IN RE: Petition to vacate portion of public road in the Township of Clearfield, Cambria County, Pennsylvania, beginning at a point in the road from Dysart to Ebensburg and the Philipsburg Pike, at a point three thousand (3000) feet from the road leading from Condron to Ebensburg and the Philipsburg Pike, and extending in an Easterly direction, to the Township of Dean, a distance of five thousand (5000) feet.

TO THE HONORABLE THE JUDGES OF SAID COURT:

The petition of the undersigned, being inhabitants and property owners of the Township of Clearfield, County of Cambria and State of Pennsylvania, respectfully represents:

That there is in said Township a public road running from Dysart to Ebensburg and the Philipsburg Pike; that a petition of inhabitants of said Township was presented and filed on the 18th of September, 1924, to No. 4 September Sessions, 1924, praying that a certain portion of the said public road beginning at a point in the road from Dysart to Ebensburg and the Philipsburg Pike, at a point three thousand (3000) feet from the road leading from Condron to Ebensburg and the Philipsburg Pike, and extending in an Easterly direction to the Township of Dean, a distance of five thousand (5000) feet, be vacated.

That Viewers were appointed by your Honorable Court and, after due advertisement, viewed the said road, and have filed their report, recommending that the same be vacated.

That although said road is not extensively used by the traveling public, it is used frequently by certain of the public, who would be inconvenienced by its vacation.

That a portion of the road recommended to be vacated is occupied by a permanent bridge erected by the Commissioners of Cambria County, the center line of said bridge being the dividing line

between Clearfield and Dean Townships, and that the life of said bridge, without any repairs other than the re-planking, will extend for many years.

That the day advertised for the view was a wet, rainy day, and a number of inhabitants who had intended to be present and testify before the Viewers, and actually did go on the ground, missed the Viewers because of the condition of the weather.

That the vacation of the said portion of said road will be injurious and inconvenient to your petitioners, as well as others of the travelling public:

R E P O R T O F V I E W E R S .

To the Honorable, the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of
Cambria County, Pennsylvania.

We, the undersigned members of the Board of Viewers of Cambria county, appointed by your honorable Court upon the attached order, and therein directed to view and determine as to the necessity for retaining a certain piece of public road; between the termini therein specified; in Clearfield Township, said county and state; as a public road: respectfully report;-

That having given due notice of the view and of the time and place of meeting of the viewers to the Commissioners of Cambria County and the Supervisors of Clearfield Township, and having them accept service of notices hereto attached, and to the traveling public by printed hand bills posted in public and conspicuous places at and near the termini of the piece of road to be viewed; and having each been first duly sworn according to law to perform the duties of our appointment faithfully, impartially and to the best of our judgment and ability:

All of us met, in accord with the notices given, and having gone over and carefully viewed the premises and are all of the opinion that the piece of road referred to in the aforesaid order is no longer necessary for a public road and therefore recommend that it be vacated.

Said piece of road, a plot or draft of which is hereto attached and made a part of this report, takes the following courses and distances between the termini specified in the attached order, viz: Beginning at the center of the Clearfield Creek, on the line between the townships of Dean and Clearfield and extending thence S. 82° W. 134 ft., S. 46° W. 329 ft., S. 4° E. 427 ft., S. 22° W. 92 ft., S. 81° W. 398 ft., S. 74° 30' W. 109 ft., S. 44° 30' W. 359 ft., S. 30° W. 343 ft., S. 23° W. 564 ft., S. 45° 15' W. 105 ft., S. 83° 30' W. 142 ft., N. 85° 30' W. 268 ft., S. 85° 30' W. 346 ft., S. 47° 30' W. 202 ft., S. 78° W. 134 ft., N. 70° 30' W. 200 ft., S. 84° 30' W. 262 ft., N. 84° 40' W. 831 ft. and N. 78° 30' W. 185 ft., to the opposite termini, at the road leading from the cross roads West of Condron Station to Fallen Timber.

We, the undersigned members of the Permanent Board of Viewers of Cambria County, appointed by your honorable Court upon the attached order and therein directed ^{re-}to view and determine as to the necessity for a public road between the termini specified in said order, respectfully report:-

That having given due notice of the review and of the time and place of meeting of the reviewers to the Commissioners of Cambria county and the Supervisors of the Township of Clearfield, and having them accept service of notices hereto attached, and to the traveling public by printed hand bills posted in public and conspicuous places at and near the termini of the piece of road to be reviewed; and having been first duly qualified according to law to perform the duties of our appointment faithfully, impartially and to the best of our judgment and ability:

We (Adam Shuman not appearing) met upon the bridge at the North-easterly termini of the piece of road to be viewed, in accord with the notices given, and having gone over and carefully viewed the road and then adjourned to the 27th. day of December to meet at the Court House in Ebensburg to give all parties interested an opportunity to be heard, of which adjourned meeting all parties had due notice and appeared either in person or by their attorneys and were heard.

During the view and the hearing the viewers found that the piece of road in question is approximately one mile long.

That for some time past very little money has been expended on the road to put it in shape for traffic.

That the road has been very little used for some time past.

That the road is considerably less than the average in width and that in order to widen the narrow part of said road which extends for about one thousand feet or more, even to a width of fourteen feet would be very expensive and not justified.

That the narrow part of the road is rocky, steep and dangerous and would practically be impossible to work with ordinary road machinery and even to ditch the upper side of a nine foot road would undoubtedly require a great deal of blasting and expense.

That at the date of the hearing there was one family living along this piece of road who is a miner by occupation and has been a tenant on the Paddy Madden farm since the 16th. day of December, 1924,

That the public generally does not use the greater part of the road and only two or three individuals use more than the first hundred and fifty feet south west of the line between Dean and Clearfield townships.

That the first hundred and fifty feet from the center of the bridge over the Clearfield Creek, which is the line between Dean and Clearfield Townships and the North Easterly terminus of the piece of road in question and which leads to a community base-ball park is necessary for the convenience of a great many going to and from said park and for the convenience of some thirty to forty others who use this portion of said road almost daily in going to and from their work.
