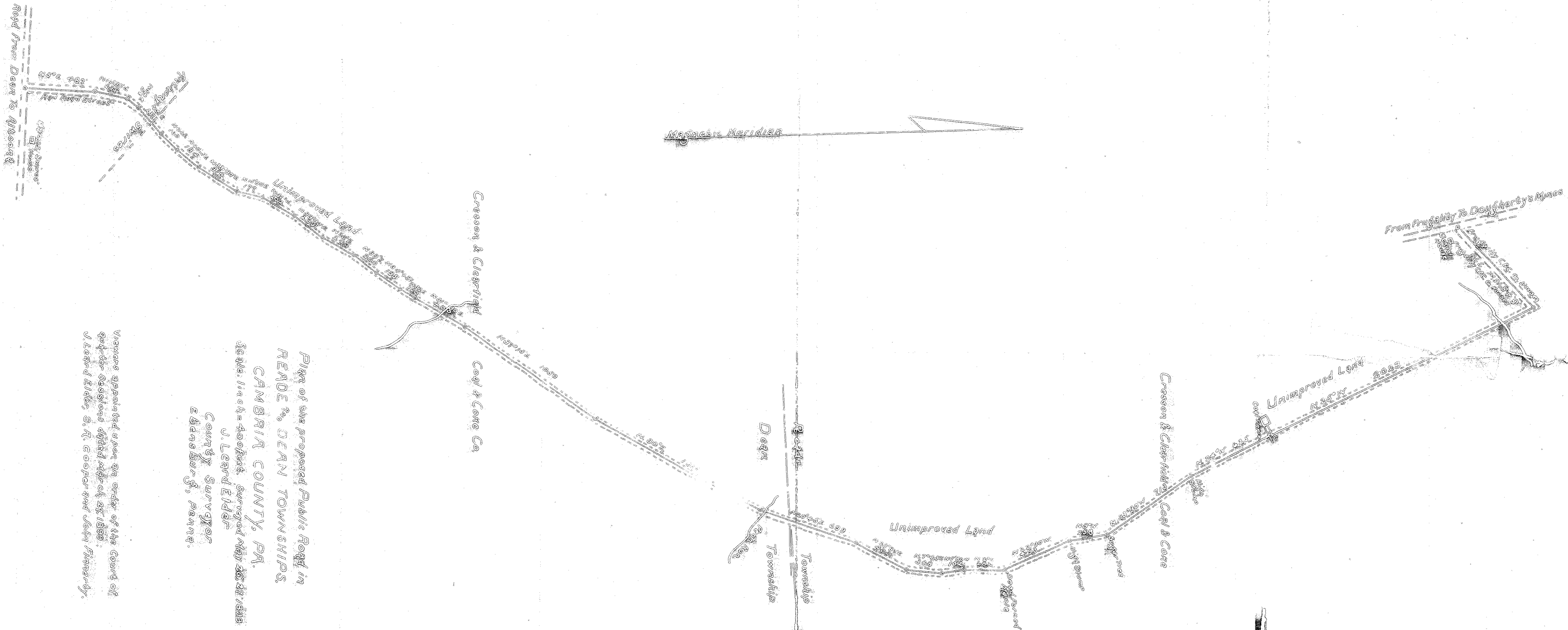


Magnetic Meridian

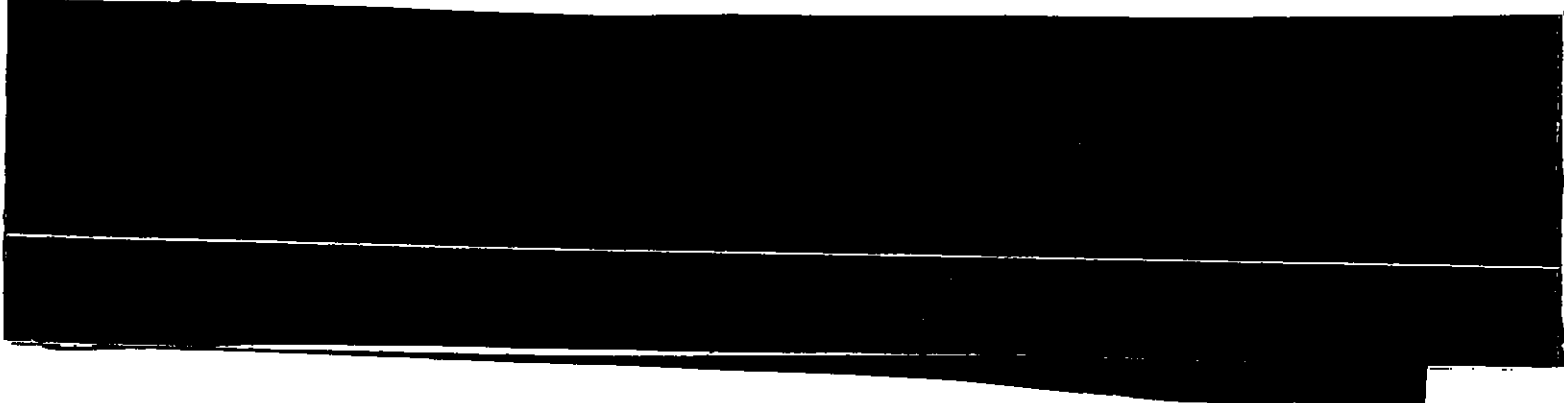


Plan of the proposed Public Road in

To the Honorable A.V. Barker, President Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions:

The petition of the undersigned citizens of Dean Township, Clearfield Township and Reade Township, Cambria County, respectfully represents:

That they labor under great inconvenience from want of a public road or highway beginning in the public road leading from Dean to Altoona at a point near Residence of James Swier in the township of Dean and ending at a point in the public road leading from Frugality to Dougherty's Mines, at a point near Frugality C. C. House, near the house on Frugality in the township of Reade. The petitioners therefore pray the court to point three persons qualified according to law, to view the ground proposed for said road and lay out the same and make report of their proceedings to the next term of this court.

To the Honorable A. V. Barker, President Judge of  
the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County,  
Pennsylvania, We, the undersigned viewers, appointed  
by the annexed order respectfully report, that  
after giving notice as required by law, J. Leard Elder,  
S. A. Cooper and John Finmerty viewers, having  
all been present at the view of the ground  
proposed for such road and having all  
been severally sworn or affirmed to perform  
our duties according to law, We, in pursuance  
of said order, have laid out and do return  
for public use the following road: Beginning in  
the public road leading from Deau to Altoona,  
at a point near residence of James Sures  
in the Township of Deau thence along Rail-  
Road Street North five degrees East four hundred  
and eighty seven feet, thence along said Rail Road  
Street North fourteen and one-half degrees East  
two hundred and thirty five feet, thence  
through Anthony Sures land North thirty nine  
degrees East ninety eight feet, thence through  
same North fifty one degrees East one  
hundred and thirty feet, thence through  
Cresson & Clearfield Coal & Coke Company's land  
North fifty one degrees East one hundred and  
seven feet, thence through same North forty-  
six degrees East one hundred and sixty feet,  
thence North forty and one-fourth degrees East  
one hundred and eighty four feet, thence  
North thirty three and one-half degrees East  
three hundred and fourteen feet, thence

North fifteen and one-half degrees east one hundred and seventy seven feet, thence North thirty one degrees east two hundred and fifty two feet, thence North thirty nine and one-half degrees east two hundred and forty five feet, thence North thirty degrees east two hundred and forty six feet, thence North thirty nine degrees east two hundred feet, thence North thirty four and three fourths degrees east one hundred and ninety five feet, thence North thirty two degrees east one hundred and twenty feet, thence North thirty one and one-half degrees east four hundred feet, thence North thirty seven and one fourth degrees east ten hundred and fifty feet, thence North thirty degrees east thirteen hundred and ten feet, thence North twenty and three fourths degrees east six hundred and ninety nine feet, thence North twenty nine and one-half degrees east four hundred feet, thence North seven and three fourths east three hundred and forty eight feet, thence North five and one-half degrees west one hundred and fifty feet, thence North two degrees east two hundred and eighty two feet, thence North twenty two and one-half degrees west four hundred and ninety three feet, thence North nine degrees west two hundred and fifty eight feet, thence North thirty three and one-half degrees west seven hundred and

COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA. }

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Cambria held at Ebensburg in the said County, on the 24<sup>th</sup> day of March A. D. 1899, before the Honorable Judge of the said Court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the Township of Dean, Clarified<sup>9th</sup> Reade in the said County, setting forth that they labor under inconvenience for want of a public road or highway, ~~to lead from~~

beginning in the public road leading from Dean to Altoona at a point near Residence of James Swires in the township of Dean, and ending at a point in the public road leading from Ingality to Dougherty's Mines, at a point near Ingality C. C. Co. Houses near School houses in Ingality in the township of Reade. The petitioners

~~and~~ therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

J. Laird Elder SURVEYOR, and A. R. Cooper and John Timmerly

VIEWERS, to view the ground proposed for said road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desires of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.

NOTE. — "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report, at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: first, who of them were present at the view; second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams,) where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."
