TO THE HONORABLE A. V. BARKER, PRESIDENT JUDGE OF THE COURT
OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF CAMBRIA COUNTY.

We, the undersigned, viewers appointed by the within
order of Court to vacate and supply the road in the order mentioned,
respectfully represent:

That we met at the house of William Baker in the Village
of Dunlo, in the township of Adams, in said county, on the 24th
day of August, 1901, at ten o'clock A. M., and for the purposes of
our appointment we went to the land where the road mentioned in
said order is located; and first having been severally sworn, we
proceeded to the performance of the duties required of us by the
within order; first having given notice by hand-bills as required
by the statute of the time and place of meeting; we proceeded to
make the view, and are of the opinion that the part of the old
road long since laid out leading from near the residence of Moses
Kring in Adams Township, and ending near the residence of Samuel
Pebly in the same township, ^{which} had been supplied by a new road commencing
at or near the old watering-trough on lands of W.W. Baker, formerly
George F. Huff in Adams Township, thence to a point in the same
road which is known as the Salix and Dunlo road, where the barn
of Hon. George F. Huff stood before it was destroyed by fire, on
the land of said Huff, which was laid out and returned to the Court
on June 1st, 1896, and confirmed 28th October, 1896, but has not
and supplied as hereinafter mentioned,
been opened, is unnecessary, inconvenient and would be a greater
burden upon the inhabitants of the township of Adams than they
should be called upon to bear. That the part so laid out,
and which we report as inconvenient, burdensome, and unnecessary,
and which we report to be vacated, is as follows: Beginning at a

point on the road above mentioned called the Salix & Dunlo road near the old watering-trough; thence over the land of W.W. Baker South 36° East 264 feet, thence over same land South 59° 30' East 330 feet, thence through lands of George F. Huff South 41° East 330 feet, thence through same land North 72° East 115.5 feet, t thence through same land North 41° East 88 feet, thence through same land North 26° East 521 feet to a point on the Salix & Dunlo Road near where the barn of George F. Huff stood before it was destroyed by fire; which we, the undersigned viewers, return to the Court to be vacated, no part of said road as laid out having been opened or used for public travel. The same to be supplied by the old road, commencing at or near the old watering-trough aforesaid, and its courses and distances as is now travelled and long since had been laid out, to a point where the barn of George F. Huff stood before the same was destroyed by fire. *viz,*

A plot or draft showing the road vacated, as well as the course of the old road, which is supplied and restored, as if it had never been vacated.

We, therefore, respectfully report, in favor of the vacation of so much of the road as shown on the draft marked vacated; and we report in favor of supplying the same by the old road, commencing at the points above named, namely, the old watering-trough and the point near where the barn of George F. Huff stood before it was destroyed by fire. That said old road is open and used for public travel as if the same had never been vacated. All of which is respectfully submitted. All of the viewers were present and concur in this report.

D. ~~1896~~ ¹⁹⁰⁷, before the Honorable Judge of the said Court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the Township of Adams, in the said County, setting forth that they ~~labor under inconvenience for want of a~~ ~~road or highway, to lead from~~

~~part of a public road beginning at a point near the residence of Moses King in Adams Township and ending near the residence of Samuel Leiby in Adams Township (which had long since been laid out), was supplied by a new road commencing at or near the old watering trough on lands of W. W. Baden, formerly George F. Huff, in Adams Township, thence to a point on the same road (which is also known as the Salis and Sunk's road near where the barn of the Hon. George F. ~~to where the barn of Hon. George F. Huff stood, has never been opened nor would upon any application by the supervisors of said Township of Adams. Your petitioners further represent that to open and make the part of the said road supplied, fit and suitable for public use would be too great a burden and too expensive for the Township of Adams to bear. The petitioners further represent that the road vacated is in good condition and that the vacating of the same was unnecessary and that to open the part vacated is unnecessary and will be burdensome and inconvenient to the inhabitants of said Township vacate~~

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

~~VIEWERS, to — view the ground proposed for said road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desires of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.~~

NOTE.—It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review, or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth.
"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."
"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report, at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: first, who of them were present at the view; second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and nothing briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."

W. Baker, formerly George F. Huff, in Adams Township, thence to a point on the same road (which is also known as the Salix and Dunlo road) near where the barn of the Hon. George F. They, therefore pray the Court to appoint viewers to

vacate the part of the said road above referred to in this petition
 and to leave the old road where it has been since it was first
 laid out.

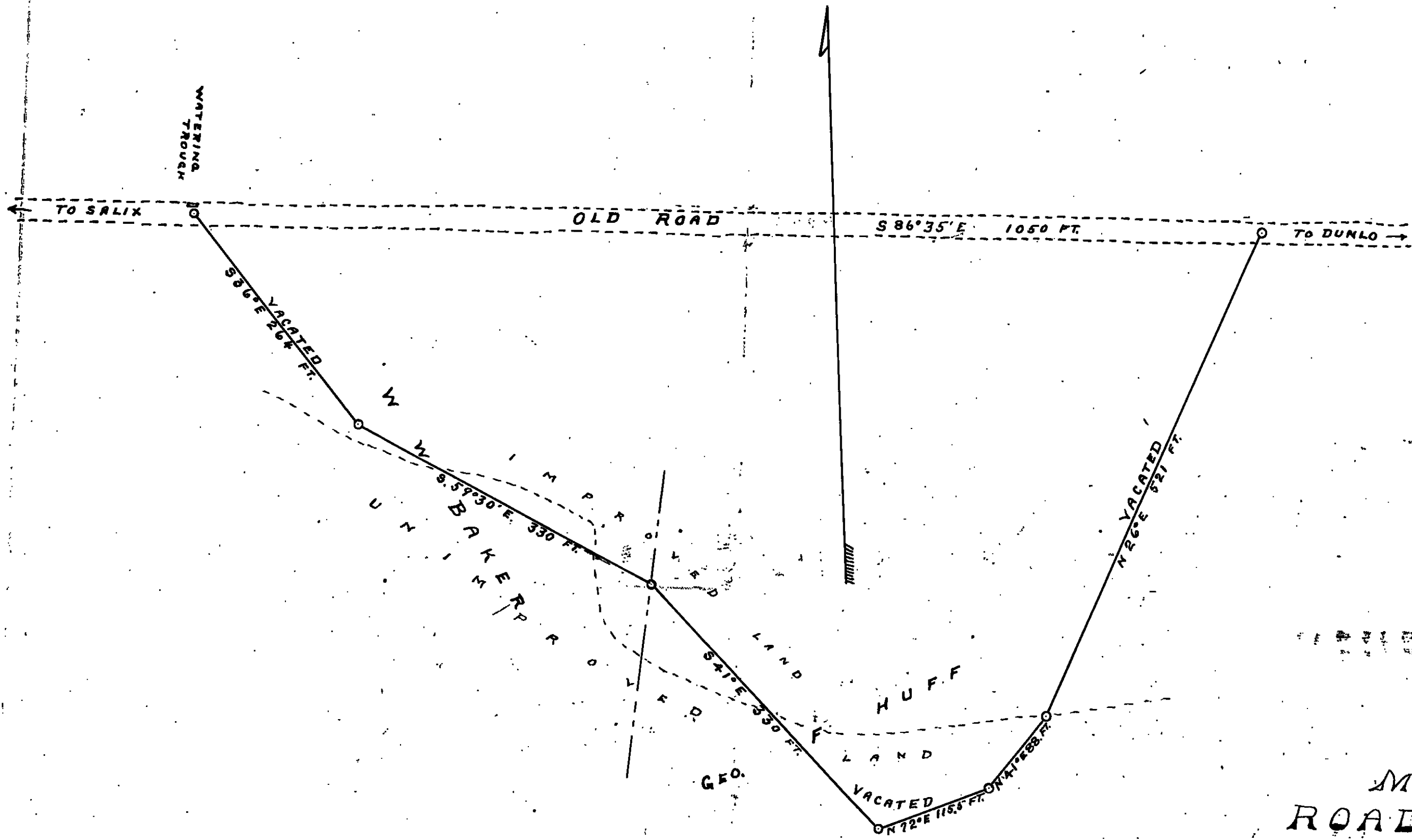
