The petition of the undersigned re-
spectfully represents: That at the December
Session of this Court, in the year of our Lord
One thousand Eight hundred and eighty nine
a road beginning at, or near Jacob Singers
in a certain public road in Cinnemaugh
Township in said County, and leading to
and ending at a public road known as the
Frankstown Road in said Township, at
or near Richard Horners, laid out by order of
this Court, was confirmed and that said Road
has not yet been opened: That at the March
Session of this Court in the year of our Lord
One thousand Eight hundred and ninety
three, that portion of the above described
road beginning in said public road as
aforesaid and leading to and ending at the
junction of lines of Cinnemaugh Township and
Stony-Creek Township, at or near the property
of Mrs Elizabeth Raulch was by order of this
Court vacated; That in consequence thereof,
and by reason of said order of vacation, the re-
mainder of said Road to wit. Beginning
at the junction of the lines of the Townships
aforesaid at Mrs Elizabeth Raulch and
leading to and ending at the public road
aforesaid to wit the Frankstown Road, at
or near Richard Horners in said Cinnemaugh
Township, has become useless and inconve-
nient: They the petitioners aforesaid therefore
pray that the same may be vacated and annulled
and for that purpose that the Court will
appoint three persons qualified according
to law to view the ground in which said road
has been laid out and make report of their
proceedings at the next term of this Court
and they will ever pray etc.

We the subscri-
bers appointed by the within order
of Court to view a road that has been
formerly laid out, (and confirmed as
a public road) But since that portion of
said road leading through Stony Creek
Township has been vacated, We viewed
that remaining part leading through
Conemaugh Township to the Franko-
town Road, And after giving due notice
Jm Slick & John Bloom met on Aug. 10th 1893
we adjourned to meet on Aug. 17th and
on said day we met, And after all
of us being duly affirmed, We pro-
ceeded to view that part of said
mentioned road, And do report that
the same has become useless & inconvenient,
and that the same be vacated according
to the course & distances, A draft where-
of is hereto annexed, Beginning at a
corner on line No. 19 thence North sixty eight
degrees west sixty eight perches along a line,
thence along street North twenty degrees east
fifty seven perches to bend in street, thence
North two & a half degrees west fifty perches
to a corner, thence North sixty six degrees west
thirteen & a half perches to Birch stump, thence

North seventy one & a half degrees West three & a
half perches, thence North ten & a half degrees
east two perches, thence North eighty seven de-
grees east two & a half perches, thence
North thirty one degrees east two
perches to the Frankston road near
Richard Horner's. And further we found
a portion of said road too steep,
Witness our hands this 17th day

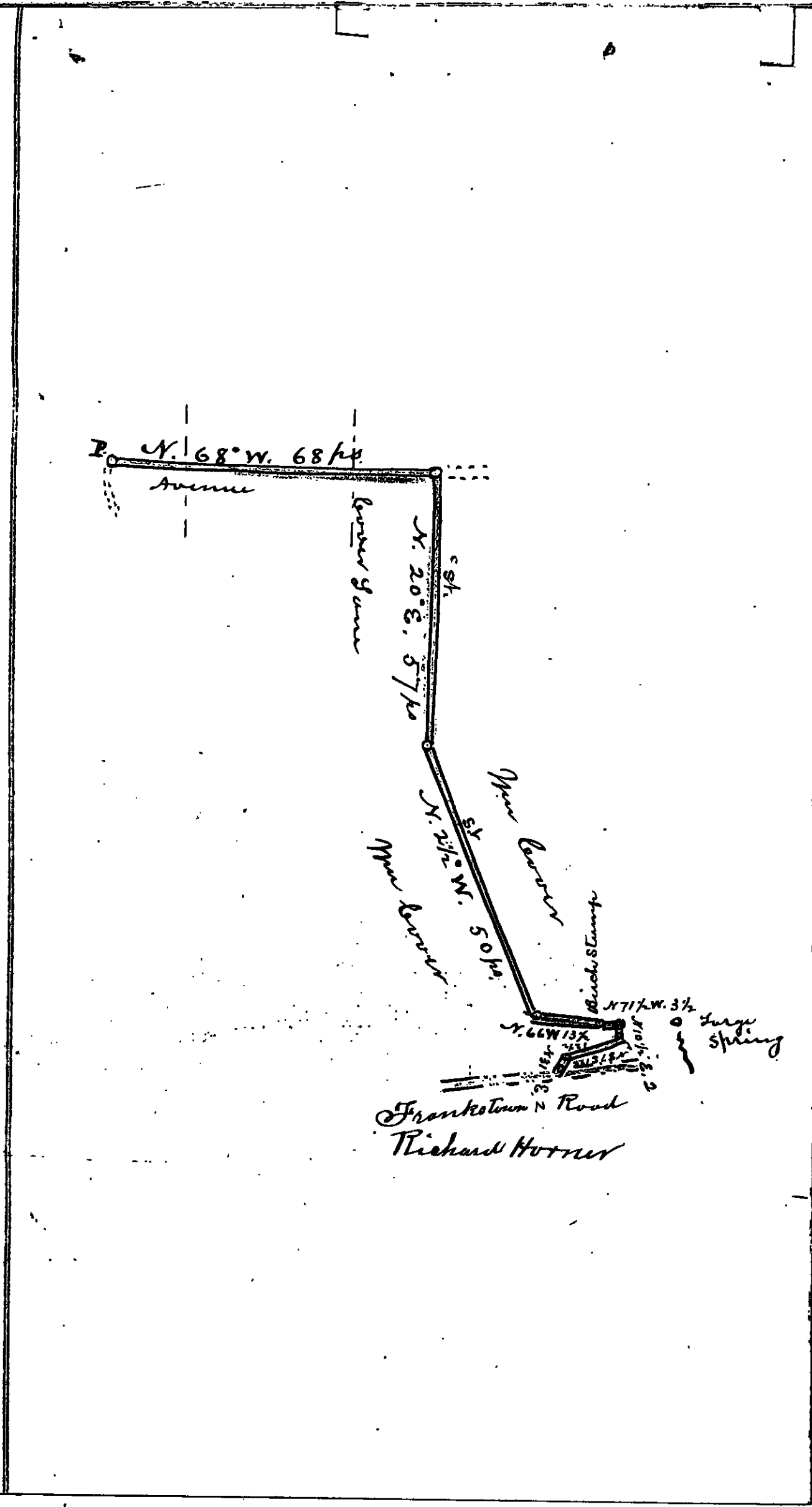

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Cambria held at Chesapeake in the the said County, on the Fifth day of June A. D. 1893, before the Honorable the Judges of the same Court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the township of Camp Hill in the said County, setting forth that they labor under inconvenience for want of a ~~at the March Term, 1889 a road beginning at or near road or highway, to lead from Jacob Angier in a certain public road in Conemaugh Township in said County (leading to) ending at a public road known as the Troutstown Road in said Township at or near Richard Hanner's laid out by order of this Court was confirmed & that said road has not yet been opened. That at the March Term of this Court in the year of our Lord, 1893 that portion of the above described road beginning in said public road as aforesaid and leading to and ending at the junction of line of Conemaugh Township and Camp Hill Township at or near the property of Mrs. Elizabeth Runch was by order of this Court vacated, that in consequence thereof and by reason of said order of vacation the remainder of said road to wit, beginning at the junction of the lines of the Townships of said at Mrs. Elizabeth Runch's and leading to and ending at the public road of said to wit, the Troutstown road at or near Richard Hanner's in said Conemaugh Township has become unnecessary.~~

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to ^{& roads} view and lay out the same according to law. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Mr. Slick SURVEYOR, and St. R. Shaffer & John Sevorn

VIEWERS, to view the ground proposed for said road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is ^{no} occasion for such road, they shall proceed to ^{vacate} lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.

NOTE.—"It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report, at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: first, who of them were present at the view; second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."
