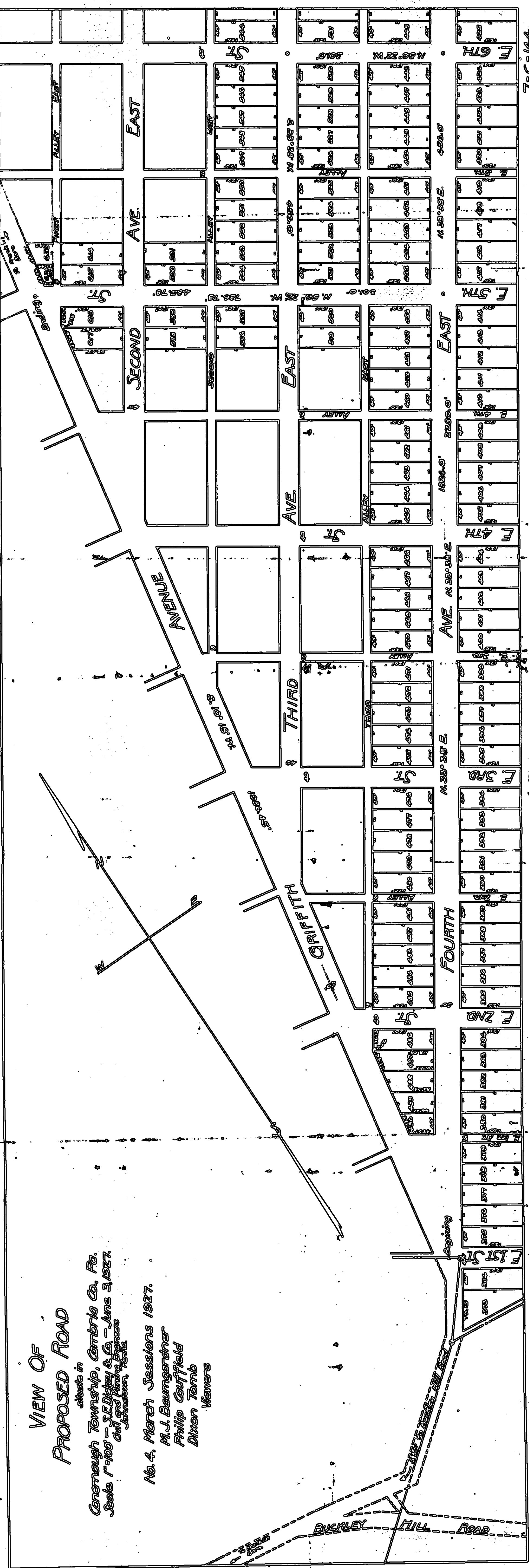

In the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County

To the Honorable, the Judges of said Court:

The petition of the undersigned inhabitants of the Township of Conemaugh, Cambria County, Pennsylvania, respectfully represents:

That they labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road or highway beginning in the said Township of Conemaugh at a point four hundred (400) feet from the intersection of Griffith Avenue (a township road) with the Buckley Hill road, (also a township road); thence along Fourth Avenue a distance of twenty-two hundred (2200) feet to Sixth Street; thence along Sixth Street a distance of three hundred (300) feet to Third Avenue; thence along Third Avenue a distance of four hundred fifty (450) feet to Fifth Street; thence along Fifth Street five hundred (500) feet to a point on Griffith Avenue (a township road) twenty-three hundred and fifty (2350) feet from the aforesaid intersection, in said Conemaugh Township; said proposed road being necessary for public travel.

Your petitioners therefore pray the Court to appoint three persons qualified according to law to view the ground proposed for such road, and, if they see occasion, lay out the same, and make report of their proceedings in the next term of this Court.

REPORT OF VIEWERS

TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGES OF SAID COURT:

We, the undersigned Viewers appointed by the above Court to view for the purpose of laying out a Public Road, beginning in the said Township at a point four hundred (400) feet from the intersection of Griffith Avenue (a Township Road) with the Buckley Hill road (also a Township Road); thence along Fourth Avenue a distance of twenty-two hundred (2200) feet to Sixth Street; thence along Sixth Street a distance of three hundred (300) feet to Third Avenue; thence along Third Avenue a distance of four hundred fifty (450) feet to Fifth Street; thence along Fifth Street five hundred (500) feet to a point on Griffith Avenue (a township road) twenty-three hundred fifty (2350) feet from the aforesaid intersection, in said Township, respectfully report:

That we were duly sworn or affirmed as members of the Permanent Board of Viewers of Cambria County, as is shown by the records of said Court; that we gave due public notice of the time and place of meeting of said Viewers by hand bills posted on the premises and by notices served on the Commissioners of Cambria County and upon Charles C. Greer, Esq., Attorney for the Petitioners, and Ephriam Reighard, Secretary of the Board of Supervisors of Conemaugh Township, all of whom accepted service at least ten (10) days prior to the time of the making of said View, evidence of which is shown by the original notices hereto attached and made a part of this report.

That we met upon the premises, according to the notice given, on Wednesday, May 4, 1927, at one thirty o'clock P. M. for the purpose of performing the duties of our appointment.

That we viewed the site and locality of the road proposed to be laid out, making personal inspection of the grounds between the points designated in petition and order. There were present at the said View, Supervisors of the Township of Conemaugh, Charles C. Greer, Esq., Attorney for Petitioners and a number of citizens interested in said proposed road.

We find that the point from intersection of Griffith Avenue, a Township Road, with the Buckley Hill Road is not an intersection of four hundred (400) feet, but an intersection of five hundred thirty (530) feet from the place of beginning.

We are of the opinion that a Public Road between the points designated in our report is necessary and that we authorize the laying out of a road according to the accompanying draft. We, therefore, lay out and return for public use a Public Road as follows:

BEGINNING at a point five hundred thirty (530) feet from intersection of Griffith Avenue, a Township Road, with the Buckley Hill Road; thence from said point, which point is on Fourth Avenue, and along Fourth Avenue, North thirty-three (33°) degrees thirty-eight (38') minutes East a distance of eighteen hundred twenty-four (1824) feet to a point on East Fifth Street; thence from said point and along East Fifth Street, North fifty-six (56°) degrees twenty-two (22') minutes West a distance of seven hundred eighty-six and seventy-eight hundredths (786.78) feet to a point on Griffith Avenue in the said Township of Conemaugh, it being the terminus mentioned in the Order of Court.

We find that the Order of Court calls for a point four

hundred (400) feet from the intersection of Griffith Avenue with Buckley Hill Road, but actual measurement makes it a distance of five hundred thirty (530) feet as mentioned in our report.

We further report that the benefits derived from the laying out and opening of said road are far in excess to any damages that may accrue to any property owners, and, therefore, we allow no damages to any property affected by the said laying out and opening of the road hereinabove described.

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."
