

IN THE COURT OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF CAMBRIA COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA.

To the Honorable A. V. Barker, President Judge of said Court:-

The petition of the undersigned inhabitants and citizens of the Township of Adams, said county, respectfully showeth: That they labor under great inconveniences for want of a public road or highway to lead from a point in said township on the public road leading from Lovett to Wilmore one hundred and fifty (150) feet northerly from the Lovett Post Office, to a beech tree at a point along the Lovett and Dunlo public road about fifty (50) rods north-easterly from where said road crosses the railroad from South Fork to Dunlo, in said Township.

Your petitioners therefore pray your Honorable Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law; and they will ever pray, etc.

We the undersigned viewers appointed by the  
annexed order do report: That in pursuance  
thereof after having been severally duly affirmed  
all of the viewers appointed by said order viewed  
the ground proposed for the within mentioned road  
and the undersigned all of said viewers do agree  
that there is occasion for a road as desired by  
the petitioners and that the same is necessary for  
a public road: and having had respect to the sho-  
rest distance and the best ground for such road  
we have laid out in such a manner as shall do  
the least injury to private property and as far as  
practicable agreeably to the desire of the petitioners  
and do return for public use the following descri-  
ed road to wit:

Beginning at a point on public road leading from  
Lovett to Wilmore forty nine feet East of the centre  
line of the Dunlo branch of the Pennsylvania railroad  
in Adams Township Thence southerly and parallel  
with the aforesaid railroad on a radius of 1004.  
feet through improved lands of Pennsylvania rail-  
road Company and improved lands of John Lovett  
three hundred and seventy four feet to a post thence  
through improved lands of John Lovett aforesaid improved  
lands of Agnes V. Lovett improved lands of Josephine  
Lovett unimproved land of John Lovett aforesaid  
and improved land of John Madison thence south  
ten degrees west two thousand three hundred feet  
to a post Thence through unimproved land of

1 John Madison heirs aforesaid and unimproved  
2 land of John Litchman heirs on a radius of  
3 1588 ft bearing south easterly parallel with the  
4 aforesaid railroad one thousand two hundred and  
5 fifty feet to a point on the Dumbo road four  
6 hundred and fifty feet from where said road crosses  
7 the aforesaid railroad in Adams Township.  
8 said road being at an elevation not exceeding  
9 five degrees. The undersigned further report that  
10 they endeavored to procure from all the owners of  
11 the land over which said road passes releases in  
12 writing of all claims to damages that may arise  
13 from opening the same. but failed to procure  
14 any such releases and therefore having taken into  
15 consideration the advantages to be derived to the  
16 said land owners we believe that the same would  
17 be greater than the injury done to their properties  
18 and therefore award them no damages for and  
19 on account of said road passing through their  
20 land. We further report that before the said view  
21 public notice of the time and place of meeting  
22 of the viewers was given by advertisements put  
23 up at the most public places in the vicinity as  
24 required by law ten days before said meeting  
25 and we annex a plot or draft of said road  
26 laid out stating the courses and distances  
27 and noticing briefly the improvements through  
28 which the same passes. and herewith return notices  
29 served on the commissioners of Cambria County  
30 and supervisors of Adams Township.

D. 1899, before the Honorable Judge of the said Court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the Township of Adams, in the said County, setting forth that they labor under inconvenience for want of a public road or highway, to lead from a point on road from Lovitt to Wilmer about 150 feet north end, from Lovitt P.O. to a point on the Smith road about 50 rods from rail road crossing.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

Isaiah Wisinger SURVEYOR, and William Baker and Robert Trotter

VIEWERS, to view the ground proposed for said road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desires of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.
