ACCEPTANCE OF PARTS OF CERTAIN STREETS IN THE
VILLAGES OF BEAVERDALE AND LLOYDELL, IN THE
TOWNSHIP OF SUMMERHILL, CAMBRIA COUNTY, PA.

WHEREAS, certain streets in the Villages of Beaverdale and Lloydell, in the Township of Summerhill, in the County of Cambria and State of Pennsylvania, hereinafter more particularly described, have been dedicated by the owners of the lands through whose lands said streets were laid out for upwards of thirty years and have been used by the public and accepted by said public during all that time,

AND WHEREAS, said streets have been built up along their entire course, and are to all intents and purposes public thoroughfares of the Township of Summerhill, except that said streets have never been formally accepted by the Township Supervisors of said Township.

AND WHEREAS, the travel on said streets has reached such proportions as to force recognition on the part of the Supervisors of the Township of Summerhill that said streets are public highways, and they have been asked to recognize them as such.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that we, the corporate authorities of the Township of Summerhill, County of Cambria and State of Pennsylvania, accept as public roads of the Township of Summerhill those parts of certain streets in the Villages of Beaverdale and Lloydell above referred to described as follows, to wit:

FIRST.

PART OF STEWART STREET, IN THE VILLAGES OF
BEAVERDALE AND LLOYDELL.

All that part of street known as Stewart Street on the plan of the Village of Beaverdale hereinafter referred to, but which is plotted without name on the plan of the Village of Lloydell, hereinafter referred to, which constitutes the connection between said two plans, beginning at a point on a public thoroughfare heretofore duly accepted by said Township of Summerhill, which is known on said plan of the Village of Beaverdale as Jefferson Avenue, and on

said plan of the Village of Lloydell as First Street, where the same is shown on said plans, respectively, and extending thence along said street hereby accepted south thirty-eight degrees thirty minutes west a distance of three hundred feet, more or less, to a point in the line of a public highway known on said Beaverdale plan as Cameron Avenue, and on said Lloydell plan as Second Street. Properties of the Logan Valley Store Company and of the United Brethren Church are located along the easterly side of the portion of street hereby accepted, and property of the First National Bank of Beaverdale and property of John Kauffman Estate are located along the westerly side of the portion of street hereby accepted.

A portion of said part of street hereby accepted was dedicated by the Beaver Run Land Company's plan of lots of the Village of Beaverdale, dated March 24, 1920, and recorded in the Recorder's Office of Cambria County in Plat Book Vol. 1 page 217, and said street is thereon shown and designated as Stewart Street.

A portion of said part of street hereby accepted was dedicated by the Mountain Coal Company and appears on its plan of the Village of Lloydell, dated August 21, 1915, and recorded in said recording office in Plat Book Vol. 1 at page 167, whereon it is not given a name.

SECOND.

PART OF SPRUCE STREET IN THE VILLAGE OF LLOYDELL.

All that part of street known as Spruce Street on the plan of the Village of Lloydell hereinabove referred to, beginning at a point on a public thoroughfare heretofore duly accepted by said Township of Summerhill, which is known on said plan of Lloydell as First Street, and extending thence along said street hereby accepted south fifty-nine degrees west a distance of two hundred seventy-five feet, more or less, to a point in the line of a public highway known on said Lloydell plan as Second Street. The residence of Charles Shawkey and the residence of Charles Burns are located on the easterly side of the portion

of street hereby accepted, and the residence of George Fleck and the residence of John Ronan are located on the westerly side thereof.

The portion of said Spruce Street which is hereby accepted was dedicated by the Mountain Coal Company and appears upon said Mountain Coal Company's Plan of the Village of Lloydell which is hereinabove particularly referred to.

THIRD.

PART OF CHESTNUT STREET IN THE VILLAGE OF
LLOYDELL.

All that part of street known as Chestnut Street on the plan of the Village of Lloydell, hereinabove referred to, beginning at a point on a public thoroughfare, heretofore duly accepted by the Township of Summerhill, which is known on said plan of Lloydell as First Street, and extending thence along said street hereby accepted south fifty-nine degrees west a distance of two hundred seventy-five feet, more or less, to a point on the line of a public highway known on said Lloydell Plan as Second Street. The residences of Frank Turgeon and Henry Law are located on the easterly side of the portion of street hereby accepted, the residence of Pearl McClellan and the property of St. Agnes Catholic Church are located on the westerly side thereof.

The portion of said Chestnut Street which is hereby accepted was dedicated by the Mountain Coal Company and appears upon said Mountain Coal Company's plan of the Village of Lloydell, which is hereinabove particularly referred to.

Particular reference is hereby made to the above recited plans of the Villages of Beaverville and Lloydell, respectively, for the purpose of showing the points on the public highway where the streets, portions of which are hereby accepted, intersect with said public highway.

AND, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the width of the streets hereby

accepted be, so far as the corporate authorities have power to fix the width,
fixed at thirty-three feet.

On motion of Leo Martin, seconded by Roper Barr, unanimously adopted
