The petition of the undersigned citizens of the Township of Blacklick in said County and State respectfully represents;

That the viewers were appointed by this Court, and reported to the last term thereof, that they had laid out, and returned for public use the following road, viz:- Beginning at a point on the road leading from Strongstown to Nicktown, being a corner of land of A.H. Longnecker and D.F. Boring, near Ivison Post-office, thence along line between A.H. Longnecker and D.F. Boring, north $87^{\circ} 30'$ west, 1504 feet, thence through land of Horatio Willett north 51° west, 484 feet, thence north 53° west, 290 feet, thence north $47^{\circ} 30'$ west, 197 feet, thence north $38^{\circ} 30'$ west, 327 feet, thence north $50^{\circ} 45'$ west, 660 feet to a point on the Indiana & Cambria County line, and connecting with a road recently laid out in the County of Indiana from a point near residence of Thomas Donahue, in said County of Cambria.

That said road, as the same was laid out by the viewers is unnecessary for public use, and the making and laying out of the same will be burdensome for the citizens of said Township of Blacklick. That a majority of the citizens who are interested in a road at or near that place, will not be benefited, if the road is laid out as the viewers reported the same.

That the proper place for the proposed road is as follows:;
Starting at a point in the public road at the Briar Patch School-
house, on the line between A.A. ~~Longnecker~~ ^{Bennett} & James Bennett, thence
across a portion of the land owned by said A.A. Bennett, to a place
known as the Len. Boring mill, from thence to the line of W.J. Hill,
and past the properties of _____ McClune and Wm. Donahue to the

Cherry-tree road.

Your petitioners therefore pray this Honorable Court to appoint re-viewers to set aside the return of the viewers, and vacate the proposed road as returned by them, and view and locate the road on the line as above described, and particularly that portion of said road which would run to the Indiana County line which is located near the said Len. Boring mill; and to make report of their proceedings at the next Term of this Court.

EXCEPTIONS TO THE REPORT OF THE REVIEWERS.

On the 7th day of February, 1905, viewers were appointed by the above-named court upon the petition of citizens of Blacklick Township to view the ground for a road leading from Ivison, in said township, to the Indiana County line. These viewers filed their report March 6, 1905; and no exceptions were filed thereto.

On the 5th day of June, 1905, a petition of the citizens of the same township was presented to the court for the appointment of reviewers, as endorsed upon said petition. The reviewers filed their report on the 4th day of September, 1905, and exceptions have been filed to the report of the reviewers.

Had we examined the petition endorsed "Petition of citizens of the township of Blacklick for the appointment of reviewers", the order endorsed on said petition dated June 5th, 1905, would never have been made. It was competent for the court to appoint reviewers in the above stated cause, but the petition gave the court no jurisdiction for that purpose. The prayer of that petition asks the court to "appoint reviewers to set aside the return of viewers and vacate the proposed road as returned by them and view and locate the road on the line as above described and particularly that portion of said road which would run to the Indiana County line, which is located near the said Leaning Mill."

We had no jurisdiction to appoint reviewers for the purposes set forth in the petition, and our signing the order endorsed upon the back of the petition gave no authority to the persons named therein, and their report must be set aside.

X And now, February 6, 1906, the exceptions to the report of reviewers sustained, and the report set aside. No exceptions having been filed to the report of viewers and the time having elapsed during which an application might be made for the appointment of reviewers or re-reviewers, the report of the viewers is confirmed, and an order is directed to issue for the opening of the road as shown by said report.

EXCEPTIONS TO REPORT OF REVIEWERS.

1. The petition for review is for a road between different termini from those named in the original order to viewers, and the reviewers laid out a road between termini not named in the original order.
2. The petition for review and the order to review designated the route for a road by intermediate points between the termini.
3. The reviewers return a route for a road terminating at a different point from that designated in the petition for review and in the order to review.
4. The reviewers were without authority to recommend that the road returned by the viewers for public use should be vacated, as the report of viewers had not been confirmed by the Court.

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."

We, the undersigned viewers appointed by the annexed order of
Court, to review and vacate a certain road in Blacklick Township,
which road was viewed and laid out Feb'y. 27th. 1905., but not open-
ed; and to lay out a substitute for the above mentioned road in
a more desirable location. Having met at the time and place appoint-
ed; first having given due public notice of such time and place
of meeting of the viewers, by printed hand bills posted in con-
spicuous places near the sites of the said roads, and having also
served like notice on the Commissioners of Cambria County and the
Supervisors of Blacklick Township: After having been severally
sworn or affirmed according to law; proceeded to view the roads,
the locations of which are shown on the draft or plat hereto attach-
ed and made a part of this report:-

The First- Beginning at a point on the public road leading from
Strongstown to Nicktown, thence along line between A. H. Long-
enecker and D. F. Boring North 87 1/2 degrees West 1504 feet,
thence through land of Horatio Willett North 51 degrees West 404
feet, thence North 88 degrees West 290 feet, thence North 47 1/2
West 197 feet, thence North 88 1/2 degrees West 520 feet to right-
of-way of the Blacklick and Yellow Creek Railroad Co. thence,
continuing still through land of Horatio Willett North 50 5/4
degrees West 660 feet to the Indiana and Cambria County line.

The Second- Beginning at a point on the public road, where the
public road from Belsano, past the Briar Patch School house, joins

Which last described location we are agreed is the best, most convenient and most suitable for the citizens of Blacklick Township generally, as well as for the traveling public at large:-

For the following reasons:-

First, the road formerly laid out, in our opinion, was not laid out where it would be most convenient for the public generally:

Secondly, that the ground over which the road was formerly laid out is so irregular, so rough and so very swampy that a passable road could not be constructed over it without expending a large sum of money, and after the construction of such a road, the ground is of such a character as would for many years require almost continual repairing and would prove burdensome to the tax payers of the Township: And therefore we recommend that the road as formerly laid out be vacated:

Thirdly, that the new road as laid out is the most suitable loc-

ation for a public road:

Fourth, that the ground over which the new road is laid out is good ground for a road bed and, with the exception of one ravine or gully, the ground is regular:

Fifth, that when the new road is constructed it will require but little repairs to keep it in good condition and we estimate that the comparative difference in the cost of constructing and keeping the two roads in repair would be one half less in the construction of the second road than the first and that after building, the latter could be kept in good condition with one half less than the work which would be required to keep up the first road.

"It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."
