To the Hon. A. V. Barker, President Judge of the Court of
Quarter Sessions of Cambria County.

We, the undersigned, viewers appointed by the within Order
of Court to vacate and supply the road in the Order mentioned,
respectfully report:

That having been first severally sworn and affirmed, we
met upon the premises, being the line of the road, on the Four-
teenth day of April, A.D. 1896, first having given notice by hand-
bills, as required by the statute, of the time and place of meet-
ing, proceeded to make the view, and are of the opinion that
the said road in part should be vacated and supplied; that we
herewith attach a draft, showing the parts of the road vacated
and supplied, In accordance with the provisions of the law, we
obtained a release from Conrad Yahner for the portion of the
road passing through his land, and requested all the other
property-holders and owners to execute releases. None others
were executed.

We therefore estimated the damages and advantages to the sev-
eral property-holders and owners along the line of the road, and
find the damages and advantages are equal; that no property-
holder on the line of the road has sustained damages by the
laying out and opening of the road beyond the advantages accru-
ing to him or them.

The line of the road as laid out to be opened to supply
the parts vacated, is as follows:

Beginning at a Post at the junction of the
Salix Road and the private Road of Conrad Yahner
thence in said private South $22\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$ east fifty
one (51) rods to a Post. Thence through land of
Conrad Yahner South forty-nine (49°) east forty-two
57) rods to a Sugar. Thence through the same
North eighty and one fourth ($80\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$) degrees east seven
(7) rods to a post. Thence North Seventy-five (75°)
degrees East seventeen & six tenths (17.6) rods to a Post
Thence through land of The Hammett Coal & Coke
Company, North forty-three (43°) degrees east
six & six tenths (6.6) rods to a post. Thence through
the same North Thirty (30°) degrees east fifty

(15) Rods to a Post Thence through the same North ~~Forty~~ (14) degrees east fifteen (15) Rods to a post in said Salix & Dault Road.

Thence suppling 109 Rods of said road to a post opposite the old watering trough.

Thence ~~the~~ land of Bennett C. & C. S. South (36) thirty six degrees east, sixteen (16) Rods to a Post

Thence South fifty seven & one half (57 1/2) degrees east twenty (20) rods to a Post. Thence

South forty one (41) degrees east twenty (20) rods to a post. Thence North seventy three (73) degrees east seven (7) rods to a Beech tree.

Thence North forty one (41) degrees east seven (7) rods to a small sugar.

Thence North twenty six (26) degrees east thirty one & six tenths (31.6) Rods to a post in the Salix & Dault Road near the Barn of Geo Hoff formerly James Costlow. said road to be thirty three (33) feet wide.

We therefore respectfully report in favor of the vacation of so much of the road as is shown on the draft marked "vacated", and the laying out and opening of that portion of the road shown on the map or plot, and marked, " to be opened".

All of which is respectfully submitted.

All the viewers were present, and concur in this report.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Cambria held at Ebensburg in the said County, on the Second day of March A. D. 1896, before the Honorable Judge of the said Court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the township of Adams in the said County, setting forth that they labor under inconvenience for want of a road or highway, to lead from heretofore a public road was laid out by order of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County, and used for a period of upwards of thirty years as a public highway, and maintained at the expense of the said Township, beginning at a point near the residence of Moses King, deceased, and ending near the residence of Samuel Pebley; that the said road in its present location, has become inconvenient, and would better accommodate the traveling public by being changed, or as to be given and end at the same points, but changed in the following particulars:

Beginning at a point on said road at or near the private road of Conrad Yelmer and intersecting the same road at or near the barn on the premises of George Houff, formerly the property of James Coatsman. The petitioners therefore pray the Court to inquire of and change the said road, or a certain and supplying, as herein prayed for and for each purpose

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to - view and lay out the same according to law. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint S. S. Pehes SURVEYOR
and D. G. Hubert and J. S. King

VIEWERS, to - view the ground proposed for said road, and if they - view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.

The petition of the undersigned, inhabitants of Adams Township, in Cambria County, respectfully represents:

That heretofore a public road was laid out by order of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County, and used for a period of upwards of thirty years as a public highway, and maintained at the expense of the said Township, beginning at a point near the residence of Moses Kring, deceased, and ending near the residence of Samuel Pebley; that the said road, in its present location, has become inconvenient; and would better accommodate the traveling public by being changed, so as to begin and end at the same points, but changed in the following particulars:

Beginning at a point on said road at or near the private road of Conrad Yehner, and intersecting the same road at or near the barn on the premises of George Huff, formerly the property of James Costlow.

The petitioners therefore pray the Court to inquire of and change the said road, vacating and supplying, as herein prayed for, and for such purpose to appoint three persons qualified according to law, to view the said road, and the ground proposed for the said change, as herein set forth, and inquire of the premises, and make report of their proceedings at the next term of this Court.
