COMMISSIONERS' REPORT

TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGES OF ABOVE NAMED COURT:

The report of EDWIN GATES, PATRICK MARRA AND MARTIN C. KIRSCH,  
Commissioners appointed by the Court is as follows:

1. By Decree dated the 20<sup>th</sup> day of June, 1966, your Honorable Court appointed Edwin Gates, a resident of White Township, Patrick Marra, a resident of Clearfield Township and Martin C. Kirsch, a Registered Engineer, to inquire into the prayer of the Petition of causing the East-West boundary lines of the Townships of White and Clearfield to be ascertained and established.
2. Pursuant to said Decree, your Commissioners held a public meeting, after giving public notice as directed by Decree of Court, at 7:30 P.M., E.D.S.T., on Monday, August 29, 1966, in the Beaver Valley School House in White Township, Cambria County, Pennsylvania.
3. That on the appointed day for said public meeting, your Commissioners met, prepared to explain the nature of the meeting and to receive any suggestions or complaints of the residents of said Clearfield and White Townships, with regard to fixing the East-West boundary lines between said Townships as hereinafter set forth.
4. That having been duly sworn, your Commissioners went over the proposed line and the line as it presently exists, measured them and took their courses, heard the statements of the persons affected by any change and made a careful and diligent inquiry as to the propriety of making the change prayed for.
5. After careful consideration as aforesaid, your Commissioners find the convenience of the inhabitants of said Clearfield and White Townships will be promoted by the alteration of said East-West boundary line as prayed for, and, therefore, report to the Court that, in the opinion of your Commissioners, the line should be altered and we recommend the alteration as prayed for as follows:

Description of the East-West Boundary Line Between Clearfield Township and White Township.

BEGINNING at monument No. 11 (also marked No. 1 to describe the North-South line between Chest and White Townships) being the corner of Chest and White Townships on the Clearfield Township line. The location for said monument No. 11 is as follows:

BEGINNING at a set stone, being the Northeast corner of Patton Borough and a corner of Elder Township; thence South fifty-three degrees twenty-one minutes East (S 53° 21' E) sixteen hundred fifty-five and eighty-two one hundredths (1655.82') feet to a point in the center line of the old channel of Chest Creek, which point is the corner of Chest and Clearfield Townships on the Elder Township line; thence by the division line between Chest and Clearfield Townships South eighty-three degrees forty-five minutes East (S 83° 45' E) sixteen thousand seventy-three and fifty-one one-hundredths (16,073.51') feet; thence South eighty-three degrees and forty-five minutes East (S 83° 45' E) the following sixteen (16) distances: Fourteen hundred forty-nine and twenty-eight one-hundredths (1449.28') feet to Monument No. 12 located on the Eastern edge of a brush ravine in land of R. Holtz; thence twenty hundred eighty-two and sixty-four one-hundredths (2082.64') feet partly by R. Holtz land and partly by Cretin land to Monument No. 13 in Cretin land; thence thirteen hundred forty-seven and one one-hundredth (1347.01') feet partly through Cretin land and through State Game Lands, crossing Burgoon Run to Monument No. 14 on or near the line between the State Game lands and Hammond land; thence eleven hundred twenty-one and ninety-seven one hundredths (1121.97') feet through Hammond land to Monument No. 15 located on the Western bank of Legislative Route 11053; thence eleven hundred and forty-two one-hundredths (1100.42') feet crossing said Legislative Route and partly by State Game lands and partly by McGough lands to Monument No. 16 in McGough lands; thence ten hundred ninety and seventy-eight one-hundredths (1090.78') feet to Monument No. 17 in McGough lands; thence fifteen hundred nineteen and thirty-two one-hundredths (1519.32') feet to monument No. 18 in McGough lands; thence seventeen hundred sixty-six and thirty-one one-hundredths (1766.31') feet passing North of McGough's barn and immediately North of a cottage, passing through a small dam and crossing Slate Lick Run and Highway Route No. 136 to Monument No. 19 located on the East bank of said highway; thence fifteen hundred forty-four and fifteen one-hundredths (1544.15') feet through Joseph McGough's lot development to Monument No. 20; thence ten hundred sixty-six and eleven one-hundredths (1066.11') feet crossing a proposed street, an unnamed run, and a farm lane leading to Mike Matish dwelling to Monument No. 21, located on the East bank of said farm lane in McGough lands; thence twenty-three hundred twenty-three and forty-one one-hundredths (2323.41') feet partly by McGough's land and partly by Storm's land to Monument No. 22 on woods line in Storm's land; thence twenty-hundred forty-one and twenty one-hundredths (2041.20') feet passing through Storm's land and crossing Township Route No. 512 to Monument No. 23 located on the eastern bank of said road; thence eleven hundred fifty-nine and ninety-six one-hundredths (1159.96') feet crossing the State Game Lands line to Monument No. 24 in said State Game lands; thence eleven hundred sixty and seventeen one-hundredths (1160.17') feet corssing a strip mine road and continuing through the State Game Lands to Monument No. 25 located on the Western edge of a strip mine; thence fifteen hundred twenty-three and fifty-eight one-hundredths (1523.58') feet passing over the said strip mine and continuing through State Game lands to Monument No. 26 located on the West bank of Clearfield Creek; thence forty-five (45') feet to a point in the center line of Clearfield Creek, said point being the common corner of White-Clearfield-Reade and Dean Townships.

The total length of the line is 22,341.31 feet..

6. That a diligent search was made of the records of Cambria County to determine the existence of any description of existing lines and since no records could be located, it is believed that said records have been either lost or destroyed.

7. That should your Honorable Court adopt the alteration of said East-West boundary line as proposed by your Commissioners, there will be no change in the present assessment of properties as a result of said alteration.

8. That said proposed East-West line is a straight line, having no change in course.

9. That the said proposed line has been marked by Monuments, as indicated on the attached map.

WHEREFORE, your Commissioners respectfully request your Honorable Court to confirm nisi the above report and, in the event that no exceptions are taken within thirty (30) days after the filing of the same, to confirm said report absolutely, and that a Decree be entered fixing said East-West boundary lines between Clearfield and White Townships, as recommended.



PETITION

TO THE HONORABLE JUDGES OF ABOVE NAMED COURT:

Your Petitioners respectfully represent:

1. That your Petitioners are Joseph Sheehan, Joseph Marra, Herman Link, all residents and members of the Board of Supervisors of Clearfield Township; Herman J. Leiden, L. J. Warner, Bernard J. Neibauer, residents and members of the Board of Supervisors of Chest Township; and John Gates, John Noel and Lawrence Noel, residents and members of the Board of Supervisors of White Township.

2. That the East-West division line between the Townships of Chest and Clearfield and between the Townships of White and Clearfield are uncertain, the original records pertaining to the formation of said Townships having been lost or destroyed.

3. By reason of the uncertainty of the location of said division lines, said uncertainty is likely to cause disputes and generally inconvenience the inhabitants of said Townships.

4. That the appointment of a commission of three impartial citizens to determine and fix the said East-West division line between the Townships of Chest and Clearfield and the Townships of Clearfield and White, would suit the convenience of the inhabitants of Clearfield, Chest and White Townships.

WHEREFORE, your Petitioners respectfully request your Honorable Court to appoint a commission of three impartial citizens, one of whom to be a Registered Engineer, to inquire into the propriety of ascertaining and establishing the East-West division line between Chest and Clearfield Townships and between Clearfield and White Townships and, upon the filing of the report of the commissioners, to cause the lines or boundaries between Chest Township and Clearfield Township and between Clearfield Township and White Township to be

ascertained and established under the provisions of the Act of May 1, 1933,  
P. L. 103, Art. III, Sections 302, et seq., as amended.

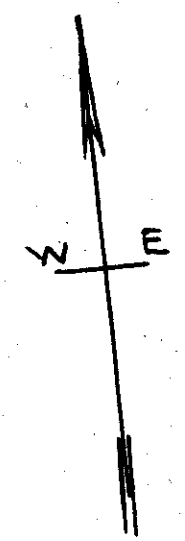
  
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TYPICAL MONUMENT INSTALLATION

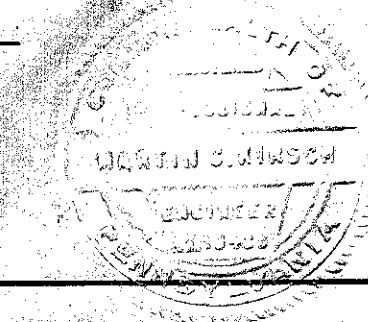

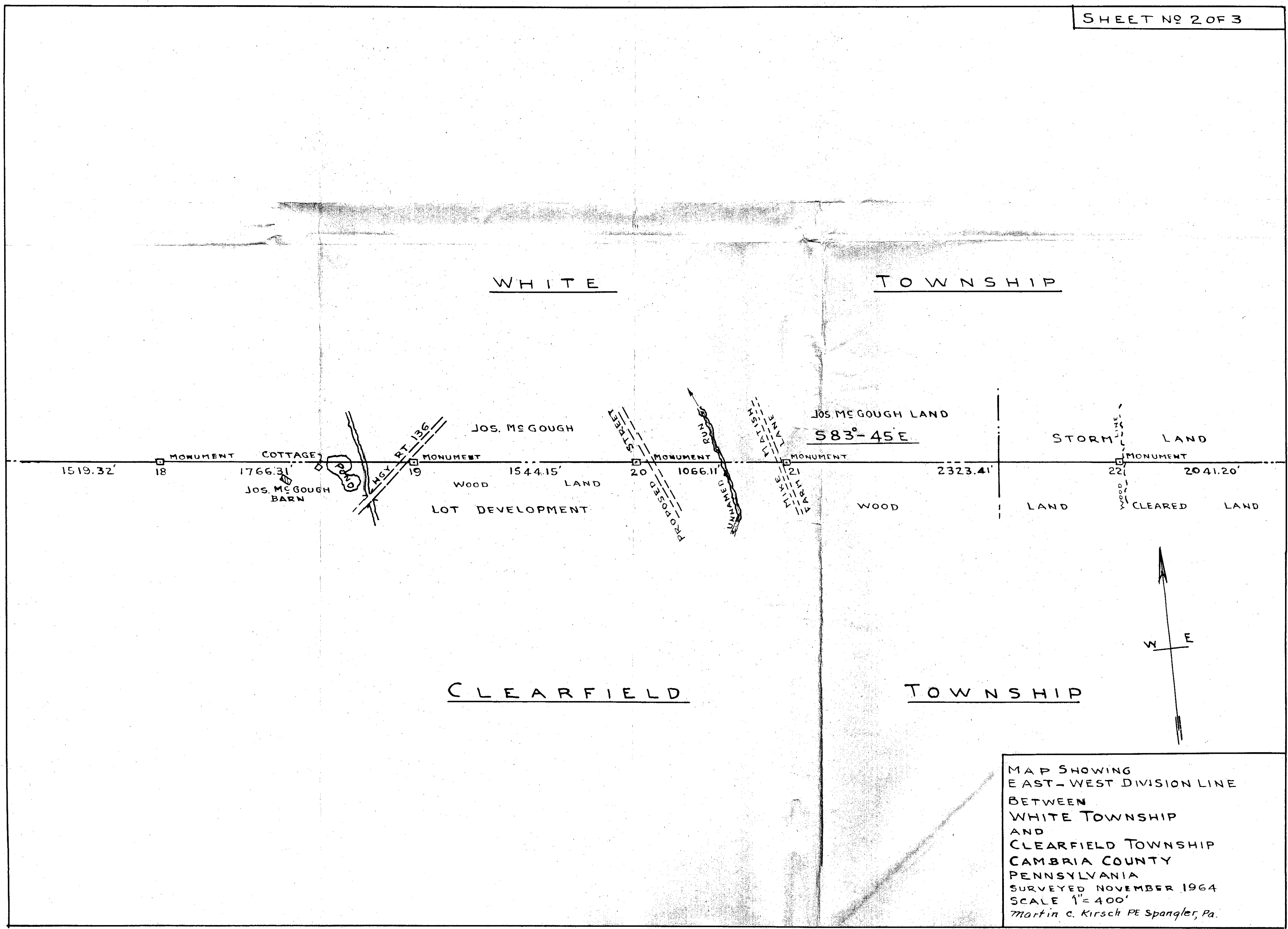
MAP SHOWING

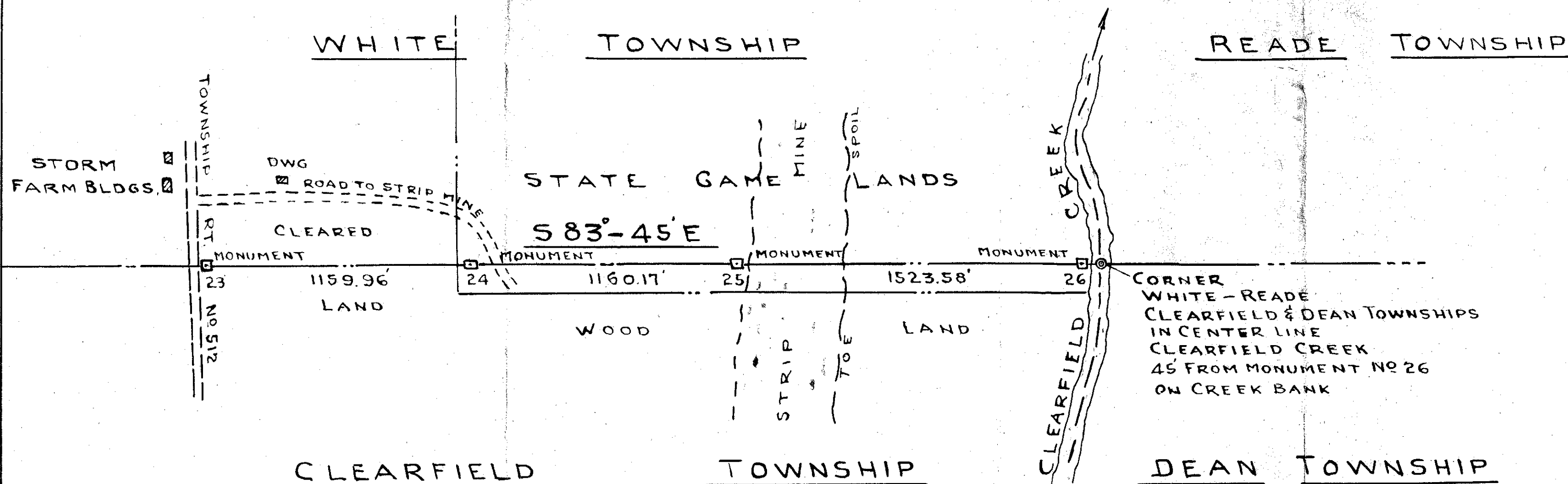

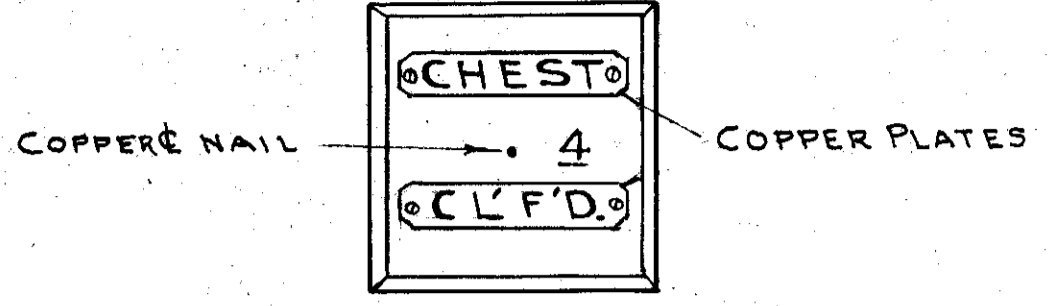
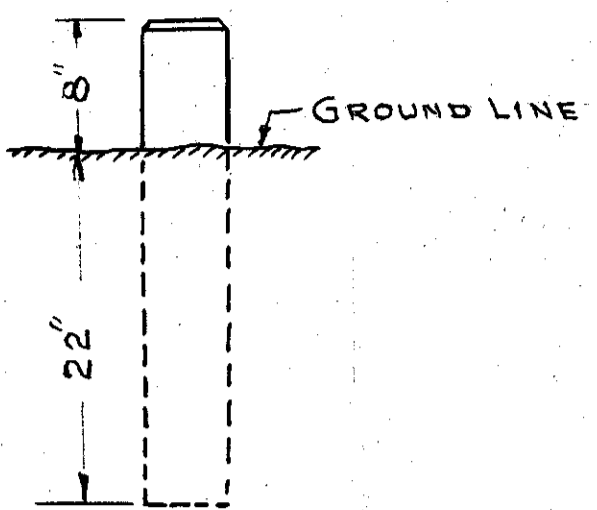

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TOP OF MONUMENT PLAN

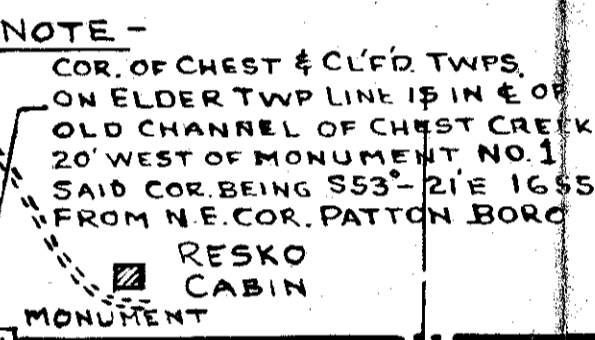
