IN THE COURT OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF CAMBRIA COUNTY, PA.

To the Honorable Francis J. O'Connor, President Judge of Said Court,

The petition of the undersigned, all of whom are taxable inhabitants and residents of Munster Township, in said County, respectfully represents:

That your petitioners labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road or highway which they desire to be laid out as follows:

Beginning at the westerly terminus of a private road in said Township between land of Pius Cramer and land of John Bard, on the public road leading from the Turnpike to the Plank Road, and ending at a terra-cotta culvert at turn of public road upon land of John C. Beiter, in said Township.

Your petitioners therefore pray your honorable Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, and they will ever pray etc.,

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MOUNTAINEER-BERNALD PRINT.

NOTE. It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review, any, public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth.

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners.

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report, at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: first, who of them were present at the view; second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."

To the Honorable Francis J. O'Connor, President Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County, Pennsylvania,--

The undersigned viewers appointed by your honorable Court to view and lay out for public use a public road in Munster Township, commencing at a point on the public road leading from the Turnpike to the Plank Road, being the westerly terminus of a private road between land of Pius Cramer and land of John P. Bard, and ending at a terra-cotta culvert at the turn of the public road upon land of John C. Beiter, do respectfully report and return:-

That having given due public notice by typewritten notices posted in the most public parts of the said township, not less than ten days before the date fixed for the view, and also having given written notice to the supervisors of said township and to the County Commissioners of said County, as will appear from the acceptances of notice hereto-attached, the viewers met at the place fixed in said notice, to wit:- at the house of John P. Bard, near the westerly terminus of said proposed road, on Monday the 28th day of November, A. D. 1904, at one o'clock P. M., all of said viewers being present and being first duly sworn to perform their duties impartially and according to the best of their judgment, they proceeded to the discharge of their duties under said appointment, and having looked over the ground proposed for a public road, and taken into account the location and all the circumstances bearing upon the question of the necessity of a public road, as proposed, we do find that there is occasion and necessity for a public road as prayed for by the petitioners, and accordingly lay out and return for public use a road as follows:-

Beginning at a point on the public road leading from the Turnpike to the Plank Road at the westerly terminus of a private road between land of Pius Cramer and John P. Bard; thence upon and along said land the following three courses and distances, to wit:- South 73° 00' East 252 feet to a post; South 77° 00' E. 309 feet to a post, North 76° 00' East 402 feet to post on line of land of John C. Beiter; thence through land of said John C. Beiter and following course: of

the private road South  $80^{\circ} 30' E$ . 462 feet to a point at Terra-cotta cluvert in turn of public road upon land of John C. Beiter; the entire course of said road being in Munster Township, and there being no improvements along the line of said road as proposed, excepting some fences; the course being along cleared land, and being laid out with respect to the shortest distance and best ground for a road between the points mentioned, and in such a manner to do the least injury to private property, and to be also, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners; we further report that we have endeavored to procure releases from the property-owners through whose land the road lies, we have also considered the advantages and disadvantages to the properties traversed by said road, and are of the opinion that the properties through which the said road is laid out are benefited to an amount equal to the damages to be sustained by the taking of the land for said road, and, consequently have awarded no damages to any of the land owners, a map or plot of said road is hereto attached and made a part of this report; all of which is respectfully submitted.


