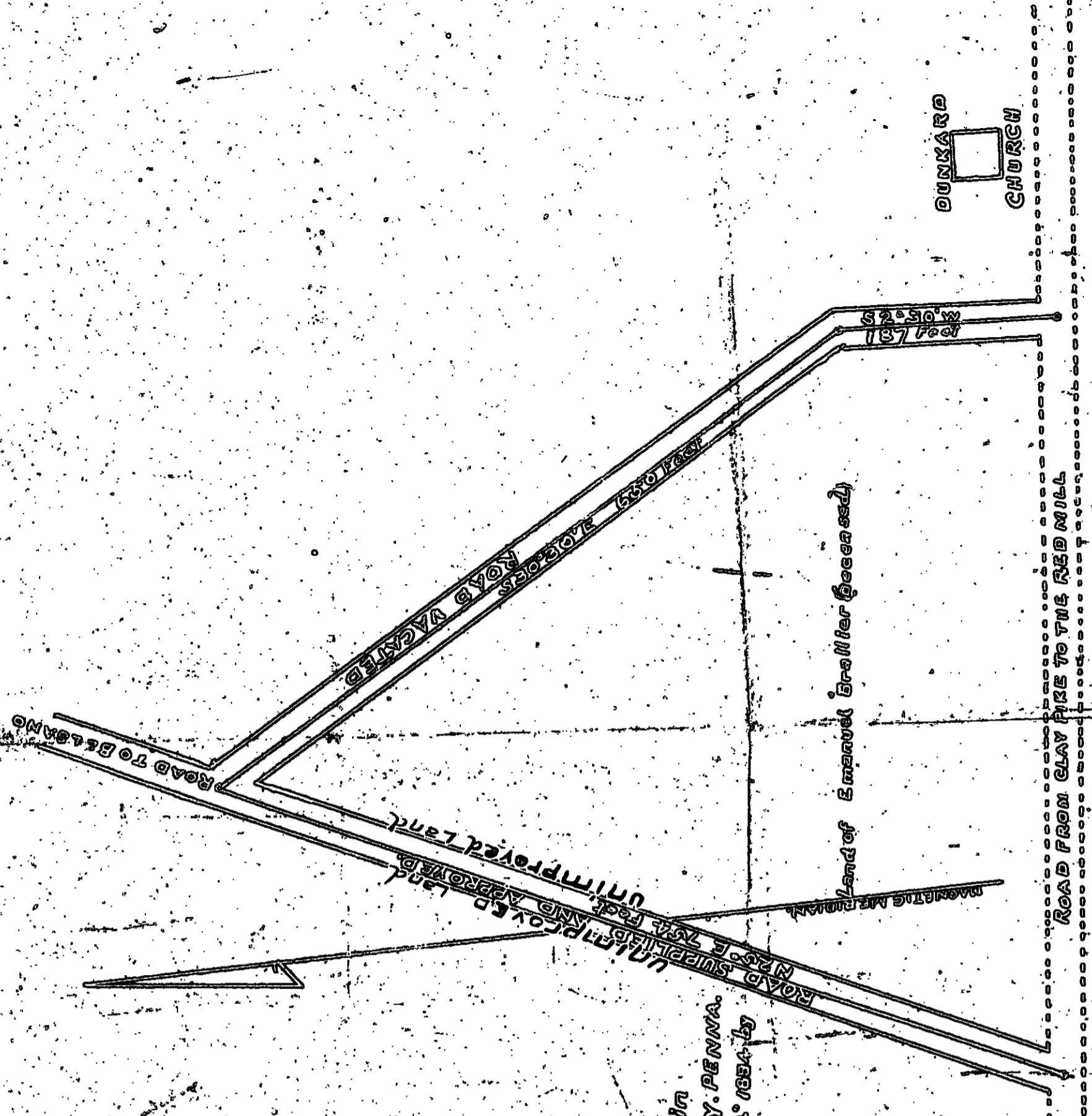


Plan of the Proposed Public Road in

To the Honorable A. V. Barker President Judge of the  
Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County Pennsylvania  
As the undersigned appointed by the annexed order  
respectfully report that having given public notice of the  
time and place of meeting as required by law and all  
being present at the view of the ground proposed  
for such road to be vacated and supplied and  
having been first severally sworn or affirmed to perform  
our duties according to law. We in pursuance of  
said order have viewed the ground described  
in said order and believing that the road from  
a point in Township road from Belpaiso to  
Dunwood Church when the same intersects with  
the line between the real estate of Emanuel Brallier  
deceased and John Blickenderfer to the Dunwood Church  
has become inconvenient and burdensome  
and ought therefore to be vacated and have  
viewed and vacated same as follows  
Beginning on the said Township road when the  
line of real estate intersects between  
Emanuel Brallier deceased and John  
Blickenderfer intersects thence South thirty and  
one half degrees East 94 hundred and fifty  
feet thence South two and one half degrees  
East one hundred and eighty seven feet  
to the said point near the said Dunwood  
Church on road leading from the Clay  
Pipe to the Red Mill

in said Township of Blacklick and have  
 supplied viewed and laid out and do  
 return for public use the following road  
 to wit Beginning on said Township where  
 the line of real estate between <sup>the improved land of</sup> Emanuel  
 Prallin deceased and John Blicher does

 West seven hundred and fifty four  
 feet to a point on the public road  
 leading from the Clay pike to the Red  
 Mill about forty six rods west of the  
 Duncard Church in said Township  
 road. no damages - said road as aforesaid  
 laid out we are of opinion is necessary  
 for a public road and recommend the  
 same a plot or draft thereof is herewith

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Dauphin  
held at Greensburg in the the said County, on the Second day of  
July A. D. 1894, before the Honorable the Judges of the same  
Court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the township of Blacklick  
in the said County, setting forth that ~~they labor under inconvenience for want of~~

~~road or highway, to lead from~~  
a public road has been long since layed out from a point at  
or near the Blacksmithe Shop of Peter Strasbaugh in the  
Village of Belcano to a point at or near the Dunkard  
Church on roads leading from the Clay Pike to the Red Mill  
in said Township of Blacklick. The petitioners therefore  
pray the Court to appoint three persons qualified according  
to law to view vacate and supply a part of the above  
mentioned roads as follows to wit: To vacate that part of  
said road commencing at a point in said road where the  
same intersects with the line between the Real estate of  
Emmanuel Brullier deceased and John Blickenderfer  
to the Dunkard Church and to lay out and supply that  
portion vacated from the point where the present road intersects  
into the line between the lands of the Estate of said Emmanuel Brullier  
deceased and John Blickenderfer to a point on the public road leading from  
the Clay Pike to the Red Mill about forty six rods west of the Dunkard Church in  
said Township of Blacklick.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to <sup>view</sup> and <sup>vacate & supply</sup> lay out the  
same according to law. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do  
order and appoint W. R. Blagburn SURVEYOR,  
and John H. Duncan and David Bracken

VIEWERS, to view the ground proposed for said  
road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such  
road, they shall proceed to <sup>vacate & supply</sup> lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance  
and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to  
private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the  
petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court  
of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they  
judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft  
thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through  
which it may pass.

NOTE.—It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report, at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: first, who of them were present at the view; second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."
