and to take such order on the subject as is
required and directed by the Act of Assembly
in such case made and provided, And

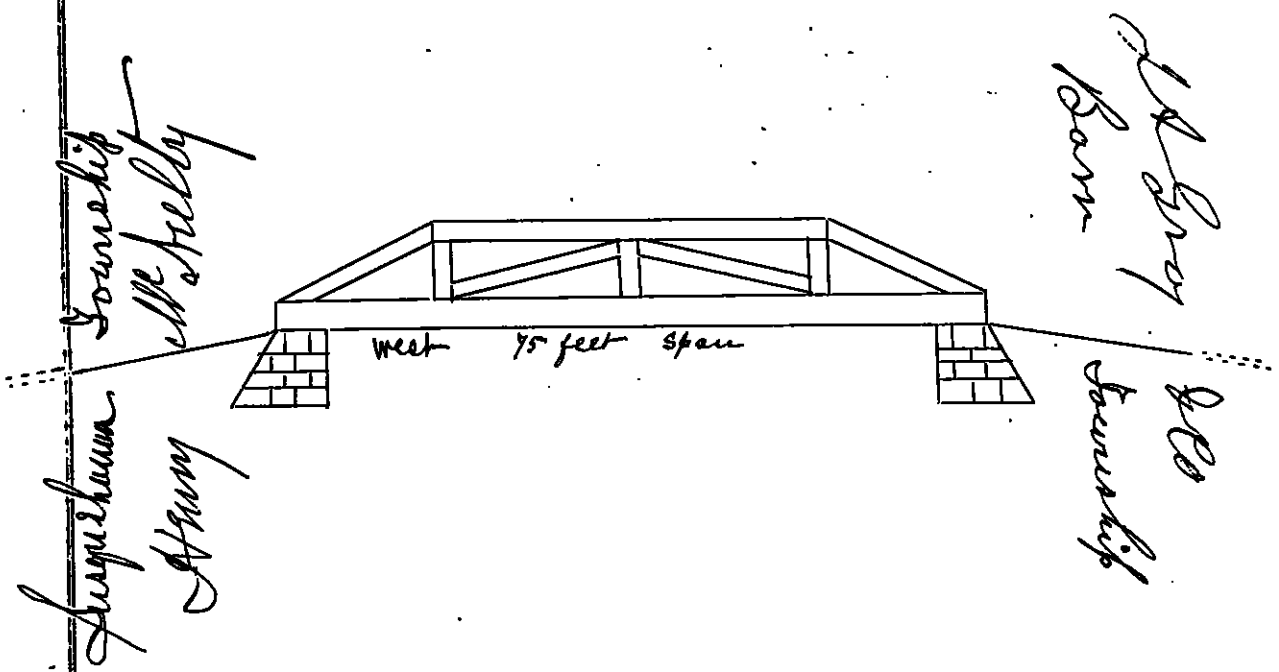

We the subscribers persons appointed by the Court to view the place proposed for the bridge in the within order mentioned respectfully report: That having due and timely notice by three written and printed notices posted in three public places adjacent to the place said bridge is to be built And we do further report that having met at time and place designated by said notices and having all been first severally sworn in pursuance of said order we have viewed the premises aforesaid and are of opinion that a bridge over the Susquehanna River at the place where the public highway leading from Carrolltown to Cherry Tree on farm of Henry McVultry leads to Indiana County crosses said River is necessary and that the erecting of such a Bridge would be attended with more expense than is reasonable that said Township should bear view of Bridge Beginning at a Post on East bank of Susquehanna river thence West seventy five feet to west bank of said river in Born Township

held at Cherrytree in the said County, on the second day of
March A. D. 1891, before the Honorable the Judges of the same
Court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the township of Susquehanna
in the said County, setting forth that they labor under inconvenience for want of

~~road or highway, to lead from~~
A bridge is much wanted over the Susquehanna river at the
place where a public road crosses said river from a point on
Public road leading from Carrolltown to Cherrytree at or near
residence of Henry M. Gaulty in Susquehanna Township in said
County to intersect a public road leading from said Township
at said place to Indian Run. The ford there being frequently
rendered impassable by reason of ice and high waters
and the expense of erecting said bridge would be too heavy and
burthen some upon the inhabitants of said Township

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to ^{do act} view and lay out the
same according to law. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do
order and appoint Henry Semler SURVEYOR,
and John Buck Benjamin Worthen

^{And} VIEWERS, to view the ground proposed for said
^{road} and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such
^{road} they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance
and the best ground for a ^{road}, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to
private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the
petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court
of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they
judge the same necessary for a public or private ^{road}, together with a plot or draft
thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through
which it may pass.
