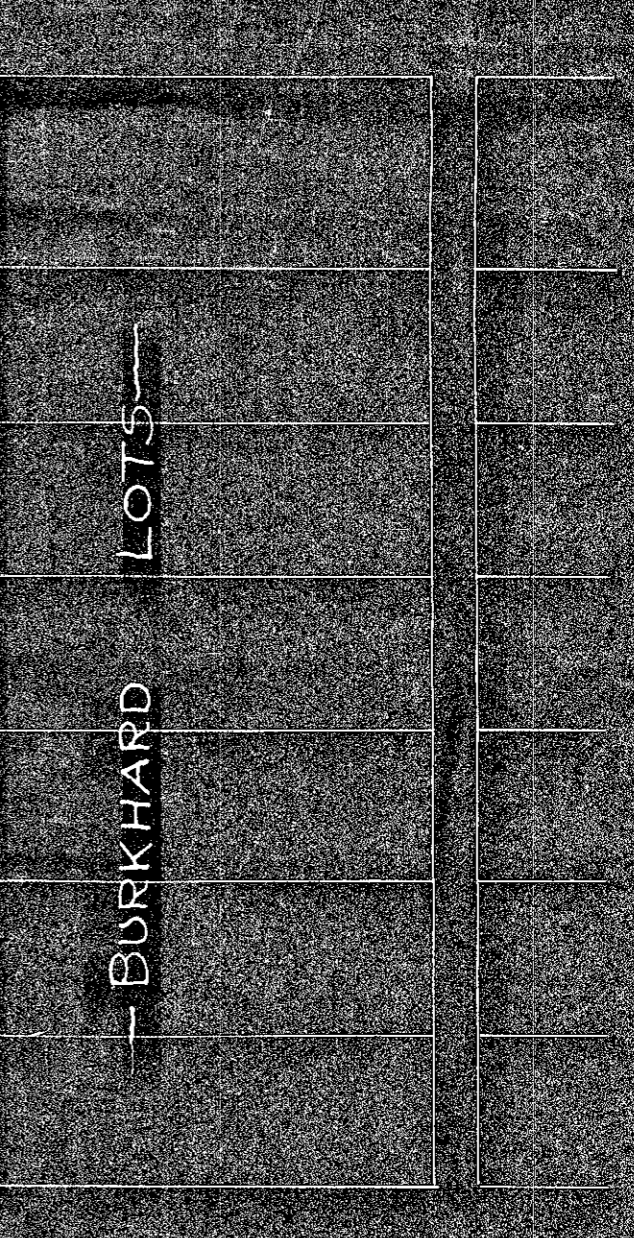

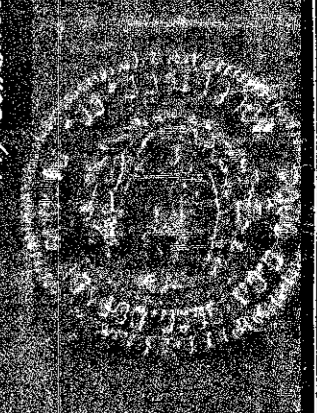

To the Honorable the Judges of the above named Court:

The petition of James Edwards, John Luther and W. B. Brallier re-  
spectfully represents:

(1) That they are the members of the Board of Supervisors of the  
Township of Lower Yoder, Cambria County, Pa.

(2) That on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of November, 1927, the said Board  
of Supervisors unanimously enacted a Resolution accepting a part of Chester  
Street in said Township as a public highway or thoroughfare of said Township,  
a certified and attested copy of said Resolution being hereto attached.

(3) That the part of said Chester Street accepted as aforesaid is  
more than thirty-three (33) feet in width.

(4) That under the Act of Assembly approved the 22nd day of March,  
1927 (P. L. No. 37), it is necessary that the consent of the Court of Quarter

a part of the public highway system of said township.
