Thomas, all residents and citizens of Croyle Township, Cambria County, Pennsylvania, are held and firmly bound unto the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in the sum of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars, lawful money of the United States to which payment well and truly to be made and done, we bind ourselves and each of us, our and each of our heirs, executors and administrators firmly by these presents.

Sealed with our seals and dated the 14 day of September, 1912.

Whereas, the petition of the said inhabitants and citizens of the Township of Croyle, Cambria County, Pennsylvania, has this day been presented to the Court of Quarter Sessions of the said County of Cambria setting forth that a certain public road leading from Summerhill Borough eastwardly to the Frankstown Road at a point 4180 feet from the point where the said road intersects with the said Frankstown Road, said point being also 300 feet in a northerly direction from the barn of W. W. Gable, and ending at a point in the said Frankstown Road 1980 feet from the point where the road leading from South Fork to the said Frankstown Road intersects the said Frankstown Road, the said last mentioned point being 400 feet eastwardly from the lane leading to the barn of Mrs. T. W. Smax, praying the Court in as much as the said road has become useless, inconvenient and burdensome, to appoint viewers to inquire of and vacate said road.

Now The Condition of This Obligation is Such, that the petitioners for the said view, if called upon by the Court, shall make payment of the costs of the said view to the treasury of Cambria County as provided for by law, then this obligation shall be null and void, otherwise to be and remain in full force and virtue.

The Petition of the undersigned, inhabitants of the
Township of Croyle, in the county aforesaid, respectfully sets
forth:-

That a public road has long since been laid out

feet from the point where the said road intersects with the

feet in a Northerly direction from the barn of W. W. Cable;

R E P O R T O F V I E W E R S .

TO THE HONORABLE M. B. STEPHENS, PRESIDENT JUDGE OF THE
COURT OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF CAMBRIA COUNTY, PA:-

We, the undersigned, Members of the Board of Viewers of Cambria County, appointed by your Honorable Court, to view a certain piece of road in Croyle, ^{Township} Cambria County, Pa. for the purpose of determining as to the propriety of vacating the same; said piece of road being more fully described in the order of Court hereto attached, respectfully report:-

That in pursuance of said order, after having given due public notice of the view and of the time and place of meeting of the Viewers to the County Commissioners of Cambria County and to the Supervisors of Croyle Township by having them accept service of notices, and to the traveling public by printed handbills posted in public and conspicuous places at and near the termini of the said road: two of us met in accordance with the notices and adjourned until a later time, when the three of us met together on the grounds for the purpose of view-ing the same and having been first duly qualified according to law to faithfully, impartially and to the best of our ability perform the duties of our appointment, we viewed the premises and are of opinion that the said road by reason of the steep grade, is of little use even to the citizens living along the route of the same and of no general use to the public and therefore should be vacated.

The said road which begins at a point in the road leading from Summerhill to the Frankstown road, near the property of R. Maddison and takes the following courses and distances, S. 41 degrees W. 690 feet, thence S. 69 degrees W. 800 feet, thence S. 46 degrees W. 486 feet, thence S. 16 degrees W. 350 feet, thence S. 22 degrees

W. 265 feet, thence S. 19 degrees 45 minutes W. 1200 feet, thence S. 60 degrees E. 330 feet, to the Frankstown Road, passing through and over properties of R. Maddison, W. Gable, ~~M.~~ L. Myers, G. B. Skelly and B. Mangus; the grade of which said road in many places exceeding twelve and fourteen degrees, which renders the same impracticable as a public thoroughfare, where another route between the same points is already open and having a much better grade which is so in this case and therefore we are of opinion that the same should be vacated.

A plot or draft showing the location of the said road together with its courses and distances, is hereto attached and made a part of this report.

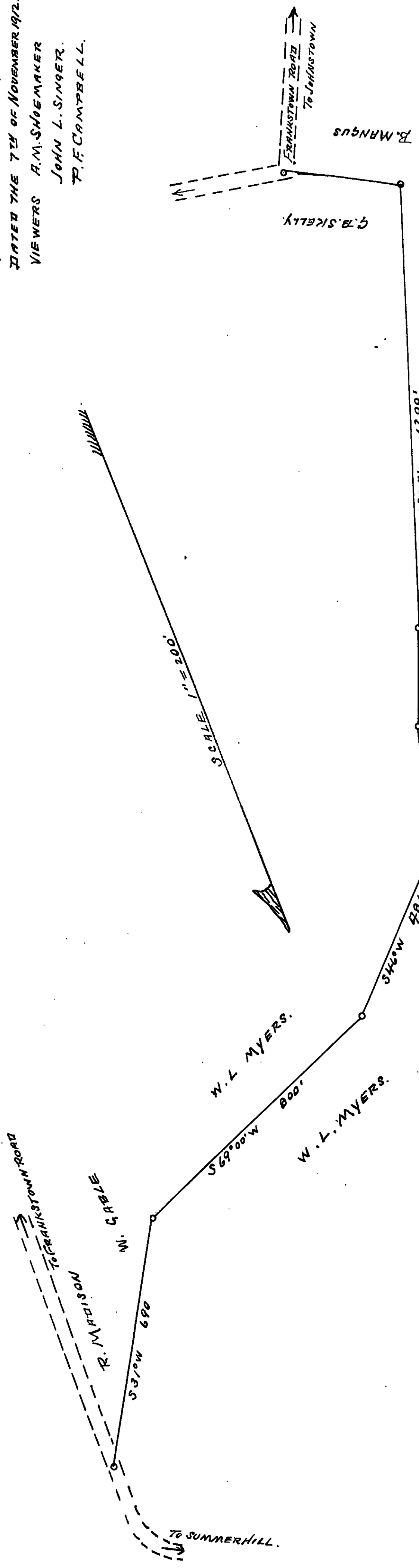

viewers, to view the ground proposed for said road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be as far as practicable, agreeable to the desires of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."
