To the Honorable, the Judges of the above named court:

The petition of J. F. Lynch and Conrad Friedhoff and Francis Riley, respectfully represents:

(1) That they are all the members composing the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Cresson, in Cambria County, Pennsylvania.

(2) That on the 31st day of July 1933 the said Board of Supervisors enacted and passed a resolution accepting 3 streets, viz.: Third Street, Short Avenue, and Cottage Street, in said Township as public highways or thoroughfares of said Township; a certified and attested copy of said resolution being hereto attached.

(3) That under the act of assembly approved the 22d of March 1927 (P. L. 55) it is necessary that the consent of the court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County, Pa. be given to the acceptance of said streets as a part of the public highway system of said Township.

the Board of Supervisors of Cresson<sup>TWP</sup> Cambria County, Pa., do hereby  
certify that on the 31st day of July, A. D. 1933, a resolution of  
which the following is a true copy, was passed at a meeting of the  
said Board:

"Resolved, That Third Street between Pennsylvania  
Department of Highway's Traffic Route #22 and Short Avenue  
a distance of 791 feet; Short Avenue between Third Street  
and Pennsylvania Department of Highway's Traffic Route #53  
a distance of 390 feet; together with Cottage Street between  
Pennsylvania Department of Highway's Traffic Route #22 and  
Short Avenue a distance of 700 feet, with a uniform width  
of 33 feet, as the same is shown on the plan of 'The Moun-  
tain House Grounds' laid out and dedicated to public use by  
W. M. Hughes and Company, said dedication being established  
by the sale of lots from said plan; be and the same are  
hereby accepted as public highways or thoroughfares of the  
Township of Cresson, Cambria County, Pa."
