Your petitioners therefore pray that said road, or part thereof, as aforesaid, beginning at a point on the public road from Allen Lumber to Thorton, at an east line, 926 feet south of the Railroad crossing, and distant thence north 950 feet to public road from the point where the public road from

Allen Timber to Thorton intersects
the said road from Allen Timber to
Thorton, and ending at a point, on said
road from Allen Timber to Thorton,
distant 750 feet from

R E P O R T O F V I E W E R S .

TO THE HONORABLE M. B. STEPHENS, PRESIDENT JUDGE OF THE
COURT OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF CAMBRIA COUNTY:-

We, the undersigned members of the Board of Viewers,
appointed by your Honorable Court to view the ground and deter-
mine as to propriety of vacating and supplying a portion of, a
certain road in Reade Township, Cambria County, Pa., as des-
cribed in the Order of Court hereto attached, respectfully report:

That having given due notice of the view and of the time
and place of meeting of the viewers, to the County Commissio-
ners and to the Supervisors of Reade Township, by having them
accept service of notices, which are hereto, attached and to the
public by printed handbills posted in public and conspicuous
places at and near the site or termini of the piece of road
proposed to be vacated and supplied: All the viewers met in
accordance with the notice so given, and having been first duly
qualified according to law to perform the duties of our appoint-
ment faithfully, impartially and according to the best of
our ability; we viewed the premises and are of opinion that the
prayer of the petitioners should be granted, and the piece of
road beginning at a point on the public road leading from
Fallen Timber to Flinton, at or near an Oak tree approximately
two hundred twenty-six feet ^{more definitely} South of a railroad crossing, and
running thence North thirty-one degrees West five hundred feet
and thence North fifteen degrees West five hundred and seventy-
four feet to a point on the same road some nine hundred and eighty
feet from where the road from Fallen Timber intersects the said
road from Fallen Timber to Flinton, near the premises of
William O'Hara, in said Township, which said piece of road in that
distance twice crosses the Cresson and Irvona Branch of the

Pennsylvania Railroad, should be vacated; and that the said piece of road thus suggested to be vacated ~~to be vacated~~ should be supplied by a piece of road, beginning at the same point as the piece of road suggested to be vacated, near the Oak tree, above referred to, and leading thence North seventeen degrees West eight hundred and seventy-two feet across cleared lands of the Anderson Coal Mining Company and continuing thence North forty-one degrees West over land of the same Company, two hundred and sixteen feet to the point of intersection with the road from Fallen Timber to Flinton where the piece of road proposed to be vacated terminates in the said road: A plot or draft of the said pieces of road proposed to be vacated and proposed to be supplied is hereto attached, made a part of this report and returned for the public use.

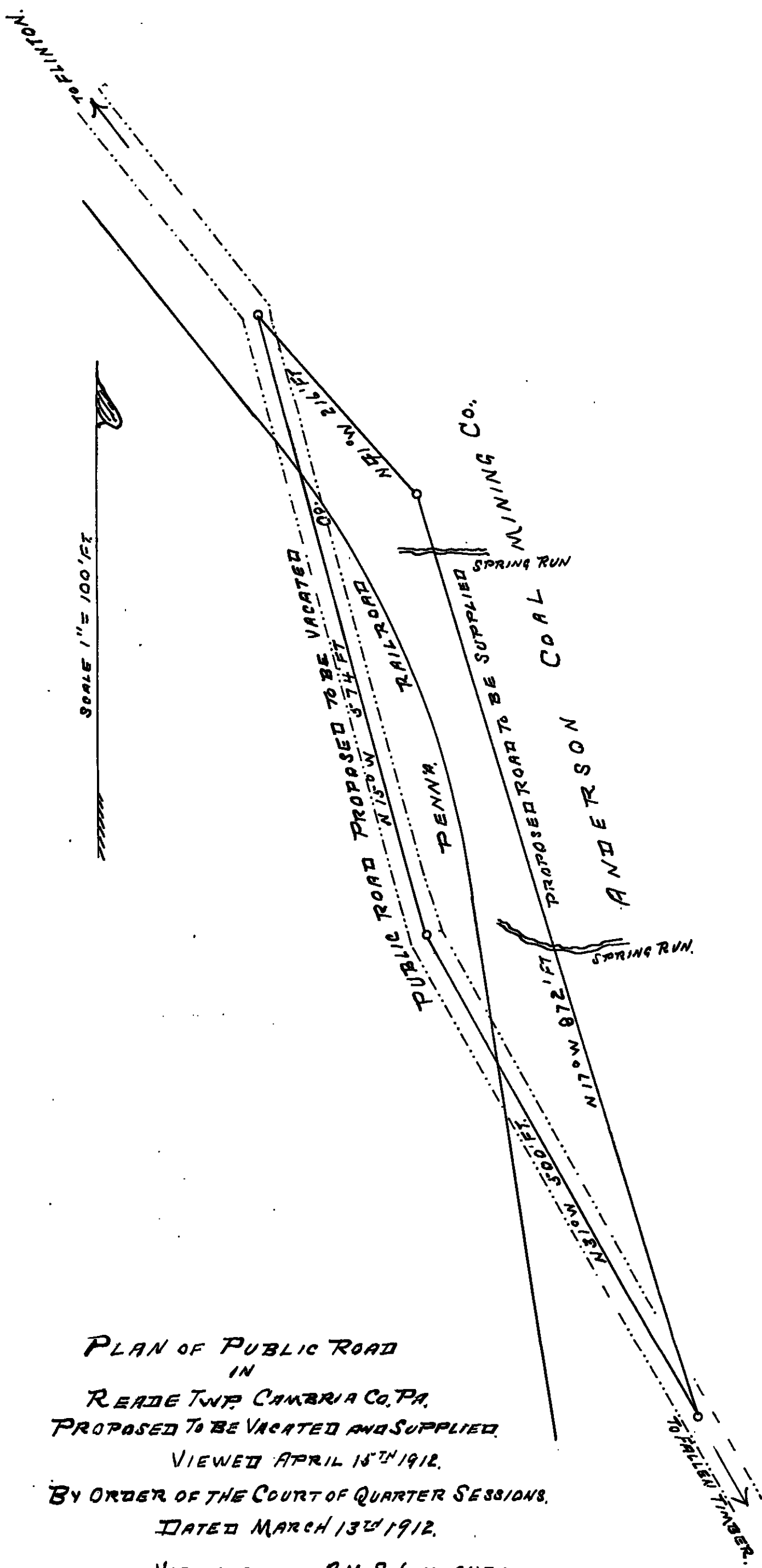

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. The Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint A. M. Shoemaker.....surveyor, and John L. Singer ..P. F. Campbell.....

viewers, to view the ground proposed for said road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be as far as practicable, agreeable to the desires of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."
