REPORT OF VIEWERS.

We, the undersigned Viewers appointed by the annexed order of the above Court, to View for the purpose of laying out a public road beginning at intersection of Maple Street on the Plan of Oakmont with Beech Avenue and ending at a point on the State Aid Township Road leading from the Seventeenth Ward of the City of Johnstown, Pennsylvania to Geistown, respectfully report:-

That we were duly sworn or affirmed as members of the permanent board of Viewers of Cambria County as shown by the Records of said Court, give due public notice of the time and place of meeting of said Viewers by hand bills posted on the premises and by notices served on the Commissioners of Cambria County and upon George E. Golfe, Esq., Solicitor for the Supervisors of the Township of Richland, all of whom accepted service at least ten days prior to the time of making of said View, evidence of which is shown by copies of said notices hereto attached and made a part of this report and by publication in the Johnstown Tribune and in the Cambria County Legal Journal; that we met upon the premises according to notice as above given on Tuesday, May 19, A. D. 1925 at 9:30 o'clock A. M. for the purpose of performing the duties of our appointment.

That we Viewed the site and locality of the road proposed to be laid out, making a personal inspection of the ground between the points designated in the petition and order.

There being present at the view a number of citizens and persons interested in said proposed road, all of them being tax payers of the Township of Richland.

A Hearing was held with reference to the proposed road and by agreement between the parties interested, said hearing was held in the Viewers Rooms on May 22, A. D. 1925 at 10:00 o'clock P. M. for the purpose of hearing evidence with reference to the proposed road, the Supervisors of the Township being opposed to the laying out of a new road. The testimony as adduced was of such a character that the Board of Viewers were of the opinion that they should be given more time for the purpose of further investigating the situation as it developed in the hearing.

Pursuant to such opinion there was accordingly presented to the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions the Petition asking for Extension of time to file Report of Viewers from the first Monday of June Sessions of the Court of Quarter Sessions A. D. 1925 to the first Monday of September Sessions A. D. 1925 of the Court aforesaid. The prayer of which the Court granted, extending the time for the filing the report of the Viewers as prayed for.

The Viewers again viewed the site and locality of the road proposed to be laid out, making a personal inspection of the points designated to be laid out making a personal inspection of the grounds between the points designated in the Petition and order.

We are of the opinion and agree that a public road between the points mentioned is necessary and that we authorize the laying out of the road according to the accompanying draft. We therefore lay out and return for public use a road as follows:-

BEGINNING at a point on the State Aid Highway leading from Moxham to Geistown; thence along said Laurel Avenue South Fifty-one (51) degrees Six (6) minutes East Three Hundred Twenty (320) feet to a point; thence South Four (4) degrees West Three and 28/100 (3.28) feet to a point; thence South Fifty-one (51) degrees Six (6) minutes East along what is known as Laurel Avenue, a distance of Seven Hundred Eight and 8/10 (708.8) feet to a point on Laurel Avenue; thence through lot No. 44 on the Plas as shown on Arbutus Park, Woodland Section Plan of Lots North Thirty-eight (38) degrees Fifty-four (54') minutes East, a distance of Two Hundred Twenty (220) feet to Maple Street; thence by Maple Street North Twenty-four (24) degrees Twenty-five (25) minutes East Eight Hundred (800) feet to the ending at the intersection of Beech Avenue on the Oakmont Plan of Lots now a Township Highway.

.We further report that we endeavored to obtain from the owners of the land upon which the said road is located, which affects Lot No. 44 hereinabove mentioned, releases of the damages which may occur or seem likely to occur by reason of such location. We were unable to secure such release, therefore we allow no damages because we consider the advantages which will accrue to their respective properties by reason of the road are greatly in excess to all damages which will be sustained by them.

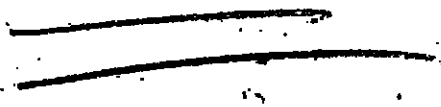

It be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons-over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal; review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."
