Carrolltown to Hicktown." That your petitioners are
informed that a majority of the persons named in the
Order to view said proposed road, have reported favora-
bly to said road, by a Report filed August 1st 1893.
Your petitioners without following to know how far the
proceedings on said case have progressed, and believing
that said road is laid out is not necessary for

public use, that the expense of opening the same
will be a greater burden than the citizens of Barr Town-
ship can, or should be called on, to bear, that said
proposed road will be useless, inconvenient and
burdensome, particularly to the citizens of Barr
Township.

Your petitioners therefore pray the Court,
to not confirm the report of viewers, as filed in
the above case absolutely, if still within the power
of the Court to grant a review, and if said Report
of viewers is confirmed absolutely, then to grant an
order vacate said road, and to give and publish as your
Honor may deem proper in the premises.

which it may pass.

NOTE.—"It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge. If they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fall to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."
"The persons appointed as assessors shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."
"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report, at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: first, who of them were present at the view; second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."
