The petition of William N. Myers, F. H. Berkey and Foster M. Penrod, respectfully represents:

First: That they are the members of the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Richland, County of Cambria and State of Pennsylvania, and are now acting as such.

Second: That on the 31st day of May, 1938, the said Board of Supervisors enacted and passed a resolution accepting Weaver Avenue, beginning at a point on Bedford Street and known as the Johnstown - Scalp Level Turnpike; thence from said point and along Weaver Avenue South seventy (70°) degrees forty-one (41') minutes West a distance of three hundred ten (310) feet to Frances Street, which is a forty foot wide street; thence along Frances Street, North nineteen (19°) degrees nineteen (19') minutes West a distance of six hundred thirty and eighty-one hundredths (630.81) feet to a point on a public highway known as Lehman Avenue, which said highway intersects with Bedford Street." The plan of Lewis Weaver being duly recorded in the office for the Recording of Deeds in and for Cambria County, Pennsylvania in Plat Book Vol. Page , as a public highway or thoroughfare in said Township, said dedication being established from the sale of lots from said plan of Lewis Weaver, aforesaid.

Third: That under the Act of Assembly, approved the 22nd day of March, 1927, P. L. 55, it is necessary that the consent of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County, Pennsylvania, be given to the acceptance of said highway or public thoroughfare as a part of the public highway system in said Township.

WHEREFORE, your petitioners pray that an order and decree be made by your Honorable Court, approving and assenting to the acceptance of said road as a public highway in the said Township of Richland, Cambria County, Pennsylvania.

Regular Meeting of the Board of Supervisors of Richland Township, Cambria County Penna. held May 31, 1938. Present Wm, N. Myers, Foster M. Pensod and Frank Berkey, Supervisors.

RESOLVED: That a road known as Weaver Avenue and Frances Street on a Plan of Lots as laid out by Lewis Weaver, situate in Richland Township, Cambria County, Pennsylvania, by Fetterman Engineering Company on May 26, 1926, which Plan is of record, said Weaver Avenue BEGINNING at a point on Bedford Street and known as the Johnstown - Scalp Level Turnpike; thence from said point and along Weaver Avenue South Seventy (70°) degrees forty-one (41') minutes West a distance of three hundred ten (310) feet to Frances Street, which is a forty (40) foot wide street; thence along Frances Street, North nineteen (19°) degrees nineteen (19') minutes West a distance of six hundred thirty and eighty-one hundredths (630.81) feet to a point on a public highway known as Lehman Avenue, which said highway intersects with Bedford Street. Said Weaver Ave. and Frances Street be laid out and dedicated to the public by the Supervisors of Richland Township, Cambria County, Pennsylvania, said dedication being established on the sale of lots from said Plan aforesaid and the same is hereby accepted as a public highway or thoroughfare of the Township of Richland, County of Cambria and State of Pennsylvania.
