

To the Honorable A. V. Barker, President Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County Pennsylvania.

The petition of the undersigned, being the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Lilly in said County respectfully represents.

That the Town Council of said Borough on the 31st day of August 1893. passed the following ordinance, viz:

AN ORDINANCE determining the width of Main Street from P. R. R. to Borough line.

Section 1. Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of Lilly Borough and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same: That that part of Main Street extending from P. R. R. to North Borough line is to be the width of fifty (50) feet.

Section 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

Ordained and enacted into a law in Council this 31st day of August A. D. 1893.
