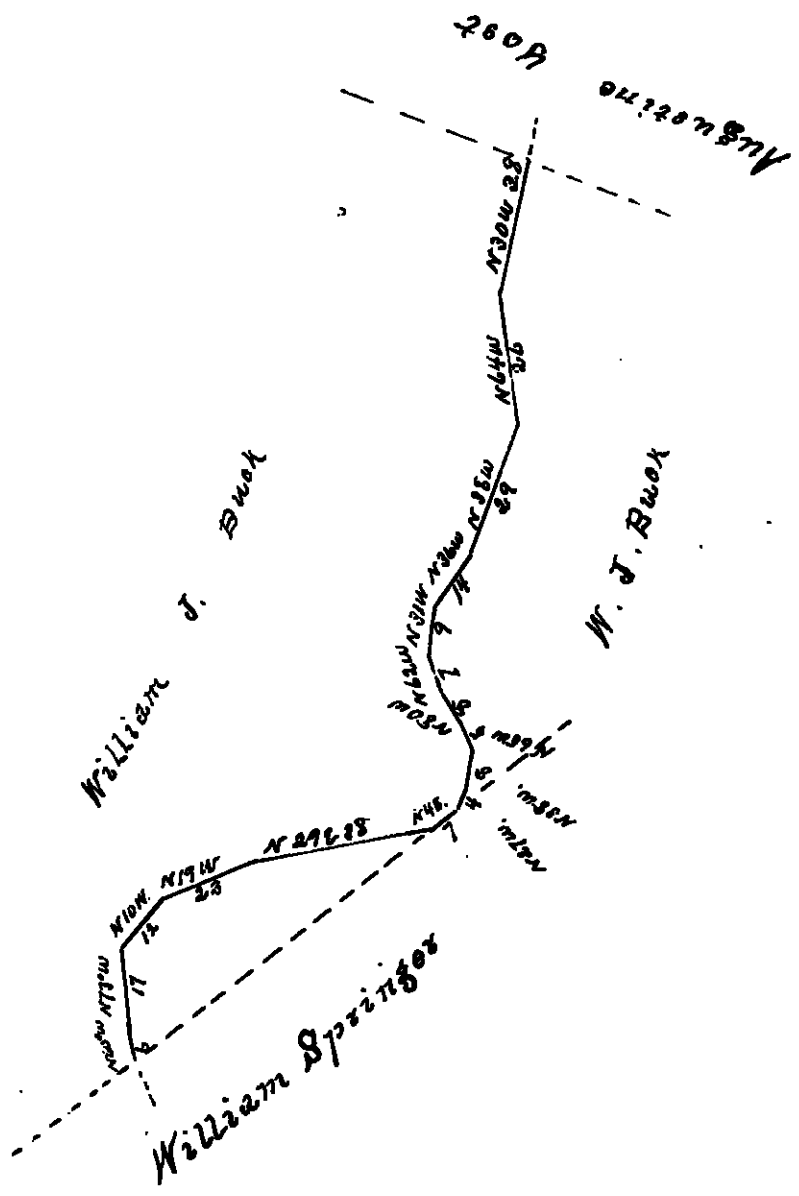
