

To the Honourable Judge
Barker of the within named
Court,

We the subscribers appointed
by the within order of Court
to view the route proposed for
said Road, Report that in pursuance
of said order, we first gave
due notice by 6 type written hand
bills stuck up in the most public
^{in said townships &}
places along said route stating
the day & time we would meet
to perform the duties of our
appointment (upwards of ten
days prior to our meeting),
where all parties interested could
attend if they saw proper,

We met on the 25th day of
Aug. 1898, ^(see notice attached.) And after all of
us being duly affirmed, we
proceeded to view the ground pro-
posed for said road, and
have laid out according to the fol-
lowing courses & distances on
top of a street laid out from
Waisy town to the Frankstown road
now there must be two cuts

Made on this road in 1850 that
the grade will not exceed five
degrees, according to a
draft hereto annexed,
and do report the same for
public uses. And as this is about
the best route of egress and ingress
to Waisytown, we also would
recommend that Waisytown
Borough bear one-half the
expenses for the grading of
said road. Beginning at the
terminus of 1st Street at line of
Waisytown Borough thence
along the center of a Street
that has been laid out and marked
as such on the ground, North twenty
four & a half degrees east and in the
center of twenty perches will take a
cut of two feet five inches (same course)
twenty perches on grade to summit
then begins to descend and at twenty perches
a cut of ten feet & at twenty to grade
& 6.8 ft to stones edge of Frankston
Road and about 40 feet from the
Corner School House in Cornburgh
township. The cutting and filling
required by this route being moderate
and could be made with less ex-
pense than opening any other

Route between said termini.
We believe that the road as desired
and laid out is necessary for public use,
Whole distance 86.8 perches - as shown on draft.
N, B, No releases required, being
located on a Street which
has been used by the public as a
road for upwards of ten years
or more,

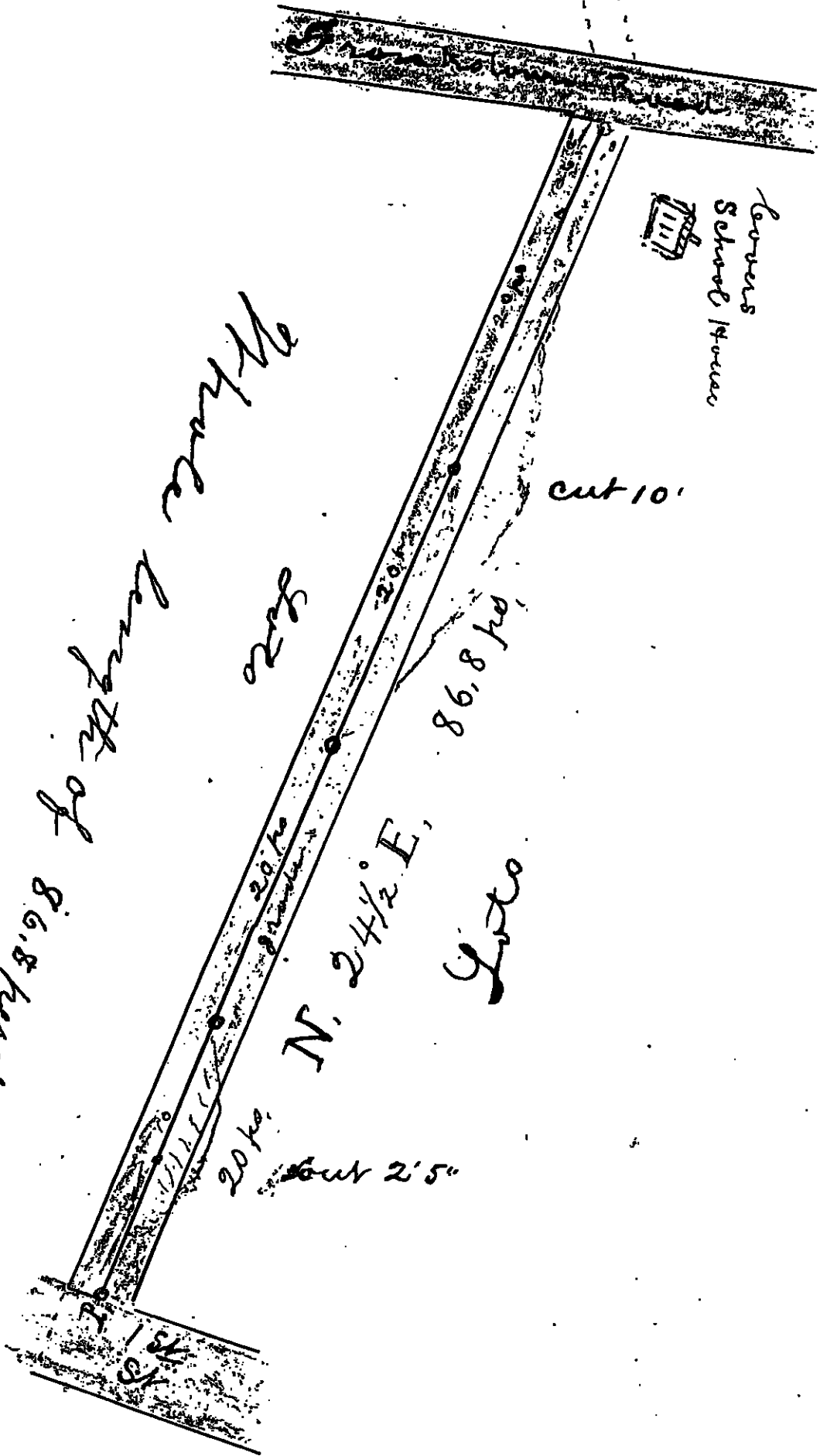

COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA. }
COUNTY OF GAMBRIA, } SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Cambria held at Ebensburg in the said County, on the Thirtieth day of June A. D. 1898, before the Honorable Judge of the said Court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the Township of Cosewaugh, in the said County, setting forth that they labor under inconvenience for want of a Public road or highway, to lead from the northerly terminus of First Street at the line of the Borough of Daisyton, in said township, to a point on the Transketon Road about 40 feet westely from Couer's School house in said township said point being at the intersection of a private road with the Transketon Road

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Wm. Slicer Esq. SURVEYOR, and Henry R. Shaffer and Patrick Stanton VIEWERS, to view the ground proposed for said road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desires of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.

NOTE.— It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and, in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained,—to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report, at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: first, who of them were present at the view; second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams,) where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."
