At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Cambria held at Ebensburg, in the said County, on the 12 day of June A. D. 1912 , before the Honorable Judge of the said Court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the Township of Gallitzin, in the said County, setting forth that they labor under inconvenience for want of a public road or highway, to ~~begin at a point in the Twp. road which leads from Gallitzin to Ashvill~~

~~to begin at a point in the Twp. road which leads from Gallitzin to Ashvill~~
and near the house of Mary Dugnan and ending on the same Public road at a point near the houses of John D. Will and James W. Hannan said road leading from Gallitzin to Ashville near the House of Mary Dignan, thence following the road now opened a distance of about two hundred and fifty ~~sixty~~ yards to a point on the Dignan Hill about one hundred and fifty ft. North of the place where the line of Thomas H. Myers' property crosses said Twp. road; also that p. rtion of said road bginning about three hundred yards South of the barn of Thomas H. Myers; thence along said road to a point opposite the barn of said Thomas H. Myers, also that portion of said road beginning at a point near the houses of Daniel Bluebell; thence along said road to a point near the house of John D. Will and James Hannan.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. The Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

John L. Singer and P. E. Campbell

viewers, to view the ground proposed for said road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be as far as practicable, agreeable to the desires of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."

R E P O R T O F V I E W E R S .

To the Honorable M. B. Stephens, President Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County, Pa., :-

We, the undersigned, members of the Board of Viewers of Cambria County, appointed by your Honorable Court to view certain pieces of road, on the road leading from Gallitzin to Ashville in Gallitzin Township, as noted in the Order of Court hereto attached and to us directed, respectfully report:-

That having give due notice of the view and of the time and place of meeting of the Viewers, to the Commissioners of Cambria County and the Supervisors of Gallitzin Township by having them accept service of notices and to the traveling public by printed handbills posted in public and conspicuous places along the route of the said road; all of us met in accordance with the notices so given and having been first duly qualified according to law to perform the duties of our appointment faithfully, justly and impartially, we proceeded to view the said pieces of road and being of opinion there was occasion for changing parts of the said road at the three several places hereafter more particularly described; we proceeded to lay out three new sections of road intended to supply three separate sections of the said road which we suggest should be vacated, owing to the exceedingly steep grades, which we feel can be lessened by supplying the new sections of road, to a great extent lessened.

The said pieces of road proposed to be vacated take the following courses and distances:- the first and most Northerly section proposed to be vacated beginning at a point 75 ft. S. of a bridge over a small stream, on or adjacent to land of the Altoona

Coal and Coke Co, and running thence S. 4 degrees W. 75 ft., thence S. 18 degrees E. 1550 ft. thence S. 11 1/2 degrees E. 340 ft., the same to be supplied by a piece of road between the same points running from the place of beginning S. 21 1/2 degrees E. 1115 ft., thence S. 18 degrees E. 490 ft., thence S. 4 3/4 degrees W. 375 ft. to the point of ending of the first section of road proposed to be vacated.

Second piece of road proposed to be vacated: Beginning at a point located by running along present Township road from the point last above mentioned, S. 14 degrees E. 950 ft., S. 3 degrees E. 400 ft., S. 14 degrees E. 1225 ft., which said point is located in the public road just South of the residence of Thomas Myers, and the second strip of road proposed to be vacated extending from this point S. 29 degrees E. 400 ft., S. 13 1/2 degrees E. 200 ft. and S. 30 minutes E. 172 ft., thence S. 11 degrees East 75 ft. This section of road to be supplied by a piece of road between the same points. Beginning at the point on the Thomas Myers Property, just above mentioned, running thence S. 45 degrees E. 193 ft. S. 25 degrees E. 400 ft and 11 1/2 degrees E. 508 ft.

Third piece of road proposed to be vacated:- is located by beginning at a point 734 ft. along course last above mentioned from the place of ending of the second piece of road proposed to be supplied and said third piece of road proposed to be vacated extending thence along the same course namely:- S, 11 degrees E. 500 ft., thence S. 3 degrees West 335 ft. to a point in the Township Road just North of the residence of Mary Dignan and this piece of road proposed to be supplied by a strip of road extending between the same points and running from the place of beginning of the last mentioned piece of road S. 17 1/2 degrees E. 500 ft. thence S. 11 1/2 degrees W. 360 ft. to the place of ending of the

third piece of road proposed to be vacated.

Said pieces of road intended to supply the three several pieces suggested to be vacated passing through lands of the Altoona Coal and Coke Company, D. Pluebell, Thomas Myers and Mary Dignana. From the three last mentioned parties over whose improved lands the sections of road as laid out, the Viewers having failed to secure releases of damages, have assessed damages as follows:- to D, Pluebell one hundred and sixty dollars, to Thomas Myers forty dollars and to Mary Dignan Sixty-five dollars and the Altoona Coal and Coke Company through unimproved land, one section of the proposed new road has been laid out, we have assessed them, no damages.

A plot or draft showing the locations of the three separate pieces of road proposed to be vacated as well as the three sections of road suggested to supply the respective parts vacated is hereto attached and made a part of this report.

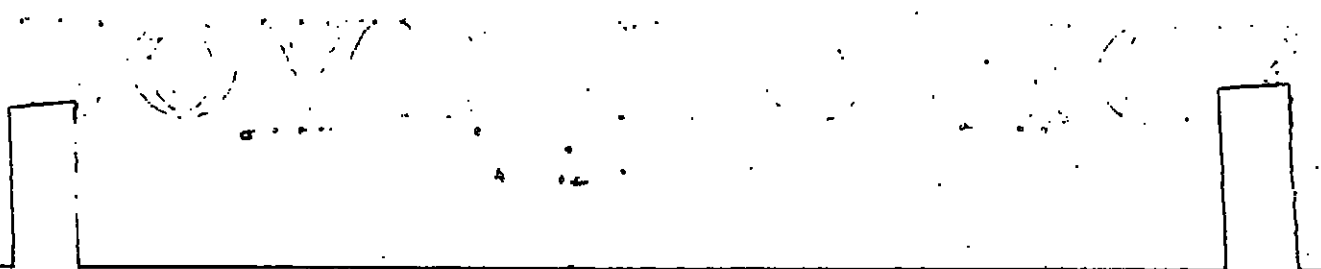

to Ashville, near the house of the said Mary Dignan, thence following
the road now opened a distance of about two hundred and fifty yards
to a point on the Dignan Hill about one hundred and fifty feet North
of the place where the line of Thomas H. Myers' property crosses
said Township Road; also that portion of said road beginning about
three hundred yards South of the barn of Thomas H. Myers; thence
along said road to a point opposite the barn of said Thomas H. Myers;
