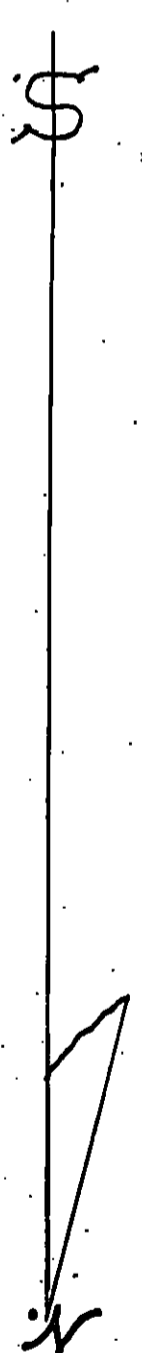

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Cambria held at Ebensburg, in the said County, on the 12th day of February A. D. 1923, before the Honorable Judge of the said Court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the Township of Jackson, in the said County, setting forth that they labor under inconvenience for want of a road or highway to head from vacation and supply of road.

That a public road has long since been laid out and opened in the said Township of Jackson, beginning at a point on the Vintondale Road, exactly six thousand three hundred and twelve (6312) feet from the William Penn Highway, the said William Penn Highway being the nearest intersecting road already opened, and extending from said point a distance of five hundred and twenty (520) feet, being a portion of what is known as the Vintondale Road, and the last mentioned terminus of said five hundred and twenty (520) feet, being exactly eleven thousand five hundred and fifty (11,550) feet from the intersection of the said Vintondale Road with the Twin Rocks Road, the said Twin Rocks Road being the nearest intersecting road from the last mentioned terminus of the said five hundred and twenty (520) feet of road. That the above mentioned five hundred and twenty (520) feet of said Vintondale Road has become useless, inconvenient and burdensome and there would be much improvement if, instead of following the course as covered by the said five hundred and twenty (520) feet, the said five hundred and twenty feet should be vacated and there should be supplied instead thereof a road running from the last mentioned terminus of said five hundred twenty feet a distance of six hundred and twenty-one (621) feet back to the said Vintondale Road, which last mentioned point is a distance of exactly five thousand nine hundred and eighty-six (5986) feet from the intersection of the said William Penn Highway with the said Vintondale Road, which William Penn Highway is the nearest intersecting road.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. The Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

viewers, to view the ground proposed for said road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be as far as practicable, agreeable to the desires of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.

PETITION TO VACATE AND SUPPLY ROAD

TO THE HONORABLE JUDGES OF THE ABOVE NAMED COURT:

The petition of the undersigned supervisors of Jackson Township, Cambria County, Pennsylvania, and residents and tax payers of said Township respectfully represents:

That a public road has long since been laid out and opened in the said Township of Jackson, beginning at a point on the Vintondale Road, exactly six thousand three hundred and twelve (6312) feet from the William Penn Highway, the said William Penn Highway being the nearest intersecting road already opened, and extending from said point a distance of five hundred and twenty (520) feet, being a portion of what is known as the Vintondale Road, and the last mentioned terminus of said five hundred and twenty (520) feet, being exactly eleven thousand five hundred and fifty (11,550) feet from the intersection of the said Vintondale Road with the Twin Rocks Road, the said Twin Rocks Road being the nearest intersecting road from the last mentioned terminus of the said five hundred and twenty (520) feet of road. That the above mentioned five hundred and twenty (520) feet of said Vintondale Road has become useless, inconvenient and burdensome and there would be much improvement if, instead of following the course as covered by the said five hundred and twenty (520) feet, the said five hundred and twenty feet should be vacated and there should be supplied instead thereof a road running from the last mentioned terminus of said five hundred twenty feet a distance of six hundred and twenty-one (621) feet back to the said Vintondale Road, which last mentioned point is a distance of exactly five thousand nine hundred and eighty-six (5986) feet from the intersection of the said William Penn Highway

R E P O R T O F V I E W E R S .

To the Honorable, the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of
Cambria County, Pennsylvania.

We, the undersigned members of the board of viewers of Cambria county, appointed by your honorable Court upon the attached order and therein directed to view and determine as to the propriety of vacating and supplying a certain piece of public road in the township of Jackson, Cambria Co., Pa., as specified in said attached order, respectfully report:

That having given due notice of the view and of the time and place of meeting of the viewers to the Commissioners of Cambria County, and the Supervisors of the Township of Jackson; and having them accept service of notices hereto attached; and to the traveling public by printed hand bills posted in public and conspicuous places at and near the termini of the pieces of road to be viewed, and each having been duly sworn according to law to perform the duties of our appointment faithfully, impartially and to the best of our judgment and ability: all of us met in accord with the notices so served and posted as aforesaid and having gone over the premises carefully and viewed the same we are all of the opinion that the prayer of the petitioners should be granted and the piece of road; a plot or draft of which is hereto attached and made a part of this report; shown on said attached draft between points "A" and "B" should be vacated and that portion as shown between points "B" and "C" should be supplied.

The portion of road recommended to be vacated extends South ten degrees two minutes West 529 feet, from the point designated, on the attached order, on the road leading from the Philadelphia-
to Indiana
Pittsburgh Turnpike, via. Wagner's School and Wherum/and to supply a piece of road extending South fourteen degrees ten minutes East, from the point of ending of the portion of road to be vacated, six hundred nineteen feet to the other point designated on said order on said road leading to Indiana.

The land through and over which the piece of roadas laid out passes is rough and unimproved and the viewers estimate that no damages will be sustained by the owners of the land by reason of the vacating and supplying of the pieces of road as above specified.
