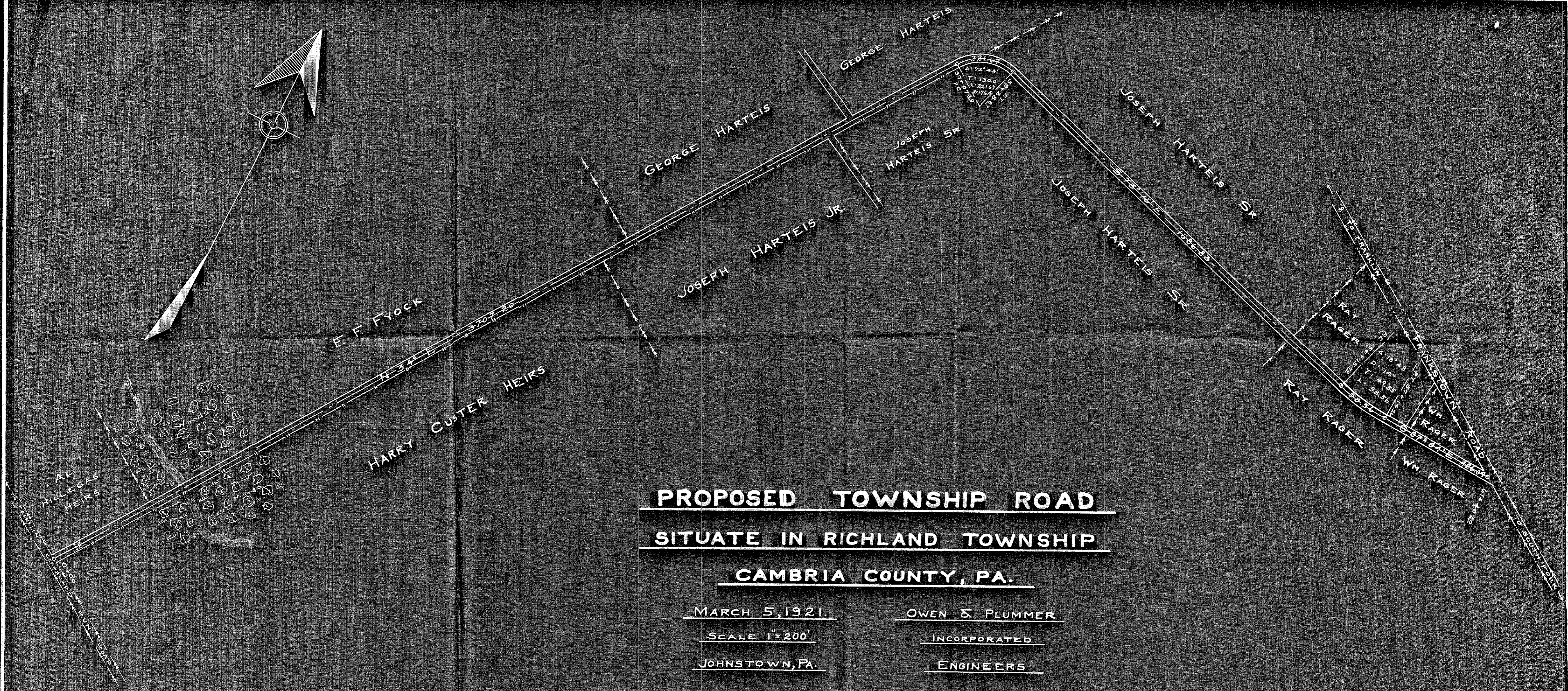

reason the proceedings should be recalled

of the report of Viewers and the cost of the
proceedings to be paid by the obligors then
the foregoing obligation to be void
otherwise the same shall be in full force

Sessions of Cambria County:

The petition of the undersigned inhabitants of the Township of Richland, County aforesaid, and respectfully represents:

That they are greatly inconvenienced for want of a public highway beginning at a point, in the Township of Richland, on the public road, known as the Clapboard Run Road distant two thousand one hundred and seventy (2,175) feet from its junction with another public highway, known as the Frankstown Road, the nearest intersecting highway and ending at a point, in the Township of Richland, on a public highway, known as the Conemaugh Road, at a point, in the Township of Richland, distant from its junction with the said Frankstown Road one thousand three hundred and twenty (1,320) feet.

The termini and the entire proposed road being in the Township of Richland, aforesaid, County of Cambria, Pa.

Your petitioners therefore pray the Court to appoint three persons qualified according to law, to view the ground proposed for such road, and, if they see occasion, lay out the same, and make report of their proceedings to the next term of this Court.

Report of Viewers

TO THE HONORABLE JUDGES of the above named Court:

We, the undersigned viewers appointed by the above Court to view the ground proposed for a new road starting at a point on the Clayboard Run and ending at a point on the township road known as the Conemaugh Road all within Richland Township and determine the necessity for such road, respectfully report;

That we were duly sworn or affirmed as members of the permanent board of viewers as shown by the records of the Court; that due public notice of the time and place of the meeting of the Viewers was given all interested parties by publication in the Johnstown Tribune and by hand-bills posted on the premises at least ten days prior to the time of making said view. Attached to this report are notices published and posted aforesaid. That we met upon the premises according to the notice on the third day of March A.D. 1921 at ten o'clock A.M. and proceeded with the duties of our appointment. That after viewing the ground for the proposed new road, we were of the opinion that the proposed new road would be a great convenience and aid to the township people and that the new road should be laid out. That we proceeded to lay out the new road having respect to the best ground for the road and in such a manner as to maintain a minimum grade and also to do the least injury to private property and as far as practicable agreeable to the desires of the petitioners; that the road was laid out according to the best engineering practice and a plan showing the design of the road was attached to and made a part of this report.

We are of the opinion that the proposed road as laid out on the ground and as shown on the plan would be an aid and a convenience to the township inhabitants in their daily work.

Therefore, we are of the opinion that the prayer of the petitioners should be granted and the new road be granted as a public road.

7 March Approved by Board of Supervisors at City Mt. 4 years 1921 confirmed March 2, 1921

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereon signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is best ground for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the occasion for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."
