Respectfully report that they gave due and legal notice in writing of the Object, time, and place of meeting and after being sworn and affirmed according to law to perform their duties with impartiality and according to the best of their judgment, they were all present and in a body passed over the premises and viewed the same and that they concluded as follows, to wit:

To *J. C. Caldwell* lot No. for advantages to be received, to contribute the sum of (\$250⁰⁰)
