REPORT OF VIEWERS

We, the undersigned Viewers appointed by the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County, Pennsylvania by its order hereto attached and made a part of this Report issued by the Clerk of Court specificall reciting the all of the inhabitants of the Township of Jackson and a part in the Borough of Nanty-Glo in the Bourough of Nanty-Glo both of the County, state aforesaid that they labor for the want of a public road having used a private road for upwards of twenty-five or more years said road to begin at a point in tyhe Borough of Nanty-Glo on a street known as White Street on the Plan of Burns Addition to the Borough of Nanty-Glo, Plans Nos. 1 and 2, of County Flat book recorded in the Recorder's Office of said county in Flat Book No 2 at page 61, said point of beginning being 439 feet wesr-wardly from the intersection of the said White Street with another accepted street in said Borough known as Roberts Street on said Plan and extending in a westerly direction to a point in Jackson Township marked by a post (said post being located South 5 degrees West 100 feet from the northeatern corner of land of John Kelly) on the eastern line of the property of John Kelly where said property line in inter-acted by the property line of properties of Hulda Deetscreek and Wilmer Deetscreek.

The purpose of the proposed road is to furnish better ingress and egress from properti- ties located along the line of the proposed road.

A certified copy of a resolution by the Supervisors of Jackson Township consenting to and approving the laying out and opening of said proposed road, and a certified copy of a resolution by the Borough Council of Nanty-Glo Borough consenting to the laying out and opening of said proposed roal in the office of the Clerk of Court which were filed concurrantly with the petition for the appointment of Viewers, respectively Report:

That we were duly sworn or affirmed as Members of the Permaneht Board of Viewers of Cambria County, Pennsylvania, as is shown by the Records of the aforesaid Clerk;

that due public notice of the time and place of the view and the meeting of viewers was given by posting of ten handbills at the points of beginning and ending of said highway and along the route of same and by personal service of service on George L. Reade, Esq., Solicitor for the supervisors of Jackson Township who passed resolution approving the laying out of said road and also representing all the abutting owners on said route and have on a separate paper, released the supervisors of said Jackson Township and on John Taylor, Esquire solicitor for the Borough of Nanty-Glo through resolution have approved to said laying out of said road and made a part of this report and acknowledge to have received copy of said notice to view at least ten days before the date of the view.

In pursuance of said Notices of a View all the Viewers met at the point of beginning in said borough together with others on the twenty eight day of January Jan 28, 1955 at 10 o'clock. Due the condition of the road in question and a very heavy snow had fallen since the date of placing the notices we continued indefinitely the day of the view due to extreme winter weather to a undetermined date.

On Friday 11, 1955 at 10 o'clock in the morning after due notice to the parties at interest all of the Viewers met on the proposed extension of street in the borough of Nanty Glo with John Taylor, Esq. with a number of Councilman and with George Reade, Esquire and all the abutting property owners and several supervisors. The snow having melted the course of the road could be seen. It was a private used by these owners and others for at least thirty years or more to two coal mines in use on the Kelly farm. The private road was in fairly good condition. We drove over the proposed road but change the course of a rather severe curve and had but two courses. We saw the necessity of the road since it was used so long as a private road and both the Members of Council as well as the Supervisors of Jackson saw the need of a public highway and its rather extensive use ALL of the Viewers agree that there is necessity for a public highway and we herewith Lay Out the same in accordance with the petitioners and agreement of

the Borough of Nanty-Glo and the Supervisors of Jackson Township as follows:

Beginning at a point on the western terminus of White Street in the Borough of Nanty-Glo, thence South 77° 30' West 440 feet to a point, said point being 39 feet East of the Nanty-Glo Borough line; thence North 84° West 39 feet to the Nanty-Glo Borough line and Jackson Township line; thence through the lands of abutting property owners in Jackson Township North 84° West 961 feet to coal tipple and land of John Kelly, the point of ending. Michael Lanik wanted damages and wanted his lawyer to help in showing his damages that according to the viewers were exorbitant. We fixed Thursday March 17 at 7 o'clock in the municipal Building, Nanty-Glo, as the time and place for the taking of testimony for Michael Lanik. We met according to the agreement and there was a large assemblage there. Mr. Lanik and his father together with Edward Peduzzi, Esq., and several disinterested witnesses called on his part and the Borough Councilmen produced their testimony in charge of John Taylor, Esq. We heard all testimony offered and advised them by agreement of Counsel of both parties and in their presence decided to make an Exhibit of Schedule on March 25, 1955, at 7 o'clock in the evening and the Municipal Building as the place of Exhibit.

Three viewers met after the hearing, and we discussed all the testimony and having been on the ground and the amount of land taken. There was wide difference as to the damages as testified and having taken in consideration all the elements and matters pertinent thereto were discussed and all this was taken into consideration in determining and estimating the amount of damages.

That having viewed said premises and making an inspection of same and hearing all evidence and testimony concerning said real estate and taken into consideration all the elements of damages and benefits accruing to the laying out of said Public Highway and further that the land along said highway opens his land to the sale of lots as well as to all damages and having due regard to and making just allowances for his land taken by virtue of the highway that it crosses same on both sides of his farm, which may result or seem likely to result of the road or highway and its owner, we estimated and determined the amount of

Pursuat to said understanding of the time and place we wet on Friday March the 25, 1955 at the Municipal buinling , NantyOGlo where the aythorites of the Borough wiytheir Counsel appeared and a witness but neither the owner of the land, Michael Lanik nor his Counsels²Edward Peduzzi, Esq. after waiting for awile we exhibeted the Schedule of Damages . An opprunity was entened for the taking of further. We then proceeded to Ehibit the Schedule od Damages. That hearingll exceptions and testimony offered and giving all matters before us due consideration, we are of the opinion that said road as affecting the land of Michael Lanik affected by said laying out a highway or public road and the land taken has been damages , therefore we assess no behefits and damages in the amount of FIFTY (\$50.00) DOLLARS .

That we are of the opinion that the above damages referred to said land be paid th[#] Michael LANIK by the Boroigh of Nanty-Glo as his intetest may appear.

We carefully inspected to property and giving all matters before us due consideration we are of the opinion that the land owner Mike Lanik was damaged in the sum of fifty (\$50.) dollars so we assess damages in that sum to be paid by the Council of Nanty-Glo borough to the aforesaid Mike Lanik.

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass, and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."
