At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Cambria held at Ebensburg in the said County, on the Eighteenth day of July A. D. 1901, before the Honorable Judge of the said Court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the Township of Stonycreek, in the said County, setting forth that ~~the same is a part of a public road, known as the "Von Lunen Road" in the Township of Stonycreek, Cambria County, Pennsylvania, beginning at a point where the same is intersected by Frederick Street by the prolongation of the said Street from the division line between the City of Johnstown, Cambria County, Pennsylvania, and Stonycreek Township aforesaid, and ending at a point where the said road is intersected by Bond Street, has, by order of court, lately been vacated, and by the same order a public road hath been lately laid out and supplied between the points of beginning and ending above mentioned over and along a different route, which proceeding, if confirmed by the Court, will be very injurious to your petitioners and burdensome to the inhabitants of the Township of Stonycreek, through which said road will pass entirely~~

VIEWERS, to re-view the ground proposed for said road, and if they re-view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desires of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.

NOTE.—"It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report, at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: first, who of them were present at the view; second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams,) where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."

To the Honorable A.V. Barker, President Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County:

The petition of the undersigned respectfully represents, That a public road was long since laid out and opened, leading from Berlin, in Somerset County, Pennsylvania, to the Town of Beulah in Cambria County, Pennsylvania, and known as the "Beulah Road;" that the part of said road included in Cambria County, extended from the Red Bridge to the Bedford Pike in said County, which part of said road was usually known as the "Von Lunen Road;" that a part of said road through the Township of Stonycreek, in Cambria County, beginning at a point where the same is intersected by Frederick Street by the prolongation of said street from the division line between the City of Johnstown, Cambria County, and Stonycreek Township aforesaid, and ending at a point where the said road is intersected by Bond Street, has become inconvenient and burdensome, and that the said road would be much improved and would afford more convenient travel thereover, by the vacation of that part thereof included between the points hereinabove mentioned, and the supply thereof over and along a different route.

Your petitioners therefore pray the Court to appoint qualified persons to view the premises and inquire into the expediency of making such change, and otherwise proceed as directed by the Act of Assembly in such case made and provided.

To the Honorable A. V. Barker, President Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County:

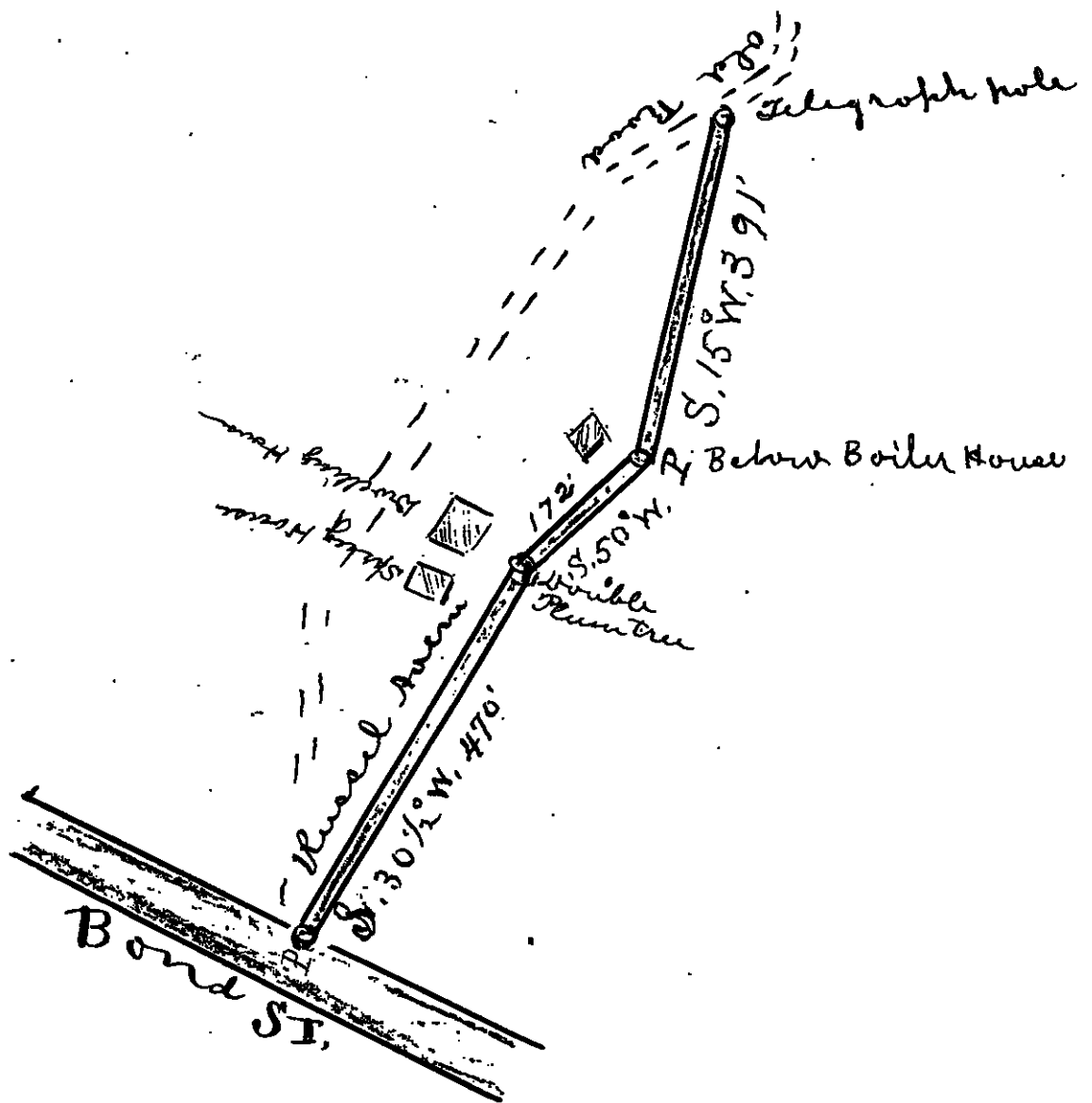
