cient for all public purposes.
4. The Roads in the Township are already so  
numerous that the ordinary rate of taxation  
is not sufficient to keep them in a good  
passable condition.

We the subscribers  
appointed by the within order of Court  
to view the ground proposed for said  
road, And that in pursuance of said  
order we first gave due notice by  
written hand bills stuck up in the most  
conspicuous places along said route  
& places adjacent thereto, stating the  
day when we would meet to examine  
& view said road upwards of ten days  
prior to our meeting, We also met on  
16<sup>th</sup> day of April 1891. And after all  
being duly sworn & affirmed, we  
proceeded to view the ground for  
said proposed road, And after viewing  
& grading the the said route, We have  
laid out and do report a Road for  
Public use according to the following  
Courses and distances, A draft whereof  
is hereto annexed, Beginning at a  
post at the edge of the Johnston & Bedford  
Pike or Highway or near the residence of  
Abner or N. R. Griffith, thence through lands  
of N. R. Griffith South eighteen <sup>degrees</sup> East 12 perches  
to line of Joseph Hoffmans & some course one perch  
more or whole distance thirten perches to post on  
Joseph Hoffmans land, thence through said Hoffmans  
land South sixty five degrees West four perches  
to a post on line between Joseph Hoffmans & N. R.  
Griffith, thence along said line South fifty two de-  
grees West nine & a half perches cross run to Right  
at fifty two perches. cross 2<sup>nd</sup> run whole distance

fifty five perches to a post, thence along a street  
or road North forty seven degrees West twelve  
& a half perches to post, thence along street or  
road with N. R. Griffith on the right & lots  
on the left, South eighty two <sup>deg.</sup> west thirty three  
& four tenths perches to a post in road, thence  
along said road or street South fifty five degrees  
west twenty perches to spring run & opposite Eli  
Leflers house to left same course eighteen perches  
more or whole distance of this line is thirty eight  
perches to a post, in road, and on land of  
Daniel Coffield on the right & Herman Leven-  
dry on left & along old road South fifty  
five degrees west twenty two and seven tenths  
perches to a post, opposite Coffield's dwelling  
& the Hornstow on left, thence by same South

post, thence by Lewis Levendry on left South

agree there has sustained none,

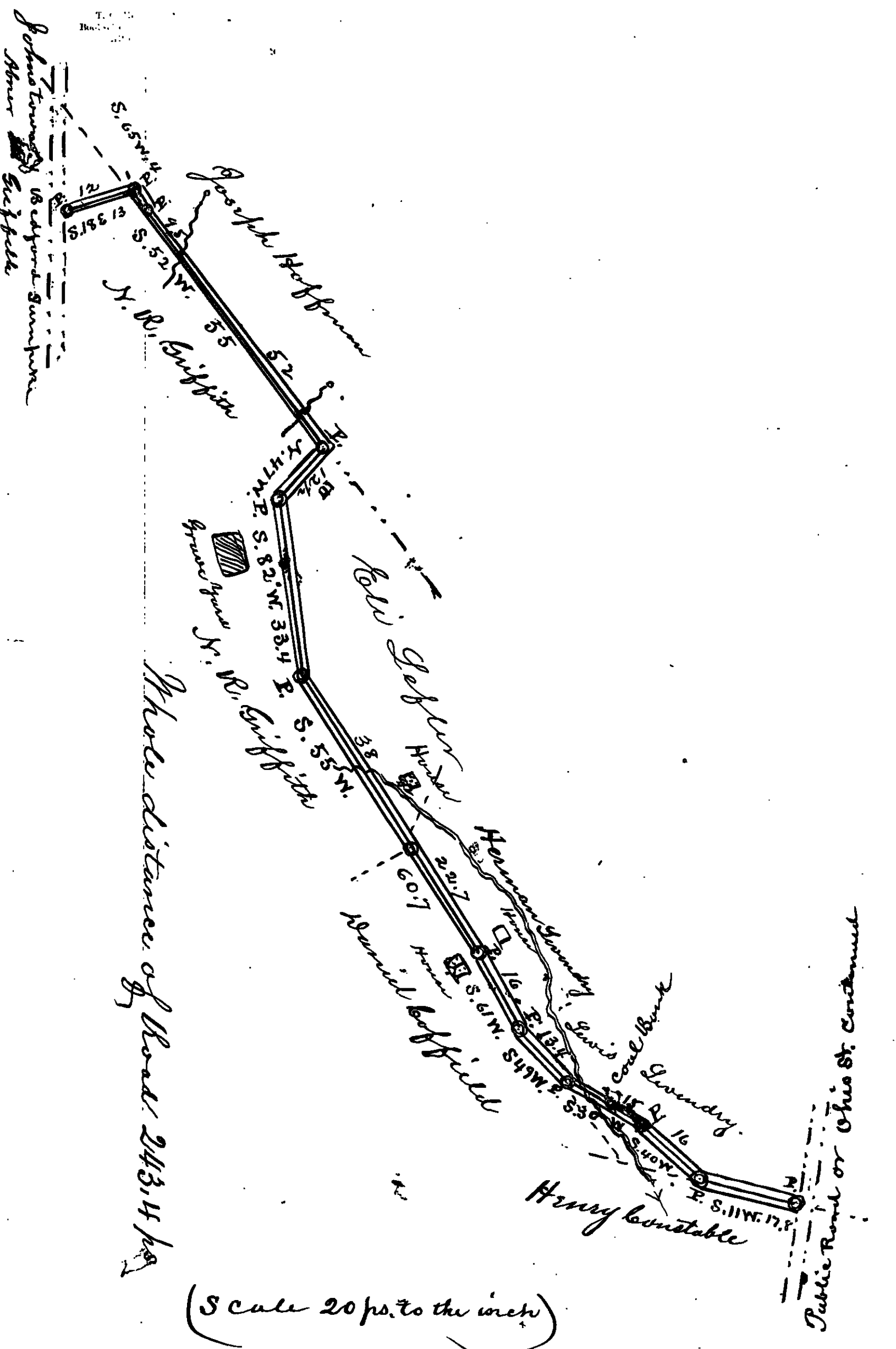

road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance  
and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to  
private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the  
petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court  
of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they  
judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft  
thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through  
which it may pass.
