To the Honorable Francis J. O'Connor President Judge
of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County;

We the undersigned viewers appointed by the
unrepealed orders do report That in pursuance thereof
after having been severally duly affirmed all of the
viewers appointed by said orders viewed the ground
proposed for the within mentioned road and the under-
signed all of said viewers do agree that there is
occasion for a road as desired by the petitioners and
that the same is necessary for a public road: and
having had respect to the shortest distance and the
best grounds for such road we have laid out in such
a manner as shall do the least injury to private property
and as far as practicable agreeable to the desire of the
petitioners and do return for public use the following
described road to wit

Beginning in the public road leading from the Frankis-
town road to Kneppers Mill at a point about eight
rods north of No 6 Schoolhouse on division line between
Heirs of Catharine Shantz and No 6 School property
in Summerhill Township Thence on division line
along land of Heirs of Catharine Shantz land of Oliver
Plummer and land of John Hampton on the north side
and No 6 School property land of Mrs Elizabeth Woolf
and land of Mrs Plummer on the south side North
Seventy four degrees and ten minutes west one thousand
nine hundred and seventy five feet to a post Thence
on division line between improved land of John
Hampton and improved land of M E Plummer
south fifty five degrees and thirty minutes west three
hundred and twenty eight feet to a post Thence on

division line between improved land of John Hampton
aforesaid and improved land of H. K. Burnett's north
forty one degrees and forty five minutes west one thousand
eight hundred and ninety feet to a point in the public
road leading from Kneppers Mill to the Frankstown road
and road leading from Lovitt to Frankstown road. about fifty
feet south of the residence of Geo. Mulhollen in Summerhill
Township. Said road being at an elevation not exceeding
five degrees. We further report that we endeavored to
procure from all the owners of the land over which
said road passes releases in writing of all claims to damages
that may arise from opening the same. and that we procured
such releases from John Hampton and H. K. Burnett
and failed to procure releases from the Heirs of Catharine
Shartz. Oliver Plummer. Mrs Elizabeth Wolf and M. E.
Plummer. and therefore having taken into consideration the
advantages to be derived to the said Heirs of Catharine Shartz
Oliver Plummer Mrs Elizabeth Wolf and M. E. Plummer
we believe that the same would be greater than the injury
done to their properties and therefore award them no
damages for and on account of said road passing through
their land. We also report that we have inquired of
and vacated that portion of the public road leading from
the road from Kneppers Mill to Frankstown road to the road
leading from Lovitt to Frankstown road from a point in the
same near the residence of Geo. Mulhollen on division line
between H. K. Burnett and John Hampton in Summerhill
Township. to point where the same intersects the road
leading from Kneppers Mill to the Frankstown road, ^{in Croyle's Township.} which
last mentioned road will by reason of the opening of the
proposed road become useless. and burdensome to the Townships

We further report that before the said view, public notice was given of the time and place of meeting of the viewers, by advertisements put up at the most public places in the vicinity as required by law ten days before said meeting, also that such notices were served on the Commissioners of the County and Supervisors of the Townships of Summerhill & Croyle.

And we annex a plot or draft of said road laid out stating the courses and distances and noticing briefly the improvements through which the same passes, and herewith return the releases obtained

VIEWERS, to view the ground proposed for said road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desires of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.

That they labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road, to begin in the public road leading from the Frankstown Road to Knepper's Mill, in said Township, at a point about eight rods North of Number Six School House, in said Township and County, and to end in a public road leading from Knepper's Mill to Frankstown road and road leading from Lovett to Frankstown road, at a point about fifty feet South of the residence of George Mulhollen, on division line between W. K. Burnett and John Hampton, in said Township and County.

Your petitioners, therefore, pray the Court to appoint three persons qualified according to law as viewers to view the ground proposed for such road and if they see occasion to lay out the same, to inquire of and vacate that portion of the public road leading from the road from Knepper's Mill to Frankstown Road to the road leading from Lovett to Frankstown Road, at a point in the same near the residence of George Mulhollen, on line between W. K. Burnett and John Hampton, to point where the same intersects the road leading from Knepper's Mill to Frankstown Road aforesaid, which last mentioned road

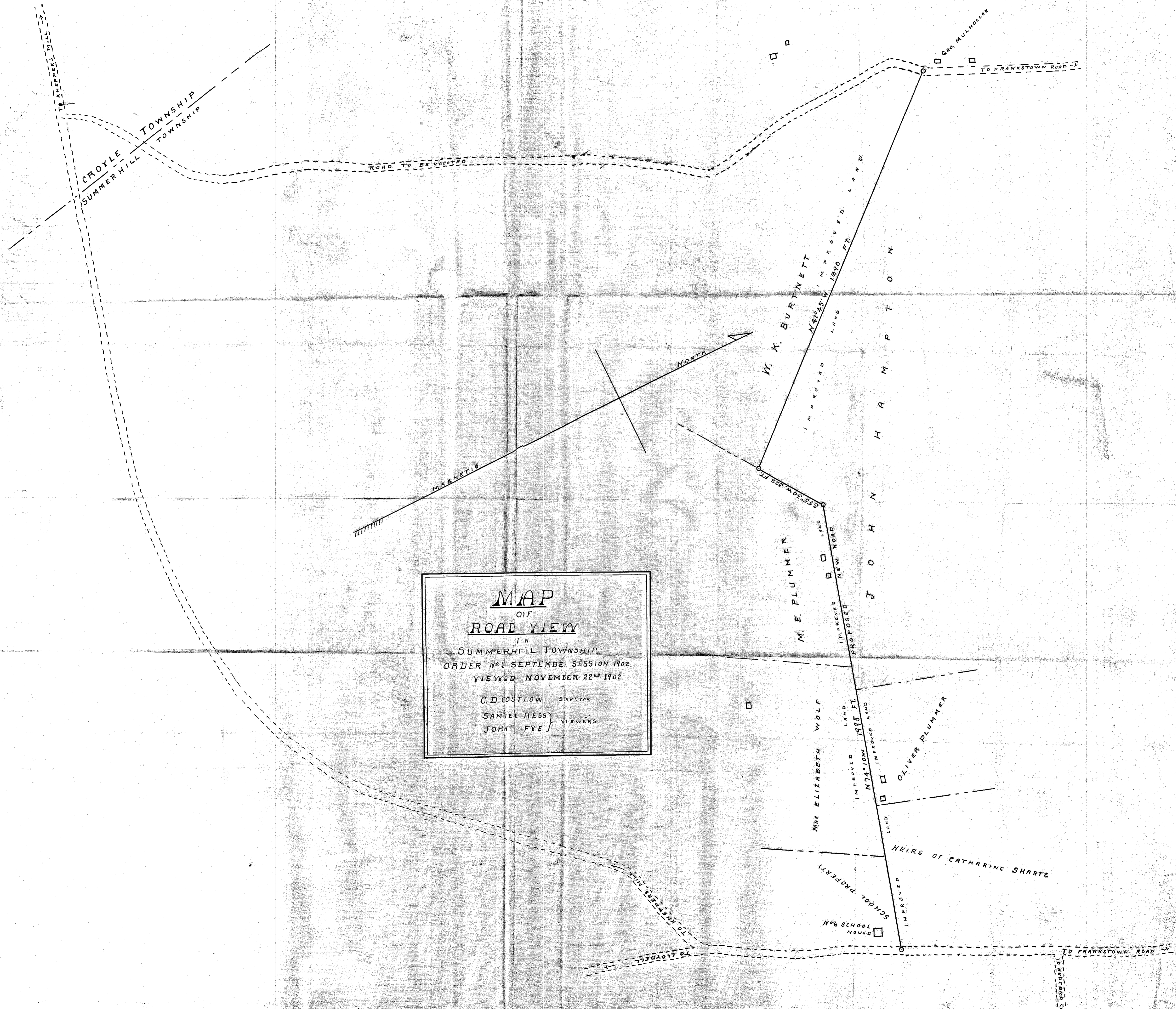
