Southeasterly corner of Winter Street. Section 3. That  
all ordinances and parts of ordinances of the Borough  
relating to streets be and the same are hereby extended to and  
over said Clinton Street as widened, And the said Town  
Council of the Borough of Johnstown further provided by  
resolution "That when the ordinance shall have been  
approved the Burgess and Solicitor be instructed to

Your petitioner therefore prays your Honor to appoint seven disinterested freeholders within the lines of said Borough as it existed at the time of the adoption of said ordinance as viewers to go upon said premises, view and ascertain the amount of damages any of said property owners along and adjoining the lines of said street will sustain over and above all advantages caused by reason of the widening of the said Clinton Street. Also ascertain what advantages over and above all damages any of said properties

derive by reason of the widening of said Clinton Street  
and make full report thereof to your Honorable Court as  
provided by the Act of Assembly Approved April 22<sup>nd</sup>  
1856 (P. L. 525) Purdon's Digest Page 212. The Court upon due

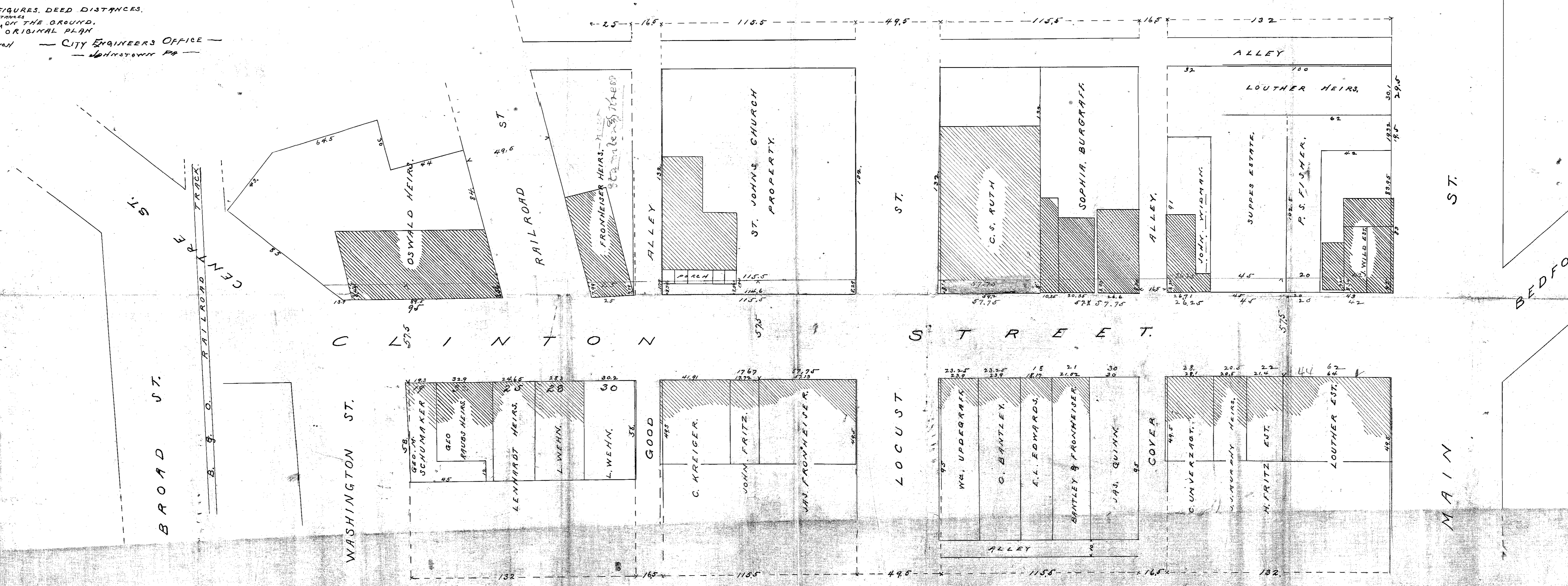

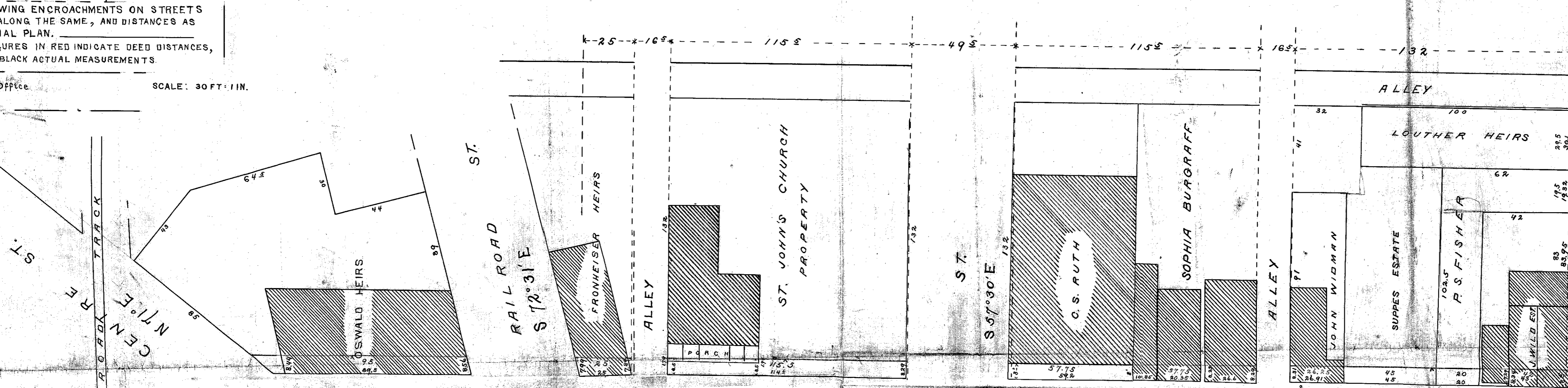

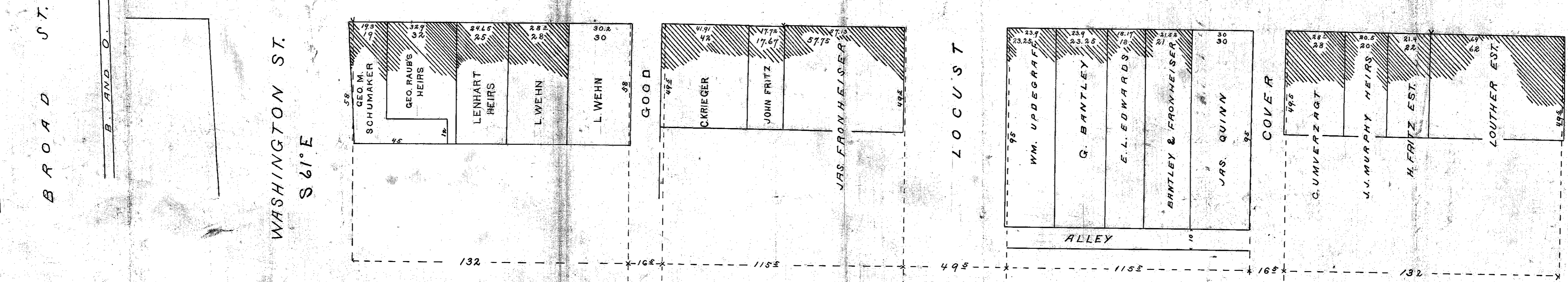
DISTANCES ACCORDING TO ORIGINAL PLAN
