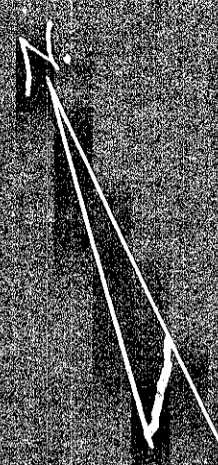

REPORT OF VIEWERS.

To the Honorable, the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of
Cambria County, Pennsylvania.

We, the undersigned members of the Board of Viewers of Cambria County, appointed by your honorable Court upon the attached order and therein directed to view and determine as to the propriety of vacating a certain piece of public road in Allegheny Township, Cambria County, Pennsylvania, between the termini specified in said order, which is hereto attached, respectfully report:

That having given due notice of the view and of the time and place of meeting of the viewers, to the Commissioners of Cambria County, to the Supervisors of the township of Allegheny and to the traveling public by printed hand bills posted in public and conspicuous places at and near the termini of the piece of road proposed to be vacated, and having been each duly sworn according to law to perform the duties of our appointment faithfully, impartially and to the best of our judgment and ability; all of us met at the time and place appointed, in accord with the notices so given and served, and having gone over and carefully viewed the piece of road proposed to be vacated, the other roads in that vicinity which will accommodate practically all of the traffic which has hitherto been using the piece of road in question, and are unanimously of the opinion that the piece of road described in the attached order; a plot or draft of which is hereto attached and made a part of this report; should be vacated.

Said piece of road recommended to be vacated takes the following courses and distances, viz: Beginning at a point of the public road leading from Chest Springs to Ashville, 178 feet westward from the juncture of the St. Augustine-Ashville road with the Chest Springs - Ashville road which juncture is at a point about three hundred eighty feet West from the iron bridge at Ashville Borough; and extending thence South 24° West 88 feet, South 33° West 167 feet, South 3° East 108 feet, South 13° West 415 feet, South 01° 30' West 713.5 feet, South 21° 40' West 303 feet, South 51° West 235.5 feet, South 70° West 491 feet, South 86° West 517.4 feet, South 87° 15' West 233 feet, South

82° West 185 feet and South 69° West 644 feet to the opposite termini on the road leading to the Ivory Farm, of which this is a part.

By reason of the abandonment of the Independent School, which was located along this piece of road and the construction of another and better way into the borough of Ashville the above described piece of road has become unnecessary for the accomodation of the public.

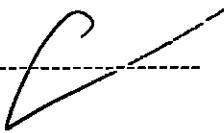

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."

TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGES OF THE ABOVE NAMED COURT:

The petition of the undersigned inhabitants of the Township of Allegheny, in the County of Cambria and State of Pennsylvania, respectfully represents:

That many years ago a public road was laid out and opened in said Township beginning at a point on the road leading from Chest Springs to Gallitzin at the Ivory farm, and ending at a point on the road leading from Chest Springs to Ashville one hundred twenty-five feet west of the intersection of said Chest Springs-Ashville road with the road leading from Ashville to St. Augustine.

That a portion of said public road has become useless, inconvenient and burdensome to the inhabitants of said township by reason of the heavy grades therein and the difficulty to keep the same in proper repair for travel, as well as by reason of the fact that the public has ceased to use the same.

That the portion of said public road which has become useless, inconvenient and burdensome is described as follows: The same begins at a point two miles distant from the intersection of the road leading from Chest Springs to Gallitzin with the road leading from said Chest Springs-Gallitzin road to Ashville, at the Ivory farm, and ends at a point on the road leading from Chest Springs to Ashville one hundred twenty-five feet west of the intersection of said Chest Springs-Ashville road with the road leading from Ashville to St. Augustine.
