appointed by the aforesaid order do report
That in pursuance thereof after having
been severally duly sworn or affirmed to perform
our duties impartially and to the best of our
judgment, and having given due public notice
as required by law and having served
copies of said notices upon Supervisors of
the territory through which such new
public road is laid out, and also upon
the County Commissioners of said County
properly attested copies of said notices being hereto
attached. all the viewers appointed by
said order viewed the ground proposed for the
within mentioned road, and the undersigned
do agree that there is occasion for a road
as desired by the petitioners, and that the
same is necessary for a public road, and
having due respect to the shortest distance
and the best ground for such road
we have laid it out in such manner as shall

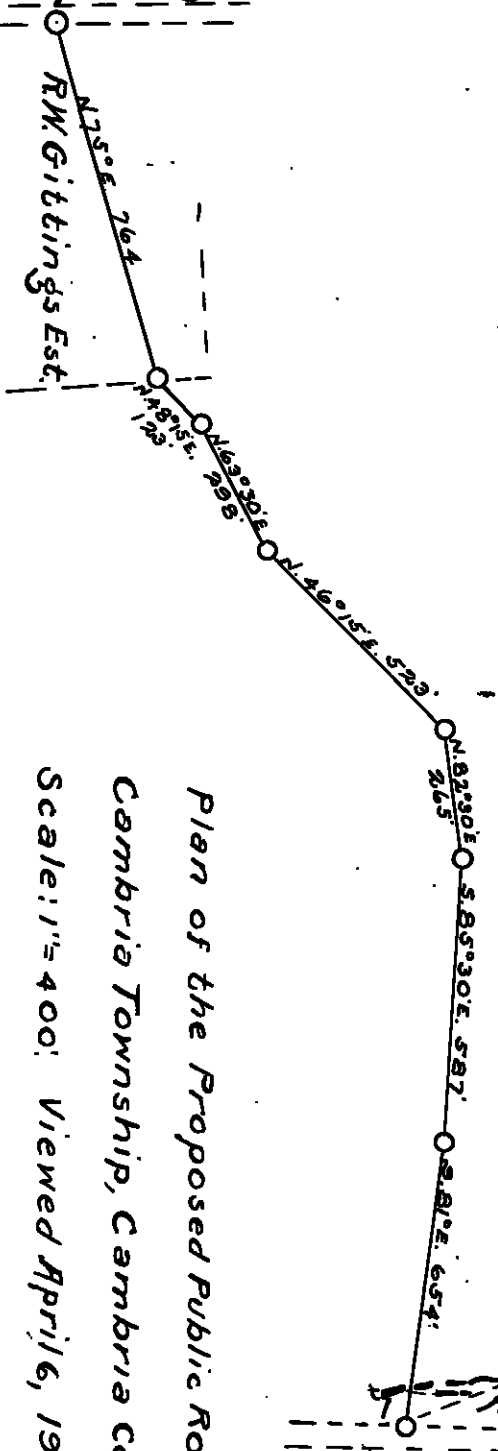

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Cambria held at Ebensburg in the said County, on the Sixteenth day of March A. D. 1903, before the Honorable Judge of the said Court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the Township of Barr and Cambria, in the said County, setting forth that they labor under inconvenience for want of a public road or highway, to lead from a point near the buildings of the estate of R. W. Gittings deceased on the road leading from Nicktown to Ebensburg and running in an easterly direction through land of R. W. Gittings deceased and lands of Jacob Yost and A. W. Wisel terminating at or near Wisel's Grist-Mill on a road leading from Jones' Cross-Roads to Snyders Blacksmith shop, (the distance of the proposed road being a distance of about one hundred and sixty rods, said road being all in the Township of Cambria)

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

J. L. Elder Sr. SURVEYOR, and
Jno. Eger and Jno. P. Kirsch

VIEWERS, to view the ground proposed for said road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desires of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge. If they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land and such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to the viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report, at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: first, who of them were present at the view; second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."
