

R E P O R T O F V I E W E R S .

To the Honorable, the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of
Cambria County, Pennsylvania.

We, the undersigned members of the Board of Viewers of Cambria county, appointed by your honorable Court upon the attached order and therein directed to view and determine as to the necessity for a certain piece of public road in Susquehanna Township, Cambria County, Pennsylvania, between the terminal points more particularly specified in the said attached order of the court, dated the 13th. day of April, 1925, respectfully report:

That having given due and legal notice of the view and of the time and place of meeting of the viewers to the Commissioners of Cambria County, and the Supervisors of the Township of Susquehanna and having them accept service of notices hereto attached, and to the traveling public by having ~~the same~~ printed hand bills posted in public and conspicuous places at and near the termini and in the vicinity thereof; and having been first duly sworn according to law to perform the duties of our appointment faithfully, impartially and according to the best of our judgment and ability all of us met in accord with the notices so given and served. We carefully went over, surveyed the route between the termini along what appeared to us to be the most practical route and in accord with the desire of the petitioners present and having viewed the same and other roads in the vicinity thereof and made a careful survey of the demand and the necessity for such a road and we are unanimously of the opinion that the road, ~~is~~ between the termini specified is not necessary for the accomodation of the traveling public generally nor the inhabitants of that particular locality.

The route of the road as viewed and surveyed between the termini specified in the attached order, and which is more clearly shown on a plot or draft hereto attached and made a part of this report, takes the following courses and distances, viz: Beginning at the terminus on the public road leading from Plattsville to Lantzy's Mills and running thence through and over land of Michael Kline N. 46° W. 234

ft., and N. 47°30' W. 351 ft. and thence crossing a corner of land of Mrs. Julia Woodford to land of William Lloyd N. 66°W. 259 ft. and on land of said Lloyd N. 60° 15' W. 207 ft., N. 20° W. 586 ft., N. 18° 30' E. 900 ft., N. 12° E. 90 ft., N. 20° W. 274 ft., N. 22° W. 152 ft. N. 8° W. 131 ft., thence crossing on to lands of Frank Yonkeski N. 3° E. 660 ft., N. 7° E. 554 ft., N. 4° 30' E. 286 ft., N. 4° 30' W. 556 ft., and N. 13° 45' W. 193 ft., thence over land of the estate of Henry Dunlap, deceased, N. 22° W. 262 ft., N. 24° 15' W. 259 ft., N. 45° W. 872 ft. and N. 73° W. 792 ft. to the other termini specified on said attached order.

The termini of the proposed new road specified as being on the public road leading from Plottsville to Cherrytree, at a point eleven hundred feet Southward from the intersection of said last mentioned road with another road leading from East Ridge, near the Isaac West-over farm, as claimed not to be the termini on that road which was represented to many of the petitioners as the point of ending of the proposed road, which said road if laid out and opened would necessitate the expenditure of many thousands of dollars and would accommodate only a very few people and would be of particular advantage to only two or three families and the viewers feel the necessity for the road would by no means justify the expenditure necessary to construct and maintain it.

viewers, to view the ground proposed for said road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be as far as practicable, agreeable to the desires of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."

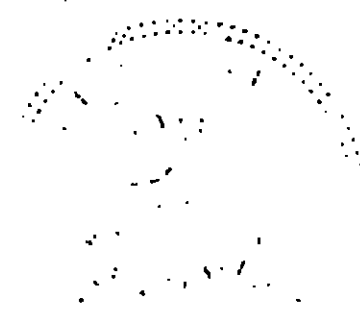
