

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."

REPORT OF VIEWERS.

To the Honorable, the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions
of Cambria County, Pennsylvania.

We, the undersigned members of the permanent board of viewers of Cambria County, appointed by your honorable Court upon the attached order and therein directed to view and determine as to the propriety of vacating and supplying, in whole or in part, that portion of the public road, in White Township, Cambria County, Pa., lying between the Ebensburg - Phillipsburg Pike and the line dividing the townships of White and Clearfield, on the road which leads from said pike to Condron Station; respectfully report:

That having given due notice of the view and of the time and place of meeting of the viewers to the Commissioners of Cambria County and to the Supervisors of the Township of White; and having them accept service of notices hereto attached; and to the traveling public by printed hand bills posted in public and conspicuous places at and near the termini and along the route of the piece of road to be viewed, and having each been first duly sworn according to law to perform the duties of our appointment faithfully, impartially and to the best of our judgment and ability:

All of us met at the time and place appointed, in accord with the notices served and posted as aforesaid, and having carefully viewed the said piece of road noting the location, grade and alignment and being advised as to the width of same; we are all of the opinion that the piece of road in question, beginning of the Ebensburg - Phillipsburg Pike, near the residence of Gilbert Hollis, and extending thence South $42^{\circ} 30'$ East 958.5 feet, South $40^{\circ} 45'$ East 1.9 feet, South 30° East 123 feet, South 24° East 173.5 feet, South $19^{\circ} 55'$ East 190 feet, South 25° East 210 feet, South $30^{\circ} 40'$ East 300 feet, South 28° East 54 feet, South $2^{\circ} 30'$ East 57 feet and South $7^{\circ} 15'$ West 1009 feet, to the line dividing the townships of White and Clearfield on the road leading to Condron, should be vacated, and instead thereof the following piece of road

should be supplied, viz: Beginning on the Ebensburg - Phillipsburg pike, aforesaid, at the point of beginning mentioned in the attached order of court and as indicated on the plot or draft hereto attached and made a part of this report and running thence South 42° 30' East 958.5 feet, S. 44° E. 351 ft., thence curving S. with a radius of 725 ft. a distance of 279 ft., S. 22° E. 364 ft. thence distance of 277 ft. and S. 7° 15' W. 1024 ft. curving S. with a radius of 540 feet a $\frac{1}{2}$ to the White - Clearfield Township line. The directions of the pieces of road recommended to be vacated and that recommended to be supplied being indicated on said attached draft as follows; that recommended to be vacated taking the direction of the letters "A" "B" "C" "D" "E" "F" and the direction of the piece of road proposed to supply that vacated by the letters "A" "B" "G" "H" "I" "E" and "F".

It appearing to the viewers that no injury will result to any of the adjoining parties through or over whose land the new piece of road is laid out, except Josiah Kessler, we have assessed no damages to the others and having failed to obtain a release of damages from said Josiah Kessler we have assessed him the sum of Six Hundred (\$600.00) . Dollars damages.
