To the Honorable A. V. Barker, President Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County Pennsylvania.

We the undersigned viewers appointed by the annexed order do report: That due public notice of the time and place of the meeting having been given as required by law, we met on the day named, to-wit: the 14th day of May, 1894, and having been severally sworn or affirmed before entering upon the discharge of our duties we proceeded to view the premises described in the order, and having viewed the same we agree that there is occasion for widening the road as desired by the petitioners, and that it is necessary to widen the same for the accommodation of the traveling public.

Beginning at a point on the road leading from Nicktown to Carrolltown at the Church in the Village of Nicktown we ran South forty-six and one-fourth degrees West along lands of John Soisson and Nicholas Lambourn, and the Catholic Church and cemetery 1276 feet to John Soisson's line, this part of the road being 34 feet wide, and we did not widen this part; continuing thence South  $4 \frac{3}{4}$  degrees West along lands of John Soisson and Nicholas Lambourn 470 feet to line between John Soisson and Mrs. Pfeister, and finding this part of the road to be but 19 feet wide at this end we widened the same on Lambourn's side so as to make all of this part of the road 34 feet wide, and back at the other end at the turn of the road as the road is but 23 feet wide we widened it on Lambourn's land so as to make it 36 feet wide; thence continuing from Soisson and Pfeister's line South  $5 \frac{1}{4}$  degrees West along line of Mrs. Pfeister and Nicholas Lambourn 807 feet we widened the road on Lambourn's land so as to make it 34 feet wide,

and thence continuing South 41 1/2 degrees West 707 feet <sup>through</sup> Mrs. Pfeister's land to land of Mrs. John Kirsh, and finding this part of the road 34 feet wide, we did not disturb or widen it: which said road so as aforesaid viewed, widened and laid out is shown by a plot or draft hereto attached.

We further report that in our judgment it does not appear that any damages have been or will be sustained to any property or to the owners of any property by reason of widening the said road, and we have therefore not assessed any damages.

held at Ebensburg in the said County, on the Sixteenth day of  
April A. D. 1894, before the Honorable the Judges of the same  
Court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the township of Barr  
in the said County, setting forth that they labor under inconvenience for want of

~~road or highway, to lead from~~  
~~Shakapark of a public road long since laid out leading~~  
~~from Nicktown in said Township of Barr to a point~~  
~~on the road leading from Ebensburg to Carrolltown~~  
~~at the Blacklick Creek in Bambria Township to~~

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and ~~lay out~~ <sup>view</sup> the  
same according to law. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do  
order and appoint James B. Murray and Wilton Jones SURVEYOR,  
and

VIEWERS, to view the ground proposed for said  
road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such  
<sup>road</sup> they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance  
and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to  
private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the  
petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court  
of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they  
judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft  
thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through  
which it may pass.

NOTE.—"It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report, at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: first, who of them were present at the view; second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."
