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Report of Viewers.

To the Honorable, the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County, Pennsylvania,

We, the undersigned members of the board of viewers of Cambria County, appointed by your honorable Court upon the attached order, for the purposes therein set forth, respectfully report:

That having given due notice of the view and of the time and place of meeting of the viewers, to the Commissioners of Cambria County and the Supervisors of Cambria Township by having them accept service of notices and also the Ebensburg Coal Company, and to the traveling public by printed hand bills posted in public and conspicuous places at and near the termini of the proposed road; All of us met at the place appointed according to the notices given and having been first duly qualified according to law to perform the duties of our appointment according to the best of our judgment skill and ability: We viewed the premises and are of opinion that a public road between the points indicated on the attached order of Court is necessary and we have laid out a road between the said points as follows, viz: Beginning at a point on the Carrolltown and Nant-Y-Glo road opposite the mail box of George W. Jervice, located where the road leading past the farm house of said Jervice branches off the said Carrolltown and Nant-Y-Glo Road and running thence North 51 degrees 40 minutes West 395 feet, North 58 degrees East 284 feet, North 48 1/4 degrees East 100 feet, North 44 3/4 degrees East 152 feet, North 38 1/2 degrees East 185 feet, North 28 1/2 degrees East 112 feet, North 22 degrees East 120 feet, North 6 degrees East 410 feet, North 28 degrees East 155 feet, North 12 degrees West 203 feet, North 20 1/2 degrees West 215 feet, North 45 degrees East 323 feet, North 85 1/2 degrees East 452 feet, North 82 1/2 degrees East 285 feet, North 40 1/2 degrees East 183 feet, North 26 1/2 degrees East

The viewers having failed to secure a release of damages, have assessed one hundred dollars damages to the Ebensburg Coal Company; who, in our opinion are the only party who will sustain any damages by reason of the opening and using of the above described road.

At the time of the view of the road referred to in the attached report Alfred Oaks and Nathan Waxler were duly sworn according to law, by one of the viewers, and on oath stated that there were about eleven families living along and in the vicinity of the routh of the proposed new road, as laid out, and that in these eleven families there were more than twelve children of a school age and under.

Further it was brought to our attention that the road as laid out would materially shorten the distance for these children in going to and returning from school: And that some eight of the families living along the proposed new road had no authorized outlet, either public or private, to any public thoroughfare.

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who, of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."
