We the undersigned Jurors
appointed by said Court do report that first hav-
ing given due and timely notice of the time and
place of the meeting of the Jurors by three notices
posted in three public places adjacent to said
road a copy of said notices is hereto attached
&c. And we do further report that having met
at time and place designated by said notices and
after being sworn according to law we proceed-
ed to the duties of our appointment and did
view marks and lay out the following for a Public
Road or highway viz Beginning at a Post on a
Public road leading from here of John Benner to
Loratto and Corrolltown road on farm or land
of Pennsylvania Rail Road in Corroll Township
in County of Cambria near Bradley Junction
thence South seventeen and one half degrees West cross-
ing Township line of Allegheny & Corroll Townships fifty
eight perches Post thence in Allegheny Township South
South forty two and one half degrees West twenty per-
ches to post thence South thirty degrees West Eighteen
perches Post thence South twenty four degrees West twenty
two perches Post thence South seventeen degrees West
twelve perches Post thence South twenty three and
one half degrees West twelve perches Post thence

South twenty one degrees west eight perches Post three
South fourteen and one half degrees west ten perches Post three
South fifteen degrees west eighteen perches Post three South
twenty six and one half degrees west eight perches Post three
South thirty five degrees west twenty four perches to Post three
South twenty five and one half degrees west ten perches Post
three South twenty three degrees west twenty two perches Post
three South twenty one and one half degrees west thirty
six perches Post three South twenty four degrees west
thirty perches Post three South thirty one and one
half degrees west sixteen perches to Post on Public Road
leading from Carrolltown to Bucks Mills and to Ebersburg
which said Revised road in our Opinion to be necessary
to accommodate the public travel: not exceeding three
degrees elevation at any point if said road should
be confirmed would shorten distance to Station and
avoid steep dangerous hills And we do further
report and assess a damage to Pennsylvania Rail
road of sixty dollars through their improved land
also a damage of one hundred and forty two doll-
ars to Joseph Illig through his enclosed and
improved land See draft all of which
is respectfully submitted

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the
same according to law. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do
order and appoint Mary Seaman SURVEYOR,
and Michael Worn and John E. Tomlinson

VIEWERS, to view the ground proposed for said
road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such
road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance
and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to
private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the
petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court
of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they
judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft
thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through
which it may pass.
