TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGES OF THE ABOVE NAMED COURT:

The petition of the Board of Supervisors of the Township of
Lower Yoder respectfully represents:

(1) That the Board of Supervisors did on the *10th* day of
July, 1954, at 7:00 P. M., at a special meeting, accept the following street
and avenue in the Township of Lower Yoder, which street and avenue are
as follows:

- (1) PALMER AVENUE (Formerly Paul Street) - Which
is now only 298 feet in length, extending from the
Tremont Road to a dead end, and which is a forty
foot wide street.
- (2) BURLY STREET - From the said Palmer Avenue
to Sauers Avenue, a distance of 280 feet, which is
likewise a forty foot wide street.

as appears by a copy of the Resolution hereto attached, made part hereof
and marked "Exhibit A".

WHEREFORE, your petitioner prays your Honorable Court
to give its consent to the acceptance of Palmer Avenue and Burly Street,

described in the Resolution hereto attached, as a public highway or street



**RESOLUTION TO ACCEPT PARTS OF PALMER AVENUE
AND BURLY STREET IN THE TOWNSHIP OF
LOWER YODER**

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Lower Yoder did on or about November 25, 1952, accept a certain number of streets by resolution and approval of the Order of Court on the aforesaid date; and

WHEREAS, among the said streets which were accepted was listed under No. 34 Paul Street beginning at the intersection of Tremont Road, a distance of 1042 feet to a dead end; and

WHEREAS, the said Paul Street, which is now called Palmer Avenue, is not 1042 feet in length; and

WHEREAS, the Supervisors of Lower Yoder Township now desire to correct the said error and include the acceptance of Burly Street; and

WHEREAS, the said streets are laid out in the plan of lots of Catherine Sauer by plan dated February 26, 1925, and approved by the City Planning Commission on February 27, 1925, which plan is recorded in Plat Book Vol. , Page

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Township of Lower Yoder accepts the following streets:

- (1) PALMER AVENUE (Formerly Paul Street) - Which is now only 298 feet in length, extending from the Tremont Road to a dead end, and which is a forty foot wide street.**
- (2) BURLY STREET - From the said Palmer Avenue to Sauers Avenue, a distance of 280 feet, which is likewise a forty foot wide street.**

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Township Solicitor be authorized to make written report thereof, together with a draft or survey of the said Palmer Avenue and Hurly Street, to be presented and filed in the Office of the Clerk of Courts of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County, Pennsylvania.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that in accordance with the provisions of the Act of Assembly in such case made and provided any citizen or freeholder of the Township may, within thirty days after the filing of the report of the Supervisors, file exceptions to the report, together with a petition for a review.
