TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGES OF SAID COURT:

The petition of Ralph Fulton, Lido Giovacchini, and Henry Illig, Supervisors of Cambria Township, Cambria County, Pennsylvania, respectfully represents:

1.

That your petitioners are the duly elected, qualified, and acting Supervisors of Cambria Township, Cambria County, a Township of the second class of Cambria County, Pennsylvania.

2.

That the Plan of the Town of Revloc, Township of Cambria, County of Cambria, showing certain streets and alleys, which have been dedicated for public use, has been adopted, approved and recorded in Cambria County Plot Book Volume 3 at Page 185.

3.

That your petitioners have been requested by the abutting property owners on Penn Avenue in the Town of Revloc, beginning at a point on the southerly end of Fifth Street, and running by a curve in a southerly and westerly direction a distance of 900 feet, more or less, to Seventh Street extended, to take over said street, so that it may become the subject of maintenance and repair of the said Township of Cambria.

That your petitioners consider it to be the duty and obligation of the Township of Cambria to comply with the said request, and have so indicated by adopting a Resolution, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part of this petition.

Your petitioners therefore pray your Honorable Court to approve the taking over of the said street, and direct that this petition and Decree

of Court be recorded in the Road Docket of Cambria County.

RESOLUTION

On motion of Henry Illig, duly seconded and carried, the following Resolution was unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, a street fifty feet in width, known as Penn Avenue, has heretofore been dedicated as a public highway in the Town of Revloc, Township of Cambria and State of Pennsylvania in accordance with the map of Monroe Coal Mining Company, which is recorded in Cambria County in Plot Book Volume at Page ; and

WHEREAS, the abutting property owners on Penn Avenue, beginning at a point on the Southerly end of Fifth Street and running by a curve in a southerly and westerly direction, a distance of 900 feet, more or less, to Seventh Street extended, have requested the Township of Cambria through their Board of Supervisors to take over said Avenue, so that the same would be subject to maintenance and repair by the said Township; and

WHEREAS, the Supervisors of Cambria Township consider it to be the obligation of the Township to comply with the request of the abutting property owners; and

WHEREAS, the plan showing said street has been adopted, approved, and recorded.

BE IT RESOLVED, that with the consent of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County, the Supervisors of Cambria Township, in behalf of said Township, hereby accept as a public highway the said Penn Avenue, beginning at a point on the Southerly terminus of Fifth Street, and extending in a westerly direction a distance of nine hundred feet, more or less, to the Southerly extension of Seventh Street as shown on said Plan of Revloc.
