We, the undersigned members of the Board of Viewers, appointed by your Honorable Court to view a certain piece of public road in Reade Township, this County, as described in the Order of Court hereto attached, for the purposes therein stated, respectfully report:

That having given due notice of the view and of the time and place of meeting of the Viewers, to the County Commissioners and the Supervisors of the Township of Reade by having them accept service of notices, hereto attached, and to the public by printed hand bills posted in public and conspicuous places at and near the termini of the said piece of road: All of us met in accordance with the notice so given, and having been first duly qualified according to law to perform the duties of our appointment faithfully, impartially and to the best of our judgment: We viewed the premises, as noted in the said order, and are of opinion that that part of the said road leading from St. Augustine to Glasgow should be vacated from a point marked "A" on the plot or draft hereto attached and made a part of this report, which is the point where the public road last above referred to intersects with the Cresson and Irvona Branch of the P.R.R. to point marked "B" on the draft just mentioned; Which said piece of road beginning at point "A" above noted runs North 21 degrees East 80 feet to point "B" and that a piece of road should be supplied leading from point "A" on said draft, being the point of intersection of road leading from St. Augustine to Glasgow with the Cresson and Irvona branch of the P.R.R. and running thence North 41 degrees 30 minutes West 330 feet thence North 15 degrees East 50 feet, thence North 71 degrees East 154 feet, crossing through and over lands of the Anderson Coal Mining Co. & Mrs. Isabella Bates to approximately the place of ending as noted on said Order of Court, where the public road from Glasgow

"It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."

R E P O R T O F V I E W E R S .

To the Honorable M. B. Stephens, President Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County:-

We, the undersigned, members of the Board of Viewers, appointed by your Honorable Court to view the site for a proposed bridge over the Blacklick Creek which divides the Townships of Blacklick and Jackson at a point in the Village of Nanty Glo, Cambria County, Pa. where the public Highways leading from the Pittsburg Pike to the Indiana Pike crosses said Creek, respectfully report:

That having given due notice of the view and of the time and place of meeting of the viewers, to the County Commissioners of Cambria County, the Supervisors of the Townships of Jackson and Blacklick by having them accept service of notices hereto attached and to the public by printed hand bills posted in public and conspicuous places near the site of the said bridge, we met ^{in accordance with the notice so given} and having been first duly qualified according to law to perform the duties of our appointment faithfully, impartially and to the best of our judgment; we viewed the premises and are of opinion that a new and larger bridge over the said Blacklick Creek at this point is necessary for the accomodation and convenience of the traveling public and that the expense of erecting and constructing a suitable bridge at this point would require an expenditure of more than is reasonable that the said Townships should be required to bear and therefore recommend that the expense of erecting and constructing the said bridge should be borne by the County of Cambria.

The said Viewers beg leave to suggest that in their opinion the new bridge constructed at this point should be of a width of twenty-five feet, allowing for a driveway of eighteen feet in the clear, a foot path on the Southwesterly side of same of the width of four feet with one foot allowed for a bannister between the driveway and the foot path and one foot on either side of said

proposed bridge for bannisters to protect the traffic in crossing the same, and suggest that the new bridge be located as follows: that the Easterly side of the new bridge should be extended one foot beyond the same side of the present old bridge and that the abuttment on the Easterly side of the South end of the present structure should be moved seven feet toward the creek and the abuttment on the Northerly end of the new bridge should be drawn toward the Creek four feet at the Easterly side and eleven feet at the West side of the North end of the said new bridge and that the same be constructed of iron or steel rather than concrete.

A plot or draft showing the location of the present old bridge and the suggested location of the proposed new structure is hereto attached and made a part of this report.

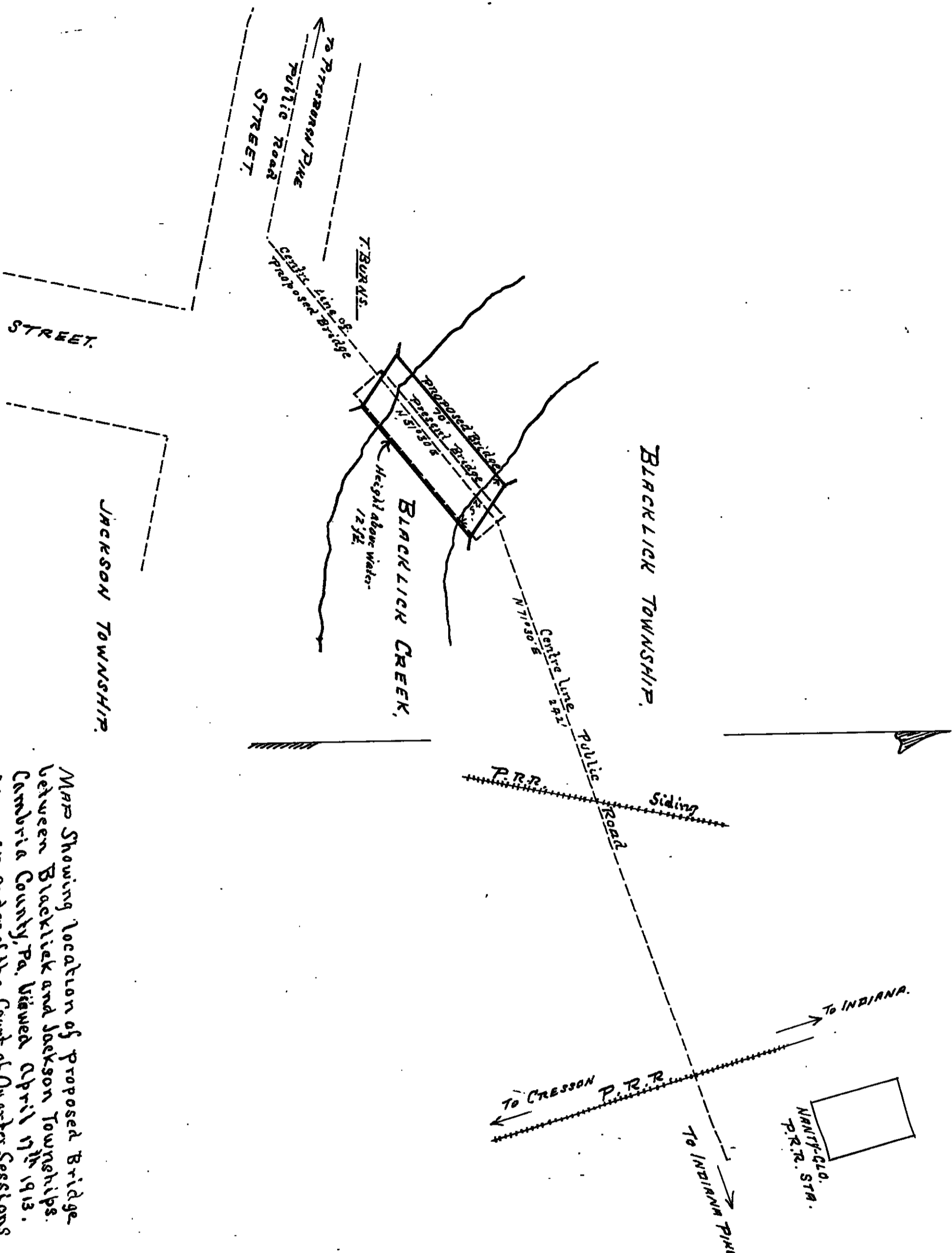
