Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of

The petition of the under-
signed, citizens of the Township of Sus-
quehanna, respectfully represents:

That by
virtue of certain proceedings in
this Court, a public road was late-
ly laid out in the Township of Sus-
quehanna, beginning at a point
near the residence of Lawrence Wy-
land, now in Spangler Borough, and
ending at a point near the resi-
dence of John M. Weakland, in said
Township, which road was duly
approved by the Court, and an order
for the opening thereof issued; that
under said order the said road has
been partially opened by the super-
visors. That, in the opinion of your
petitioners, the opening of the remain-
der of said road, as laid out, will
be attended with great and un-
necessary expense, and the road
will be inconvenient and burden-
some.

Your petitioners therefore pray the

board to appoint properly qualified persons to view the whole of said road, and to vacate and relay or change such parts thereof as to them may seem advisable, and make report of their proceedings to the board; and that the board will take such further action in the premises as the circumstances may require, in accordance with the Act of Assembly in such case made.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Cambria held at Ebensburg in the said County, on the fourth day of March A. D. 1895, before the Honorable Judge of the said Court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the township of Duquesne in the said County, setting forth that they ~~labor under inconvenience for want of a road on highway to lead from~~

By virtue of certain proceedings in this
land a public road was lately laid out in the Township
of Duquesne beginning at a point near the residence
of Lawrence W. Finch, now in Spangler Borough and
ending at a point near the residence of John W. Weikland
in said Township which road was duly approved by
the Court and an order for the opening thereof issued
that under said order the said road has been partially
opened by the Supervisor. That in the opinion of
petitioners the opening of the remainder of said road
as laid out will be attended with great and unnecessary
expense and the road will be inconvenient and burdensome

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to ^{view, & lay} view and lay out the same according to law. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Paul Volmer SURVEYOR and James Souverelle Samuel Barber

VIEWERS, to ^{view & lay} view the ground proposed for said road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.

NOTE.—"It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report, at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: first, who of them were present at the view; second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."

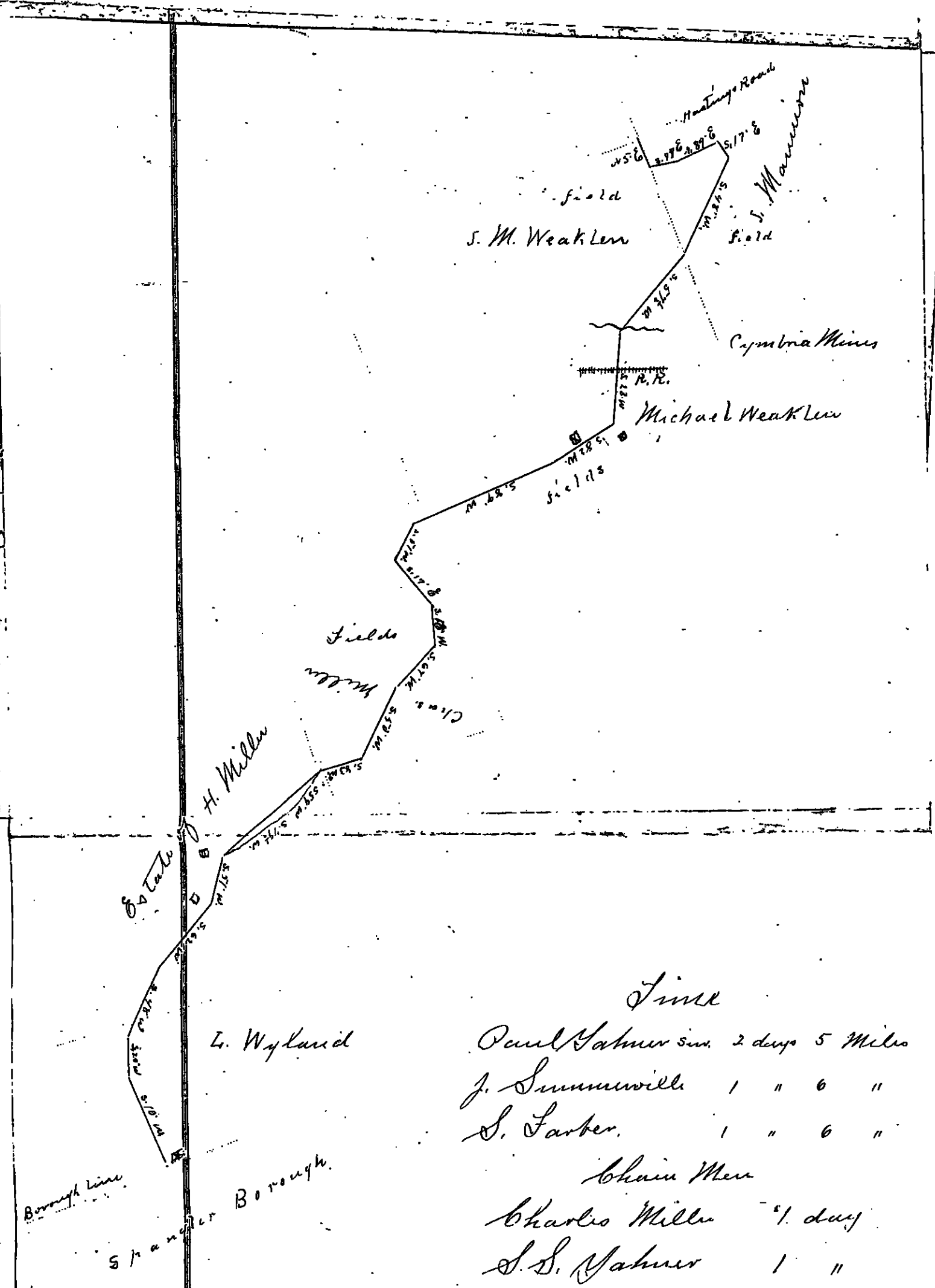

We the undersigned persons, appointed by the Court, to view the road therein mentioned, respectfully report: That having been present at the view thereof, and having all been first duly sworn, we have viewed the said road, and after due examination of the premises, we find that there is but little use for using such road by the public; That the opening of the same is laid out would be attended with greater expenses than Susquehanna Township could reasonably bear: That the damage to private property would be unusually great: And that no part of the said road can be vacated and supplied without increasing the distance, doing greater injury to property, and causing greater expense in opening. Therefore, for the reasons here stated, we are of opinion that the said road ought to be vacated. A draft of the same is hereto attached.
