At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Cambria held at Ebensburg, in the said County, on the.....11.....day of.....Sept., A. D. 1901, before the Honorable Judge of the said Court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the Townships of Blacklick and Jackson....., in the said County, setting forth that they labor under inconvenience for want of a.....Public.....road or highway to lead from to begin at a point i. the public road leading from the Stone Pike to Nant-y-Glo Chemical Plant at a point on said Road where it touches the south side of the Blacklick and Ebensburg Railroad in Jackson Township, and to end in a public road leading from the Stone Pike to Nant-y-Glo at a point on said road where it crosses the land of "Davis Heirs" about one hundred feet East of Evans Run in Blacklick Township.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. The Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint A. M. Shoemaker.....surveyor, and P. F. Campbell and John L. Singer.....

viewers, to view the ground proposed for said road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be as far as practicable, agreeable to the desires of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."

REPORT OF VIEWERS.

To the Honorable Francis J. O'Connor, President Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions, of Cambria County, Pennsylvania.

We, the undersigned members of the Board of Viewers, appointed by your Honorable Court, as shown by the annexed order, respectfully report:

That, in pursuance of our said appointment, after having given due public notice of the view and of the time and place of meeting of the viewers, by notifying the supervisors of the townships of Jackson and Blacklick and by printed hand bills posted in public and conspicuous places at and near the termini of the proposed new road: we met in accordance with the notice given and having been first duly qualified according to law to perform the duties of our appointment faithfully, We viewed the premises and being of opinion that there is occasion for the proposed new road we proceeded to lay out the same according to the following courses and distances, viz: Beginning in the public road leading from the stone pike to the Nant-Y-Glo Chemical Works, at a point where the same touches the South side of the Ebensburg and Blacklick Branch of the P.R.R., thence crossing the said branch of the P.R.R. and running in Jackson township, North thirty two degrees East two hundred eight feet, thence crossing the South Branch of the Blacklick Creek North thirty nine degrees West one hundred seventy four feet, thence continuing in Blacklick township, North twenty two and one half degree East three hundred and fifty eight feet to a point in the public road leading from Nant-Y-Glo to the Stone Pike and to Ebensburg.

No damages were claimed and the road passing for the whole distance through uncleared land the viewers are of opinion that

no damage will be sustained by the opening of the said road and therefore we have assessed no damages.

A plot or draft showing the location and the courses and distances of the proposed new road is hereto attached and made a part of this report.

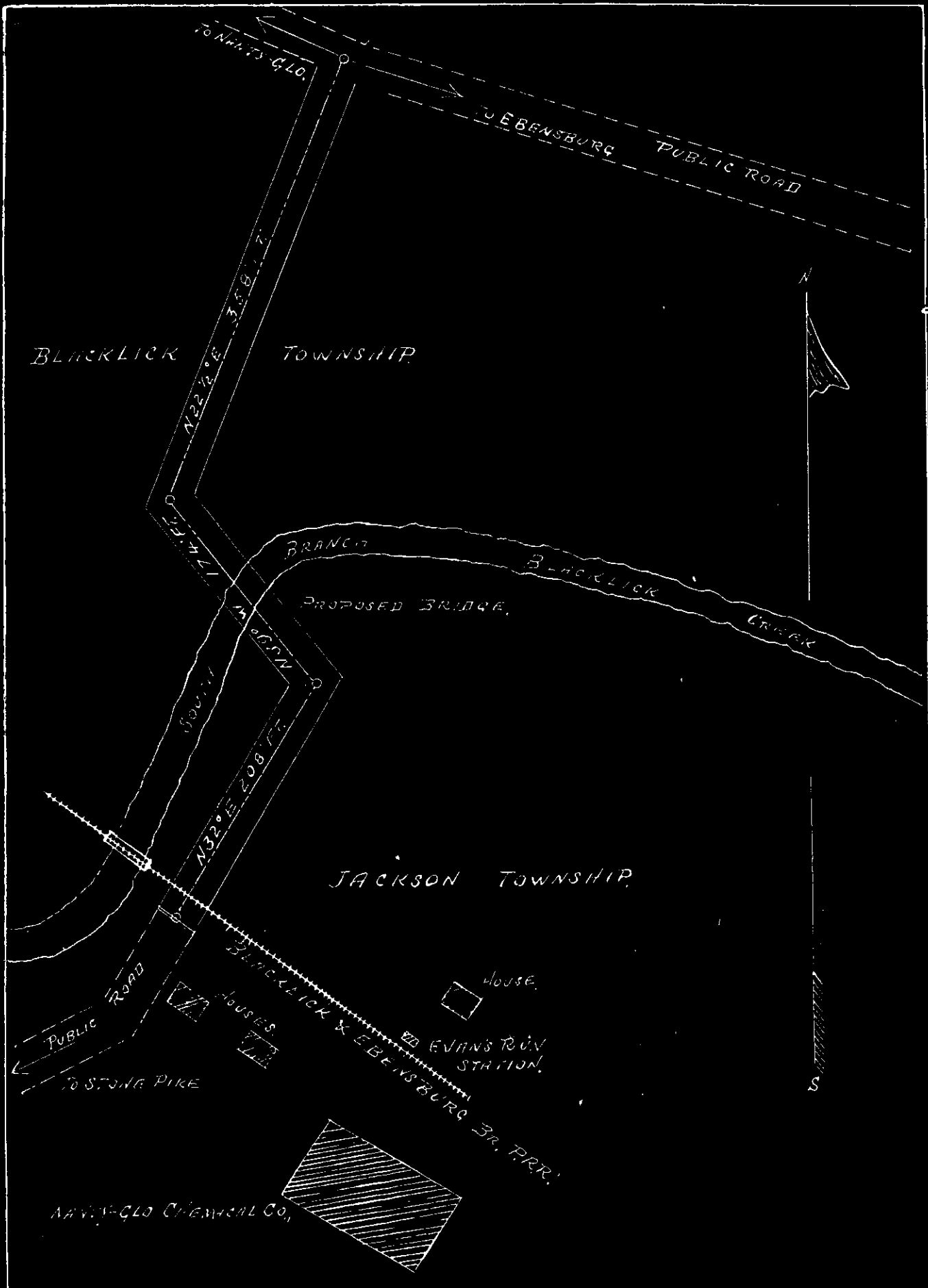
