{ PETITION TO TRANSFER ROAD

TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGES OF THE SAID COURT:

The Petition of the undersigned, Commissioners of Cambria County, respectfully represents:

I. That a section of one of the Cambria County roads, known as the Beaverdale-Lovett Road, is located in Croyle Township as follows:

BEGINNING at a point near the Village of Lovett on Legislative Route No. 11014 on the eastern side of the Pennsylvania Railroad leading to Beaverdale; thence by the way of a reinforced concrete highway in a southeasterly direction to a point on the line between the Township of Croyle and the Township of Summerhill, a distance of approximately 2.2 miles, more or less; thence still by the way of said concrete and brick highway in a southeasterly direction through the Township of Summerhill to a point on Legislative Route No. 11009, a distance of 2.2 miles, more or less.

2. That the section of said road is part of a main highway, known as the Beaverdale-Lovett Road, and is an improved brick and concrete road.

3. That it is the desire of the County that an effort be made to have the State of Pennsylvania take over this section of highway, but the petitioners are informed that the State will take over only sections of roads which are township roads.

4. That there are other parts of this County road running through Summerhill Township and a petition will be filed for the purpose of transferring said section of said road from the County to said Township.

WHEREFORE, Your Petitioners pray that the portion or section of said Beaverdale-Lovett road which lies within Croyle Township may be taken over by and transferred to the Township of Croyle for the purpose of having the State of Pennsylvania take over the entire Beaverdale-Lovett road situate in Cambria County, running through Croyle and Summerhill Townships, and they will ever pray


