

TO THE HONORABLE FRANCIS J. O'CONNOR, PRESIDENT JUDGE OF THE
COURT OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF CAMBRIA, COUNTY.

We the undersigned viewers, appointed by the annexed order of Court, respectfully report:

That after having given due public notice of the time and place of meeting of the viewers by printed hand bills posted in conspicuous places in the township through which the road passes; having served notice on the County Commissioners and on the supervisors of Jackson Township:

We met at the time and place appointed and having all three been duly sworn or affirmed according to law, we proceeded to review the road as laid out by the viewers appointed by an order issued Sept., 2nd. 1907; And are of opinion that the road so laid out, is not necessary for a public road, for the following reasons:

First, it appears that only a small portion, to wit; about one fifth part of said road would be of general use, and this particularly by persons residing at a little settlement known as Finland, to go to and return from the Village of Nant-Y-Glo; who already have a public road by which they now reach the same Village, at a point only a short distance from the termini of the proposed road.

Secondly, that owing to the fact that there are already two other public roads, one on either side of the proposed new road, by which the traveling public may pass from points near either end of the proposed road to the opposite end of the same by passing over the roads already open and in general use, either of which will not require them to travel a much greater distance than they would have to travel if the new road were opened.

Thirdly, because the road as laid out by the viewers, is for almost half the distance at the easterly end of the said road crossed by a number of small streams, while the westerly portion of the ^{road} is for about the last two fifths of the distance very spouty or swampy and besides the greater part of the road being through unimproved land it would require much labor and be a great expense to the taxpayers of the township to build and also to maintain, and therefore very burthensome.

For the reasons just stated together with the fact that there is practically no one living along four fifths of the road we are of the

opinion that the road as laid out is not necessary for a public road.

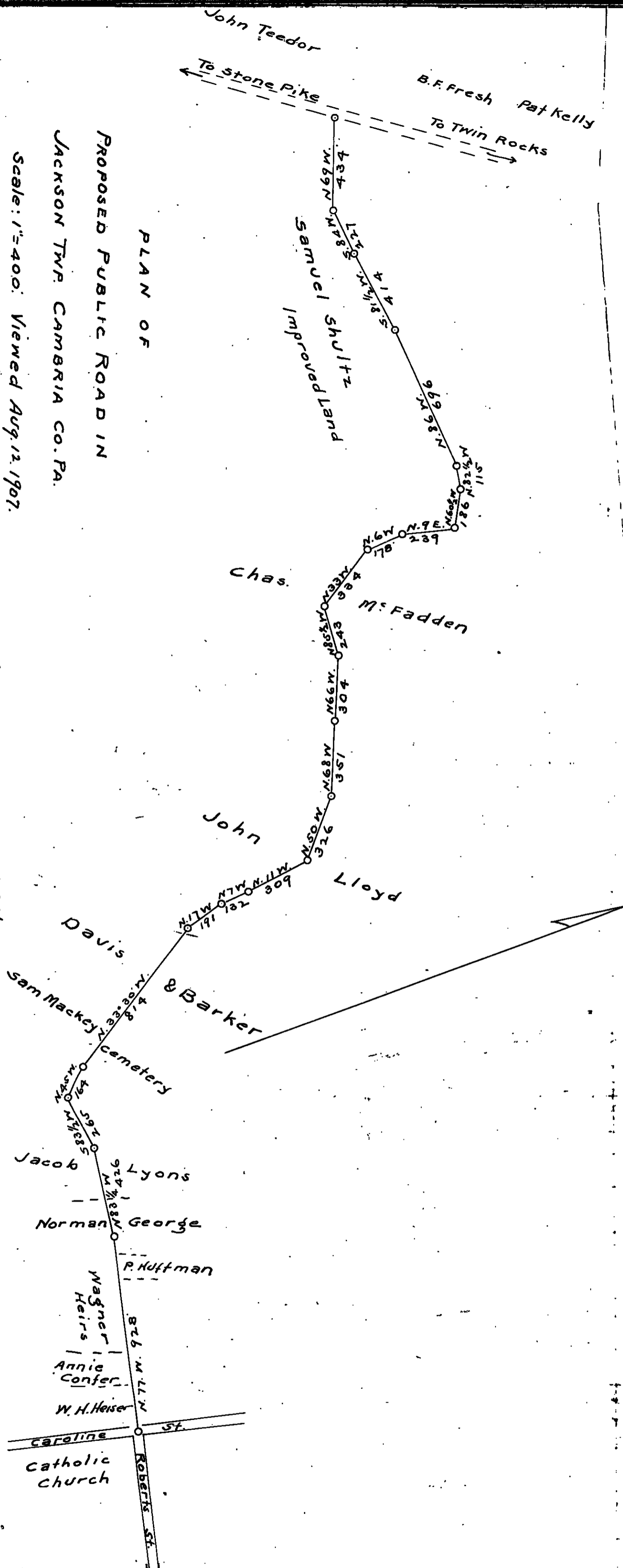
