REPORT OF VIEWERS.

TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGES OF SAID COURT:

We, the undersigned Viewers appointed by the above Court to view the above premises and estimate and determine the amount of damages that have resulted or that may seem likely to result by reason of the changing of the grade of West Street, in the Borough of Westmont, Cambria County, Pennsylvania, by the Borough of Westmont, as affecting the property of Angelo Antinoro and Carmela Antinoro, his wife, fronting 50 feet on West Street and extending back between parallel lines 150 feet to North Avenue, having erected thereon a dwelling and garage, respectfully report:-

That we were duly sworn or affirmed as members of the Permanent Board of Viewers of Cambria County, as shown by the records of said Court; that we gave due public notice of the time and place of the meeting of said Viewers by publication in the Johnstown Tribune, and by hand bills posted upon the premises, as well as by acceptance of service of said notice upon Carmela Antinoro, one of the owners of the premises; upon Frank P. Barnhart, Esq., Attorney for Angelo Antinoro and Carmela Antinoro, his wife; upon Donald E. Custer, Esq., Solicitor for the Borough of Westmont; and upon Leonard S. Jones, Esq., Solicitor for the County Commissioners of Cambria County, at least ten days prior to the time of the making of said view, evidence of which is shown by copies of said notices hereto attached and made a part of this report; that we met upon the premises according to the notice given on Tuesday, February 17, 1931, at 2:00 o'clock P. M., for the purpose of performing the duties of our appointment.

All members of the Board of Viewers were in attendance at said view, as well as Angelo Antinoro and Carmela Antinoro, his wife, owners of the premises; Frank P. Barnhart, Esq., Counsel for said owners; O. P. Thomas, Engineer for the Borough of Westmont; and Donald E. Custer, Solicitor for the Borough of Westmont was out of the City, so was unable to be present at said view. We viewed the lot and building in question, and continued the said view until Friday, February 20, 1931, at 10:00 o'clock A. M., at the County Office Rooms, in the First National Bank Building, corner of Main and Franklin Streets, in the City of Johnstown, Cambria County, Pennsylvania, for the purpose of taking testimony and hearing evidence.

Pursuant to said continuance had thereto, the Board of Viewers met at the County Office Rooms, in the First National Bank Building, corner of Main and Franklin Streets, in the City of Johnstown aforesaid, on Friday, February 20, 1931, at 10:00 o'clock A. M., and heard all testimony and evidence offered concerning the property in question. There were present at the said hearing, Dixon Tomb and Mahlon J. Baumgardner; Philip Caulfield the other member of the Board having been confined to his bed because of illness; and Angelo Antinoro, one of the owners of the premises, together with Frank P. Barnhart, Esq., Counsel for said owner; Donald E. Custer, Esq., Solicitor for the Borough of Westmont; and O. P. Thomas, Engineer for the said Borough. The owner of said premises, and the Borough of Westmont had

a number of witnesses, all of whom were heard and questioned concerning the damages aforesaid. It developed at the hearing that there was some dispute as to the time of the filing of the Ordinance, as affecting the grade of West Street, but the Board of Viewers feel that the petitioners were at fault in not making some attempt to ascertain the tentative grade of said West Street, which testimony disclosed was available. The Ordinance was put in evidence, showing that it passed finally on August 11, 1930, and was approved by the Burgess on August 12, 1930, in that notices of said Ordinance were posted, excepting West Street between the East line of North Avenue and East line of East Avenue, and establishing the line, grade and width thereof. The testimony of the petitioners disclosed that on August 9, 1930, a permit was granted for the erection of a garage on the property of said petitioners; that on August 9, 1930, an order was given to the Sheesley Supply Company, for the furnishing of materials for the erection of said garage, and that said Sheesley Construction Company delivered materials on the sixteenth day of August, 1930, and at different times from that date up to September 5, 1930, when the last order was delivered.

That all parties interested were notified of the time and place of meeting of the Board of Viewers, for the purpose of exhibiting a Schedule of Damages, and to consider all exceptions and evidence thereto. Said Notice of Exhibit of Schedule setting forth the place of meeting at the County Office Rooms, in the First National Bank Building aforesaid, on Saturday, February 28, 1931, at 10:00 o'clock A. M., as the time when said Schedule of Damages would be exhibited, which said notice was served upon Frank P. Barnhart, Esq., Counsel for the petitioners, and Donald E. Custer, Esq., Solicitor for the Borough of Westmont, evidence of which acceptance of service is hereto attached and made a part of this report. That we met in accordance with the notice given, in the County Office Rooms, First National Bank Building aforesaid, on Saturday, February 28, 1931, at 10:00 o'clock A. M., at which time a Schedule of Damages was exhibited, and all exceptions thereto and evidence heard.

That after hearing all exceptions and testimony offered, and giving all matters before us consideration, we are of the opinion that the said premises owned by Angelo Antinoro and Carmela Antinoro, his wife, affected by the change of the grade of West Street in the Borough of Westmont, fronting 50 feet on said West Street and extending back between parallel lines 150 feet to North Avenue, have been damaged, as follows:

We are of the opinion that said damages in the sum of three hundred (\$300.00) dollars, are due and should be paid to Angelo Antinoro and Carmela, Antinoro, his wife, as their interest may appear, by the Borough of Westmont, Cambria County, Pennsylvania.

We had an examination of the records made as to liens, judgments and mortgages, and find the same to be as per certificates of examinations hereto attached and made a part of this report.


